Club Notes

WE extend a warm welcome to the Southampton Club on this mid-week return League II fixture. Last Wednesday evening at The Dell we divided the four goals scored equally which, all things considered, was a very creditable performance. We now meet in the return match with every hope of gaining our first win of the season especially in view of the fact that we held them to a draw on their own ground. We have had many a ding-dong struggle for points with the Saints going back to the year 1920 when the Third Division (South) was formed, although we did not meet in League warfare when Southampton gained promotion to League II at the end of season 1921/22 until our own promotion to that League in 1937/38. We have not met consistently since then for the Saints were relegated at the end of season 1952/53 whereas we won further promotion at the end of season 1954/55. We both found ourselves back in Division 2 however in Season 1960/61. The surprising fact about the Southampton Club is that despite the many famous players they have had on their books—and one who readily comes to mind at the moment is Alf Ramsey now Ipswich Town fame—the Saints have never been members of the First Division. They finished in third place of the Second Division in 1947/48 and in 1948/49, fourth place in 1949/50 and as far back as 1928/29. No doubt they were hoping for big things this season with such players in the side as Tony Knapp, one of the best centre half backs in the game, with forwards such as Terry Paine, George O'Brien, Derek Reeves, John Sydenham,

etc. but their defeat at The Dell last Saturday by Bury to the tune of three goals to nil especially coming so soon after the dropping of a point against ourselves must have come as a very unpleasant surprise.

We ourselves have not fared much better, for the loss of two home points last Saturday against Rotherham United came as a bitter blow. The fact that the second goal scored against us appeared to be well "Offside" and that the third goal was most definitely so by at least five yards does little to sweeten the pill. When John Lornie smashed in those two goals mid-way through the second half we at last could see some hope of a win but that third goal just finished such hopes although our lads did try to save the match and a screamer from Lornie which just topped the crossbar certainly deserved a better fate. It was not our day however, but what pleased the Manager as much as anything was the tremendous enthusiasm shown by the crowd when we had pulled level. This has really impressed him and given him the encouragement he needed to go out even more-so to get his lads into a well-moulded and successful side.

Our Reserve team played very well at Ipswich last Saturday, bringing home a well-deserved point. Every one of our lads played well, playing good constructive football with very seldom a pass going astray, but the player who took the eye most in this very entertaining match was Alwyn McGuffie in his old position of wing half. There is not a better purveyor of the ball than this player and that is why the Manager thought he would make a good link-man

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

T. Godfrey (goalkeeper). Born in Newbury. Joined Southampton after leaving school, and signed professional in April 1958. Very agile 'keeper who made 49 first team appearances last season.

R. Patrick (full back). Joined Southampton from Nottingham Forest in June 1961. Strong, hard player who can play either side of the field.

R. Davies (full back). Signed from Cardiff City in March 1958. Ron has played at full back, wing half, inside forward and centre forward during his career. Born Merthyr.

T. Traynor (full back). Born in Dundalk. Tom signed professional forms in June 1952. Has represented Eire both as an amateur and professional. He was capped for Eire and made 46 first team appearances last season.

I. White (wing half). One of our more recent signings, Ian joined the Saints from Leicester City in June 1962. A strong player in both attack and defence.

T. Knapp (centre half). A native of Newstead Colliery, Notts., Tony joined Leicester City in 1955. Signed for Southampton in August 1961 and has only missed one League game, and that due to International duty. Last season was invited to join the England World Cup party prior to their visit to Chile.

C. Huxford (wing half). Born in Stroud, Gloucestershire, Cliff first joined Chelsea in 1954. Since signing for the Saints has been a regular member of the 1st XI.

T. Paine (wing forward). Terry, who was born in Winchester is a product of the Southampton Youth XI. Has played in numerous representative matches. Last season was invited to join the England World Cup party prior to their visit to Chile.

G. O'Brien (inside forward). Born in Dunfermline, George joined the Saints from Leeds United in 1959. An excellent footballer who possesses a tremendous shot—leading goal scorer last season.

D. Reeves (centre forward). Born at Parkstone, Dorset, joined the Saints in 1955 after completing his National Service. Holds the club goal scoring record with 47 League goals in one season.
