Club Notes

THIS evening we receive Preston North End in our last early season mid-week home match, and extend to them a warm welcome on yet another visit to Kenilworth Road. Until last Saturday they had not won any of the four matches played but then at home to Newcastle they won by two goals to one and thus no doubt brought much relief for defeats at Plymouth 7-1 and at Walsall 4-1, although some had been obtained by drawn games with Norwich 2-2 and Plymouth 0-0, both at home. Last season we had Preston as our visitors for the opening match which we won fairly comfortably by four goals to one. Preston, one of the twelve original Clubs to form the Football League in 1888, were League Champions and F.A. Cup Winners in that season, winning the Cup without conceding a single goal. This latter feat has only been equalled by Bury when they won the Cup in 1902/03. Preston also have the honour of having won the League Championship in that first year without losing a match.

Our lads had rather a disappointing match at Charlton last Saturday, losing by two clear goals to give the Athletic their first win of the season. Our forward line never "got together" somehow and although some of the approach work was quite good the finishing rather lacked that incisiveness which brings goals. Jim Goldie hit an upright when we were one goal in arrear which, had it registered, could have changed the course of the match but apart from a very determined effort by Freddy Jardine which ended in the

ball hitting the side netting our forwards could not again penetrate the strong barrier put up by the Charlton defence. Jardine on this showing would have been included in to-night's match but, as fortune would have it, he slipped on the wet surface while training yesterday morning causing a slight strain which prevents him playing. We hope that with the return of Gordon Turner in the line-up this evening, following his match with the Reserves last Saturday, that he will have found his old shooting boots for Turner on the goal-standard cannot be left out of the side. Brendan McNally returns to the side following his very successful turn-out for Eire last Sunday against Iceland, at Reykjavik in the Second Leg of the European Nations Cup Tie, drawing one goal each and so Eire go forward on aggregate by 5 goals to 3.

Our Reserve side won their Combination fixture against Northampton Res. here last Saturday by six goals to two in a very entertaining match. There was some good football from both sides, with a very promising display by young David Lovell in the outside left position. The ease with which Alwyn McGuffie scored from the 'spot' to register our third goal. This young team, nicely supported by the experienced Ron Cope at centre half, is doing very well and pleasing the Manager very much. PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Alan Kelly (Goalkeeper). Born Dublin. Joined North End from Drumcondra with John O'Neill, in April, 1958. Regular 1st team goalkeeper last season and was capped for Eire several times.

John Donnelly (full back). Another close season signing. Joined the Deepdale staff from Celtic at a fair fee. Quick in the tackle and uses the ball to advantage.

George Ross (full back). Born Inverness. Another player who more or less joined North End from school. Last season was regular 1st team left half back. Strong hard player in either full back positions.

John Wylie (wing half). Signed from Huddersfield Town in May, 1957. Made his League debut against Leeds United, at Deepdale, in September, 1958. Strong in defence.

Tony Singleton (centre half). Preston born player who has reached the 1st team through the Junior ranks. Signed as a part time professional May, 1955, turning full time pro. on leaving the forces, in June, 1959.

Jimmy Smith (half back). Signed in 1955 from Scottish Junior Club Arbroath, where he was born. Played over 100 games for the 1st team. Played for British Army at centre half and wing half.

David Wilson (Forward). Born Nelson and came to North End as a schoolboy. Had an excellent record in our Youth Team, a clever ball player. Originally an inside forward but converted to a winger last season. Still only 19, a great future is forecast for this lad.

Alf Biggs (forward). Born Bristol and joined North End from Bristol Rovers in June, 1961, at a considerable fee. Big and strong a player of marked football ability. Leading goal scorer last season with 22 goals.

Alex Dawson (forward). Born Aberdeen. Joined North End from Manchester Utd. in November, 1961. Strong forceful type of player. Good in the air with a powerful shot.

Peter Thompson (forward). Born Carlisle. Joined groundstaff from school. Played for Cumberland and England schoolboys and Lancashire F.A. Youth Team. Made his League debut against Arsenal in August, 1960. Played for Young England against England at Highbury last season.

Alec Alston (forward). Preston born son of a former well known local boxer. Preston schools player in 1952 and joined North End in 1955. Came full time professional after National Service in August, 1957 and has occupied many positions in the forward line.
