Club Notes

WE WELCOME you all here to-day for the last match of the 1961/62 Season regretting that in the end it has turned out to be rather a disappointing one after the great hopes we had entertained right up to December that the fight was going well and we would be still at the top of the Table when we reached this part of the programme. Alas that month of December proved a most disastrous one for us for after beating Rotherham United here on the first Saturday we did not pick up another League point until the middle of January and then to be eventually knocked out by Ipswich Town in the Third Round of the F.A. Cup, although in our two encounters with them at Portman Road and the Re-play here we more than held our own and in fact should have won on either occasion. We feel that if we had beaten Ipswich at that time our lads would have regained their confidence which after all had got us into third place in the League following our match against Rotherham. Although we beat Swansea Town by no less than 5 goals to one on the Saturday following our Cup defeat it was obvious in our Friendly Match with Falkirk the next Saturday that our edge had gone which has never really been recaptured although in our matches here with Newcastle United and Liverpool, both of which we won by an only goal, hopes were born again of a revival. Further defeats however both at home and away showed that we had not really regained our early season form. And so we come to our final match of this disappointing season unfortunately against a team

which must win if it hopes to survive as members of the Second Division for next season. We would it was not so but of course must accept the position as it stands and play to win. Brighton are already doomed to Third Division football next season, their fellow travellers being Bristol Rovers, Swansea or Leeds United. Leeds are away to Newcastle United to-day, while Swansea's two remaining matches are at home in each case to Sunderland and Liverpool. Swansea won at home against Plymouth last Tuesday by five clear goals which must give their fans every hope of them avoiding the drop. There will be much scanning of the final results to see who is 'staying put' and who is 'going down' following to-day's matches. All the decisions will not be reached to-day however for there are several matches to be played next week affecting the issues but nevertheless a fairly accurate picture of the final positions will be possible at the end of to-day's ninety minutes football. The position regarding promotion and relegation is that in the Third Division the two top teams gain promotion to the Second while the four bottom Clubs replace the four top Clubs of Division Four. Elsewhere the position is two 'Up' and two 'Down.' The four bottom Clubs in Division Four retire but are eligible for re-election at the League's Annual General Meeting in June.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Howard Radford (goalkeeper). Welshman hailing from Abercynon. Joined Rovers in 1951 and his very first game for the Club was a first team appearance against Continental opposition. Was on the verge of gaining a Welsh Cap several seasons back. Captains the Rovers' pre-season cricket eleven and is a proficient wicket-keeper-batsman. Height 5 ft. 9½ ins. Weight 11 st. 1 lb.

Doug. Hillard (right back). Bristolian. This sturdy defender made the Rovers' right back position his own in recent seasons. Signed professional forms for Rovers in July, 1957. Previous experience was as an inside forward with a local Hospital's Staff team. Height 5 ft. 9½ ins. Weight 12 st. 12 lbs.

John Frowen (left back). Welshman. Joined Rovers in an exchange deal with Cardiff City where John had a good deal of First Division experience. Has played centre half in Rovers' League and F.A. Cup sides but more recently has established himself as the left back successor to former Rovers' skipper, John Watling. Height 5 ft. 10½ ins. Weight 11 st. 11 lbs.

David Bumpstead (right half). Transferred from Millwall December 1961, where he was at one time their Captain. Very forceful player. Played as an Amateur for Tooting before signing for Millwall.

Joe Davis (centre half). Bristolian. Product of Soundwell Football Club, a leading Bristol Club. Became Rovers regular pivot last season but has also played very well in either the wing half or left back positions. Height 5 ft. 10 ins. Weight 11 st. 2 lbs.

Ray Mabbutt (left half). Native of Aylesbury in Buckinghamshire. During his National Service played for well-known Northern Amateur Club, Yorkshire Amateurs. Ray signed professional

forms for Rovers in 1956. Height 5 ft. 7 ins. Weight 10 st.

Harold Jarman (outside right). Bristolian. Joined Rovers in 1959 from Victoria Athletic, old established Club in the Bristol and District League. Gloucestershire Cricket Club professional, he is a batsman of some promise. Established himself as the regular right winger last season. Height 5 ft. 8 ins. Weight 10 st. 9 lbs.

Norman Sykes (inside right). Bristolian. This former Bristol Schools' and England Schools' International joined Rovers straight from School and played in the Rovers' Reserve Team at age of fifteen. Can play equally well at half back or inside forward and also at centre forward. English Youth International. Height 6 ft. Weight 12 st. 11 lbs.

Geoff. Bradford (centre forward). Bristolian. Signed professional forms as long ago as June, 1949. Has scored more League and F.A. Cup goals than any other Bristol professional player. Capped for England (v. Denmark in Copenhagen) and played in the West Indies with the Football Association tourists. First-ever holder of the "Harry Bamford Memorial Trophy." Height 6 ft. Weight 12 st. 4 lbs.

Bobby Jones (inside right). Bristolian. Like his cousin, fellow Rovers' professional, Joe Davis, is a product of renowned local club, Soundwell. Plays in both inside forward positions. Signed full time professional forms in July, 1956. Height 5 ft. 9 ins. Weight 11 st. 9 lbs.

Peter Hooper (outside left). Joined Rovers straight from R.A.F. in the summer of 1953. Takes Rovers' penalty kicks—mostly with great success. Played for the Football League Representative eleven. All-round sportsman. A native of Teignmouth. Height 5 ft. 10 ins. Weight 11 st. 9 lbs.


