AFTER the many hundreds of miles travelled lately in our search for new players it is perhaps strange that the player's signature we have obtained so far comes from practically our nearest neighbour, Arsenal. We had our sights on Danny Clapton last season as his style of play attracted us but Danny, after much thought on the matter, decided to stay put with the Arsenal. As soon as we heard however that the Arsenal were prepared to part with him we contacted them with the result that Danny is wearing the number 7 shirt for us this afternoon. We extend to him a very warm welcome to Kenilworth Road trusting he will soon settle down and feel he is one of us. If you the fans will do your share in making him welcome and show appreciation for his play together with the other members of the "Hatters" then we are very sure we can look forward to a rise in our fortunes. The Manager and Chief Scout have been to Scotland again this week following up a very strong recommendation on two players. At the time these note were being prepared nothing definite had been accomplished but we are hoping there will be a signing as a result of this visit and the other last week when the Manager with a Director saw a player who interests us very much. We can assure you all that it is not for the want of effort that players in whom we are interested have not been signed. We really thought we had the signature of David Burnside, of West Bromwich Albion last week for instance—terms had been agreed between our two Clubs but in the end nothing came of it. When Officials of the Club travel to interview a player in the full expectation of obtaining his signature only in the end to return home empty handed the sense

of disappointment cannot be adequately expressed for during the journey for instance much discussion takes place on how this player is going to fit into the team, tactics to be devised to fit in with his style of play, and so on. Burnside was just the player we are looking for to add craft and incisiveness to our forward line, but alas it was not to be. We can tell those of you here and now who might be thinking of applying ink to paper for the benefit of the Sports Editor of the "Luton News" that it was not because Burnside had anything against Luton Town which decided him not to sign for us. There are so many different considerations in these matters of which the public cannot be made aware that we ask you to accept our assurance that we tried all we could to sign this player but all in vain. Although disappointed let us say straight away we respect Burnside for his decision, which was not an easy one to make.

We have the pleasure of receiving Leeds United here this afternoon in a League II fixture but not supported, we are sorry to say by the presence of John Charles. Many nice things have been said of this great player, the nicest we feel is 'the gentle giant' for never have we found or heard of the great Charles using his magnificent frame to unfair advantage. That Leeds with average Gates last season of just over sixteen thousand should take the plunge of buying back into English football this outstanding player shows great courage for with which a vast sum of money, £65,000, locked up in one player undoubtedly a very big risk has been taken. It is certainly good to see this great player back in English football—our regret this afternoon is that we shall not be seeing him in action. In the Leeds team today are three youngsters of

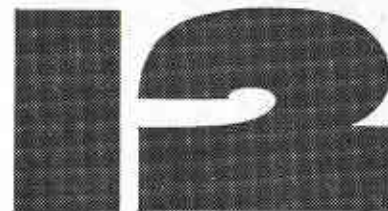
