

GIGG LANE GLEANINGS

THE soccer world is in a state of "chassis" to quote the eloquent Irishman. Or at least it would seem to be so, judging from the widespread desire to "modernise", "rationalise", call it what you will, the League structure. Many people, including leading club officials, are all het up, worried about the future. Grandiose schemes, which we suggest bear not the slightest reality to the problems facing soccer, are propounded. The bug of the "super-League" is still nurtured, and some directors of the wealthier clubs seem to see in its creation the salvation of the game.

There apparently is, or so they think, the need for a Common Market in soccer. An aristocracy is to be created, the smaller clubs are going to be accorded their "proper place", and then in some wonderful way not yet explained, this country is going to win the World Cup.

Perhaps on this, the opening day of the 1962-63 season, we may usefully spend a few moments reflecting on what cannot unkindly be described as the half-baked schemes of the moguls. If it so happened, and everything is possible in sport, after the proposed changes in the structure of League football, we did manage to annex the World Cup what effect would it or could it have on the overwhelmingly large majority of clubs?

The great strength, nay, the very justification of League football, is that it is a national competition in which the Burys and the Scunthorpe Uniteds, the Ipswich Towns and the Leyton Orientals, are just as important as the Evertons, the Spurs, and the Manchester Uniteds. They do not attract mammoth gates, but they serve no less effectively the needs of the people in their areas. It could be agreed that the Football League has been a little slow to adjust itself to changing conditions, to the new concentrations of large groupings of people, but this is not necessarily a reason for suggesting the League is out of touch with events.

The creation of any League club is a tremendous venture and it cannot be "liquidated" by a change in League structure without very careful thought being given to the question.

But what is of concern to such clubs as ours is the implication in the demand for a "rationalisation" of the League that the clubs which cannot acquire 40,000 gates must always be considered the "poor relations." It bespeaks an attitude of mind which is alien to the traditions and the purposes of the Football League. Little—by comparison—Ipswich Town last season blew sky high the presumptuousness of those who imagine that soccer success can be concentrated in just a few corners of the country.

The problem as we see it is for those in control of clubs so to set their houses in order that they can find and develop more and more players capable of rising to national standards. There will always be a drift of the more competent youngsters to the wealthier clubs, but hasn't experience proved that the spending of large sums of money does not inevitably produce the successful side?

We at Gigg Lane will for some time be faced with the problem of making ends meet financially, but who would be foolish enough to declare that in ten years time, following the immense and continuing drift of population to this area, broadening the reservoir of potential support, we would not be in a position to gain and deserve an average attendance which would put the old club in the forefront? A pipe-dream? Maybe, but our neighbours, Burnley, have shown what can be done.

This is the target we aim to achieve. Much has to be done, and many hurdles have to be cleared, but if we were not minded to think the sky's the limit we would not be worthy of the responsibility we have undertaken. We therefore intend to win and keep an ever-increasing measure of public interest and support, and look ahead confidently to your enthusiastic co-operation.

Goal. RON BAYNHAM—Has been with Luton Town since 1951. Secured from Southern League Club, Worcester City. He has represented England on several occasions. Played for the Football League on two occasions and also for England "B" Team versus Yugoslavia "B". Was a member of the F.A. Touring Party to South America in 1959.

Right-back: B. McNALLY—Can occupy either full back position. Came from the League of Ireland Club, Shelbourne and has been with Luton since May, 1956. Played for Eire "B" versus Rumania in Dublin in 1957 and also for Eire versus Czechoslovakia.

Left-back: JOHN BRAMWELL—One of the two players who joined Luton from Everton when Billy Bingham, the Irish International was transferred to that club in October, 1960. Is a very capable player.

"The Hatters" from LUTON

Outside-right: H. WALDEN—Joined Luton from Kettering in January last year and stepped straight into the first team at Norwich, making 34 League and Cup appearances last season. Has a very forceful shot.

Inside-right: G. TURNER—Went to Luton as a wing-half upon his demob. from the Navy but found his true position in the forward line. Represented the English League versus the Scottish League in 1955 and also played for the F.A. XI versus the Army in 1958. The 'Town's' leading goalscorer for eight seasons out of the last nine. Is a skilled player with a tremendous shot.

Right-half: R. MORTON—Local born and has been with the club since 1948. Played for England "B" versus Switzerland "B" team, the Football Combination versus the Dutch XI (on two occasions) and also for the Football Association versus the Army. Was chosen as Reserve for England at Wembley in 1955 and again when they played Ireland in 1958. Usually a wing-half but has made numerous appearances at centre-forward.

Centre-half: TERRY KELLY—Born in Luton. Played for Hitchin Town before joining the 'Town' in 1950. Originally played wing-half, but was successfully converted into a centre-half. A very strong player who holds his own with most centre-forwards.

Left-half: D. PACEY—Born in Luton, signed for the club in 1956. Has played for the F.A. versus the R.A.F. and was also a member of the England Under-23 team against Germany and Italy. Very strong player with a liking for getting among the goalscorers.

Centre-forward: J. LORNIIE—An Aberdonian, he moved to Luton from Leicester City whom he joined in 1958 as an inside-forward. Was converted to centre-forward in which position he played several times in the City first team.

Inside-left: A. McGUFFIE—Signed professional forms for Luton in September, 1954. Has made numerous appearances in the first team since his demob from the Army. Is an excellent distributor of the ball with a flare for coming through to have a shot at goal.

Outside-left: JAMES FLEMING—Moved to Luton from Partick Thistle when 'Town' transferred Joe McBride, in November, 1960. Is a very capable player with a tremendous shot and good turn of speed.
