

Club Notes

IN failing to take advantage of the several chances we had of scoring last Wednesday evening, in our League II fixture with Preston North End, we had to acknowledge another home defeat, our second of the season. The Preston goal had been under almost constant pressure, and how they reached half-time without any one of four incidents not having resulted in a goal against them had to be seen to be believed. Certainly two of the incidents arose because of some degree of panic in the Preston defence but if the ball had gone between the posts nobody in the Preston defence would have been able to do anything to prevent it. The very first chance they had of scoring they took, after two good chances in the second half by our forwards had been missed. Up till then Ron Baynham had in the most confident manner dealt with everything the Preston forwards had been able to threaten him with, and it was tragic that he should be beaten twice whilst his counterpart emerged unscathed. We thought a header from Dave Pacey had at last hit the target but it was not to be for although the goalie was beaten by it there was one of his backs to clear off the line. Apart from missed chances however it was a fast and entertaining game of football which everybody would have enjoyed if the goals had come. Credit to both sides for playing football — there was not one nasty foul throughout the match, a point which the Referee made upon leaving the Ground.

This afternoon we have Stoke City as our opponents in a League II fixture to whom we extend once more a warm welcome to Kenilworth Road. They have not begun the season very well, and

in fact are still awaiting their first win. The three points obtained to date are as the result of three draws, two at home and the other at Derby County where the score was 1-1. At the time these Notes were being prepared we had not received the Stoke team but it was fully expected the ever-green Stan Matthews would be in the line-up and we hope to see him wearing the Red and White shirt this afternoon. Jackie Mudie we know very well as the ex-Blackpool player whom we are pleased to see again, also Dennis Violett transferred from Manchester United last January. With such experience in the forward line it is rather surprising this Stoke team has yet to gain its first win.

Our Reserve side won their Combination fixture against Northampton Res. here last Saturday by six goals to two in a very entertaining match. There was some good football from both sides, with a very promising display by young David Lovell in the outside left position. The way he worked the ball down the left wing early in the game, beating three men to give young Mat Brennan the perfect opening was well worth seeing. The ease also with which Alwyn McGuffie scored from the 'spot' to register our third goal. This young team, nicely supported by the experienced Ron Cope at centre half, is doing very well and pleasing the Manager very much. Also very pleasing to him was the way in which our Junior side trounced the Charlton Youth at Charlton last Saturday morning in a South East Counties' fixture by no less than five goals to nil. 
