

Club Notes

ALTHOUGH still placed near the bottom of the Second Division Table our recent performances in both League and League Cup matches shows that picture to be a false one and thus giving a very wrong impression. Following our two away defeats first at Swansea and then at Cardiff City by the narrowest of margins when in each case defeat should have been avoided we went to Middlesbrough last Saturday and won by two clear goals against a talented team which has cost a lot of money to build. In that period we have been drawn away to both Southport and Barnsley in the Football League Cup and won on both occasions, no mean feat especially the match at Barnsley who were definitely on the up-grade at the time we met them and who were confidently expecting to repeat their triumph over us of our previous meeting, also incidentally in a Cup Tie. Therefore in our last six matches five of which were away from home our record is

By any standard this is no mean performance — could have been better of course — but it is good going, and a continuation on these lines will soon see us away from our lowly position, especially as our next two matches here at Kenilworth Road are against similarly placed teams in Walsall and Grimsby Town against whom maximum points can we feel be confidently expected.

Our win at Middlesbrough last Saturday was a great tonic to us all, and particularly as it was well earned. The return of John Groves into the half back line undoubtedly meant a strengthening

in defence and it seems that Alwyn McGuffie, now more used to what is required of an inside forward, played a most important part in the victory. Dave Pacey cut out England centre forward Alan Peacock most effectively, which is a great feather indeed in his cap, and altogether there was a very fine all-round performance from our lads. Ron Davies, whom we welcome to-day in his first match at Kenilworth Road, also played his part effectively without any trimmings, showing that as he gains experience in this higher class of football he will most certainly prove a great asset. John Groves is not playing to-day as he has been at home all the week suffering from a very heavy cold and is therefore not fit. His place as you see is being taken by Mark Lownds who we know will not let the side down. He played in the number 5 shirt at Norwich a fortnight ago playing very well indeed. This is his fourth appearance in the Senior side and he has the honour of having scored a goal on his first appearance in the Football League.

We have pleasure today in welcoming once again Derby County to Kenilworth Road in a Football League fixture. Gone for the moment is the glory that once adorned this famous Club, one of the original members of the Football League when Formed in 1888/89. It is strange to record with so many famous players that they have never won the Championship nor the F.A. Cup except they did win the latter in 1945/46, the season before football proper was resumed following the War. The team which beat Charlton Athletic at Wembley by four goals to one after extra time to win the Cup that year was — Woodley; Nicholas, Howe; Bullions, Leuty, Musson; Harrison, Carter, Stamps, Doherty and Dally

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Ken Oxford (goalkeeper). Signed in December 1957 from Norwich City, but had previously played for the Club as a trialist in 1948. Also played for Manchester City as an amateur. Representative honour when with Norwich City.

Geoffrey Barrowcliffe (full back.) A local boy who signed for Derby County while playing with Ilkeston Town in October 1950. Played with the Central League side the same season and made his Football League debut on 1st September, 1951 at the age of 19. Has also played centre forward.

Raymond Young (wing half). A former England Schoolboys and Derby Boys player who made his debut in the Football League at Doncaster in April 1954. Signed as an amateur in May 1949, turning professional in March, 1951. A cool, constructive and intelligent player.

Leslie Moore (centre half). Joined Derby County from Midland League Club Worksop Town in November 1957 and after only three weeks made his Football League debut against Rotherham United at Millmoor Ground. A native of Sheffield, and is a big, strong forceful player who is rarely defeated in the air.

John Parry (wing half). A member of the well-known Derby footballing family and attracted the Club's attention while playing for Derby Boys. Signed amateur forms in 1947 and turned professional in July 1948, making his Football League debut in April 1949.

when only 17 years old. Is equally at home at inside forward.

Donald Roby (outside right). Transferred from Notts. County in August 1961 for a substantial fee and has the reputation for good ball control and the ability to beat his opponent on either side. Joined the Notts staff as an amateur in 1949 and made 233 Football League appearances for them.

William Curry (inside or centre forward). Entered League football with his home town Club, Newcastle United in 1955/56, scoring 7 goals in 19 matches. During the following season he scored 25 times in 51 games. Has played for England Under 23 team. Scored 23 goals in 40 games whilst with Brighton. Transferred to Derby County on 30th September 1960 and is still maintaining his goal scoring ability.

Ian Buxton (inside or centre forward). A locally born player who turned professional in March 1959 after playing for the Club as a junior. Had Central League experience as an amateur and shows plenty of promise. Has also had considerable success on the playing staff of the Derbyshire County Cricket Club.

James Hutchinson (inside forward). Signed from Chesterfield F.C. in July 1960. Played as an amateur with Bolton Wanderers, 1952/53, and professional with Chesterfield 1953/60. A Sheffield born player, he is a clever, scheming forward who rarely misses a chance to score.
