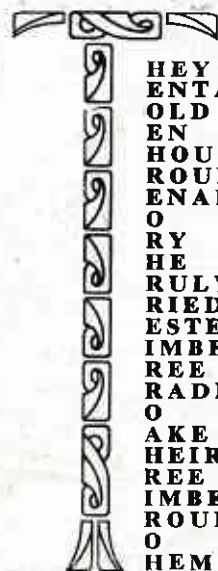

AFTER having gone three matches without defeat, it was something of a disappointment to come away from Plymouth without a point last Saturday, although on a form basis, we were not in with much of a chance.

Yet, at Norwich, we showed that current form is not much to go on, and we played well enough in the first half at Home Park to have insured against defeat.

Unfortunately, those vital half-chances which must be accepted away from home, were not accepted to the full, and Plymouth had a lucky goal which put them ahead against the run of the play.

Yet, we hit back very quickly afterwards with Alwyn McGuffie accepting a chance carved out by the joint efforts of Ron Davies and Harry Walden.

At half-time, Plymouth were a little relieved to be on terms and their supporters were saying that Luton's football was far ahead of what they expected from a team in our low position.

Once they went ahead early in the second half, Plymouth became a much-changed team and, in the end, we went down 3-1.

However, we are convinced that the team is playing well enough to take us out of this desperate situation, especially if our hunt for an inside forward and, at the time of writing these notes, we have high hopes of signing Stuart Leary, has been successful.

Today, we welcome our old friends of many years from Bury who, like ourselves, do not enjoy generous support.

because they are in a part of Lancashire in which there is considerable competition.

Yet, they are making a brave bid for promotion this season under the guiding influence of the player-manager, Bob Stokoe, the former Newcastle United star.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Chris Harker (goalkeeper). Graduated from Newcastle Youth and moved to Aberdeen while on military service, transferred to Bury midway through last season for substantial fee and was Manager Stokoe's first signing. Was seen several times by Bury chief scout, Colin McDonald, former England goalkeeper and has fulfilled all the forecasts made for him.

Brian Gallagher (full back). At 18 he was a regular in the Lancashire Combination side Ashton United, and was brought to Bury by Bert Head, now Swindon Manager. One of the best defenders seen in a Bury team since Billy Gorman.

Brian Eastham (full back). Product of Bolton Federation football where he lives. Brian looks and is a player of class. Took over the left back position at the commencement of last season and is now well established and experienced after several fine seasons in the Central League.

Brian Turner (right half). From Manchester Schools Football, Brian joined Bury as a junior and on his return from military service abroad, came through rapidly to become captain and one of the most consistent half backs in the country. Determined in his approach to the game, he is a great favourite at Gigg Lane, and must surely be recognised for honours before long.

Bob Stokoe (Team Manager and centre half). When Bob joined the Gigg Laners in that much publicised Newcastle - Bury deal with John McGrath, in February, 1960, he little thought he would influence the Club to make so quick a return to the Second Division. Bob's record at Newcastle is a most enviable one with Wembley honours and representative games to support his wide experience in the 'big time.'

Gordon Atherton (left half). A product of Horwich in the Lancashire Combination. Gordon quickly earned a first

team place in 1959 and has held it ever since with consistency and the dynamic ability to move around for the full 90 minutes. Now approaching his peak form as an attacking wing half.

Warren Bradley (outside right). Native of Hyde, Cheshire, Warren combines his football duties with the profession of school teacher. Following amateur England honours with Bishop Auckland, he moved to Manchester United and while there secured a full England Cap. Moved on to Bury towards end of last term.

George Jones (inside right). George signed for Bury almost outside the school gates and had a notable record at School as a 1,000 metres champion, and top goal scorer in his school team. Now a full professional after his apprentice term he already has a full England Youth Cap against Holland last season.

Bill Calder (centre forward). Born Greenock, and joined Leicester City with whom he spent three seasons, alternating from centre forward to outside right. Moved to Gigg Lane in 1959 and his strong robust type of play has kept him almost continuously in the team for two seasons.

Frank Beaumont (inside right). Bury made one of their rare expensive signings when they signed Frank from Barnsley after almost a season of observation. A strong and thrustful player Frank came through the Barnsley nursery after schoolboy honours.

Tony Bartley (outside left). Born Stalybridge, Cheshire, Tony signed for Bolton Wanderers and joined the Forces the following day. Played only on occasions when military duties allowed, in the Central League side, released by Bolton after his return from the Forces and rejoined his old Club at Stalybridge, where he was seen by Bury Scout Jimmy Porter and signed at what was considered a high fee for Cheshire League.

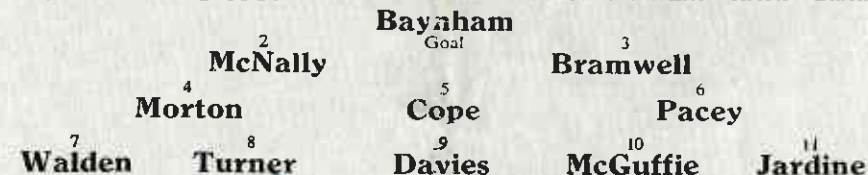
