### Club Notes

A VERY warm welcome is extended to you all here this afternoon in this our first home match of the 1962/63 Season. Having to start the season with two away matches is not an ideal way of doing so but that was our commitment and so we had to go through with it. We felt however it could be a blessing in disguise in that if we came through without defeat such a beginning would give our lads much encouragement and prepare the way for a very good crowd when we were due to play at home. Such hopes of avoiding defeat have not quite materialised but we came mighty close to doing so, and in fact if it had not been for what we thought was a very harsh penalty kick decision given against us at Bury last Saturday within ten minutes of the end of the match those hopes would have been achieved. Our lads are most emphatic that the ball was not handled, and we feel grave injustice was done, especially as the only goal of the match and hence our defeat was as a result of that decision.

After our defeat at Bury our new Manager Mr. Bill Harvey, whom we welcome to Kenilworth Road, wondered if all the coaching he had put in since his arrival had had any effect. He need not have worried. At Southampton last Wednesday evening Mr. Harvey was very pleased with the lads for they played very well indeed and although one down at half time the Manager felt everything was going fine and in fact told the lads to continue playing their football and the goals would come. And this is just what did happen for by half-way stage of the second half we had gained a lead of two goals to one, but while Dave Pacey was off the field having a couple of stitches inserted in a shin the 'Saints' equalised. The spirit and enthusiasm of

the lads in this match pleased the Manager immensely, and although he is a man very loth to make promises he feels that with such spirit we could have quite a successful season. We only wish the national newspapers, if they are going to report on our matches, would give a factual account of them and not pounce as some do on some secondary incident hardly worthy of mention to give them their story and headlines. A Director from a visiting Club said to Mr. Harvey after the match at Southampton last Wednesday that it was a match full of good football and one of the best he had seen for a long time. No doubt the Sports Writers would have a reply to such a remark but what we want to get over to you the fans is that the match at Southampton was well worth watching and as such should have received a better Press report generally than was the case.

Our Reserves began the season here last Saturday by losing two goals to nil to a much-more experienced Nottingham Forest side. Our lads did very well however and held their own very well indeed until that first goal which knocked the wind out of their sails, for it was just the break they were hoping for having to fight against such odds and instead of our lads getting it, it went the other way. Considering however that we had such players not able to play as Standen, Daniels, Groves, McKechnie and Goldie, five players who would have made a vast difference to the side, we thought our youngsters did very well indeed. The football they played was entertaining with a purpose about it all, and if such effort is going to be maintained, which it will be, attendances at these Reserve matches will be on the up-grade.

## PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

**Roy Ironside** (goalkeeper), 6 ft. 2 ins. Roy joined Rotherham as an amateur in 1952. Signed as a professional in 1954. In 1959 he gained a regular berth in the first team. Since then his brilliance has established the position as his own.

**Brian Jackson** (right back or centre half) 5 ft. 11 ins. Brian was first spotted playing local junior football, and was signed on amateur forms in July 1954. Two months later he was signed on full time terms.

**Lol Morgan** (full back). 5 ft. 9 ins. Lol joined Rotherham after having spent several years with Huddersfield. Signed a G.2 form in August 1954 and it wasn't long before he gained a regular place in the left back position.

**Roy Lambert** (half back). 5 ft. 10 ins. Roy is a product of Sheffield Junior Football and came to Rotherham from Thorncleif Welfare. In May 1954 he was signed as a full-time professional, and for the past four years he has been an ever present member of the first team.

**Peter Madden** (centre half). 6 ft. 2 ins. Peter was a product of Junior Football in Bradford and joined Rotherham from Thornton Juniors on a part time basis in October 1955. Signed on a full-time basis in 1956. His polished displays have attracted the attention of the Second Division and First Division Scouts.

**Ray Lancaster** (half back). 6 ft. Ray was recommended to us in the 1957-58 Season and he was signed on amateur forms in April 1958. Played in our Northern Intermediate League side in the 1958-59 Season and after two months was signed on full-time professional.

**Don Weston** (forward). 5 ft. 8 ins. Don was bought from Birmingham City in December 1960 for a fee of £10,000 as a centre forward, who some six months

earlier had bought him from Wrexham for a fee estimated to be £15,000. Most of the time he has played at inside forward and has featured regularly on the score sheet.

**Alan Kirkman** (inside forward). 5 ft. 10 ins. Alan was transferred from Manchester City in February 1959 to help the scoring potential of the first team, and played a principal part in averting the big drop into the Third Division that Season. Since then he has occupied most of the forward positions.

**Hugh McIlmoyle** (centre forward). 5 ft. 9 ins. Hugh was a close season signing from Leicester City and it was on scouting reports and his Cup Final appearance which decided his purchase. Hugh, born in the best Scottish tradition, has naturally adopted his native style.

**Kenneth Houghton** (inside forward). 5 ft. 10 ins. Ken started his footballing career with a local colliery team and was spotted by one of our Scouts, who introduced him to our amateur staff in March last year. Signed as a full-time professional three months later.

**Ian Butler** (outside left). 5 ft. 10 ins. Ian was born in Darton, Barnsley, and was signed on amateur forms in 1959 and subsequently was introduced onto the ground staff in that year. His ball control has earned him two representative youth honours in England and Israel.
