



Club Notes

FOLLOWING our win at Middlesbrough three weeks ago we really thought we had at long last turned the corner and could now look forward to some success on the field especially in our matches here at Kenilworth Road. Derby County were our next opponents, and we felt a nice win over them would lift us nicely from near the bottom of the Table and so give us confidence for the future. Alas it was not to be for after allowing many chances of opening the scoring to pass us by, Derby scored twice and although we did reduce the arrears the effort came too late.

It is noticed that we follow Chelsea's opponents of the previous Saturday. Without going into too much detail Chelsea won their match at Derby on October 27th by three goals to one. The following Saturday Derby came here and won. Last Saturday the Pensioners went to Walsall and won by five goals to one. Walsall play here to-day. It is hoped the trend does not continue.

We extend a warm welcome to the Walsall team. Officials and Supporters in this Second Division encounter. On their return to the Second Division last season (they last played in the Second Division prior to last Season in Season 1900/01 when they finished third place from bottom but failed to gain re-election—rejoining the Football League when the Third Division (North) was formed in Season 1921/22). Finishing in the lower half of the Third Division (South) at the end of Season 1957/58 they were members of the newly formed Division Four the following season. At the end of the second season in this Division they finished Champions and were thus

promoted to Division Three. Their stay in this Division did not last long for they finished Runners-up to Bury the Champions and so in the shortest possible time jumped from Division Four to Division Two. Last Season they finished level pegging with ourselves—both 39 points—together with such redoubtable teams as Bury, Newcastle United, Middlesbrough, Charlton Athletic, Derby County and Norwich City all with the same number of points. This season Walsall have scored two more goals than ourselves but have had eleven more scored against them and yet they have a lead over us of five points. We hope to shorten that lead to-day.

We were knocked out of the Football League Cup in our Fourth Round Tie with Manchester City last Wednesday but again we were beaten by one goal and again we should have returned with at least a share of the spoils. Rain fell heavily throughout the whole evening so that conditions were very heavy. Any-one not knowing which was the First Division side would we feel have guessed the wrong team, so well did our lads play. However that is goodbye to this particular Cup for another season.

Our Reserve team did very well to beat Arsenal Reserves at Highbury a fortnight ago and then to continue the good work by beating Shrewsbury Town Reserves here last Saturday. Shrewsbury have a very good defence and although they should have succumbed on one or two occasions managed to keep a clean sheet until only nine minutes from the end when a very well-taken goal by Mat Brennan won full points for us. We now occupy fourth position in the Combination Table with the same number of points as West Ham United

in third place. It was very pleasing to note last Saturday the excellent displays of Ron Cope and Alan Daniels, especially the former who hardly put a foot wrong throughout the ninety minutes. Although our defence played very well these two players were outstanding. It was also pleasing to note that Mal Brennan is quickly becoming adjusted to the English style of play, giving a very pleasing and effective display.

Our match at Tyneside last Saturday resulted in a defeat of three goals to one, but again if only we had had a player able to finish off good approach work we could have come away with at least a share of the spoils. It was only because Ernie Thomas, the ex-Scunthorpe

United player, on two occasions scored goals when there seemed little chance of him doing so which turned the game into Newcastle's favour. Our approach work was very good indeed but we just could not find that finish in front of goal which would have made all the difference. Oh for another Joe Payne or Hughie Billington!

We had a very good match here at Kenilworth Road last Saturday morning when our youngsters beat Parkside in the First Round Competition Proper of the F.A. Youth Cup. Mr. C. J. Ellingham, Hon. Secretary and the Officials of Parkside are to be congratulated upon getting together such a well-balanced and capable side entirely from local youth. They took the lead twice over

our youngsters, and it was only in the last ten minutes or so of the game that the Parkside lads began to tire due to the heavy conditions that our lads really got on top. It was throughout a very enjoyable game, certainly more worthy of the mere handful of spectators who turned up to watch it. Our team was — M. Fiore; R. Barton, M. Forsythe; R. Wilkinson, G. Caleb (App. Pro.), A. Buchanan; K. Hargreaves (App. Pro.), R. Kefford, A. Rivers, M. Howkins and V. Summers. Scorers were Rivers, Kefford, Summers and Buchanan. After the match Alan Rivers signed as an Apprentice Professional with us. We have great hopes with this lad. His progress will be watched with much interest.

We welcome to-day very warmly The Luton Youth Band in this their first public performance. The Band was formed in May this year with the object of giving the young people of Luton the opportunity of following their musical education so ably commenced in the Luton Schools as well as to provide future bandmen for the Luton Band.

In this way the continued existence of a Championship class band in Luton will be assured. A great effort was required to launch the Band — over £400 was raised to purchase instruments and equipment. We ask you to give generously this afternoon to further these efforts.

Next Saturday morning, kick off at 11, Luton Schoolboys will be playing North Leicestershire Boys in the Third Round of the English Schools' Trophy Competition. The winners of this match will enter the Divisional Final of the Competition, so there will be much endeavour on both sides to advance further. Luton Boys received a Bye in the First Round, but defeated West Herts (away) by three goals to one in the Second Round. In the Corinthian Shield Competition the Luton Boys beat Barking Boys (away) by five goals to two. The match next Saturday morning is therefore the first time the Luton Boys have played at home this season. We trust there is a nice crowd to cheer their efforts. The captain of the side, Bruce Reoch, has already this season represented London Boys versus Liverpool Boys at White Hart Lane.
