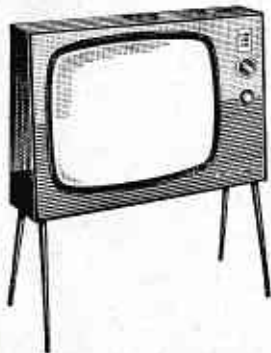

Again we lost a match by the odd goal, the sixth this season and again we met a team who were playing their new signing at his home debut. It is the occasion when the new player quite naturally wishes to make an impression. This was no exception for their new centre forward scored the two goals which meant our defeat.

## PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

**Peter Bonetti** (goalkeeper). Signed as a professional in April 1959 after one full season with our Juniors. He made his League debut against Manchester City on April 2nd, 1960. In 1960-61 he was our first-choice goalie and played in 36 League games. Last season he had 33 games before his injury, but by then he had already gained England Under-23 honours. Born at Wandsworth.

**Kenneth Shellito** (full back). Born at East Ham, he is a product of our Junior Scheme, signing professional forms in April, 1957. Played school football for Hornchurch, Essex and London. Made his League debut at Nottingham Forest in April 1959. Captain of our Junior team that went to Cannes for the 1959 Easter. He was voted the "Best Footballer" at the Festival. Now a regular in our first team.

**Alan Harris** (full back). After playing with our Juniors he joined our professional staff in May, 1960. He played in the England Youth Trial at Corby in January 1960. First appearance in our League side was at Preston in October, 1960. He has also gained caps with the England Youth team. Last season he had 27 games in the first team. Born at Northampton.

**Terence Venables** (Half back). He joined the Juniors in season 1958-59. He made his debut in our League side against West Ham United at Upton Park in February, 1960. Was present in seven matches for the England Youth team. Played 36 games for the First Team last season and has collected two F.A. Youth Cup winner's medals. Born at Dagenham.

**John Mortimore** (half back). England Youth and Amateur International. He played his first League match against Blackpool in the last game of the 1955-56 season. He signed professional forms for Chelsea in August, 1957. Played 14 games last season. A schoolteacher by profession. Born at Farnborough.

**Frank Upton** (half back). Former Derby County captain. Joined Chelsea in August, 1961 after playing 233 games for Derby County. Before joining Derby he played for Northampton while doing his National Service. Born at Nuneaton.

**Albert Murray** (forward). After three seasons with the Juniors, he signed professional forms in May, 1961. Made his League debut as outside right against Birmingham City last October and played seven games in that position and ended with 4 goals in 17 League matches.

**Bobby Tambling** (forward). Signed professional forms in September, 1958. He played his first League match against West Ham United, in February, 1959. Last season scored hat-tricks against Sheffield United and Sheffield Wednesday, and scored 20 goals in 34 League games was forced to miss several games in closing weeks because of injury. Born at Storrington.

**Barry John Bridges** (forward). As a Junior gained international Caps for the England Youth Team. He signed professional forms in May, 1958. Made his League debut against West Ham United at Stamford Bridge in February, 1959. Last season he scored 19 goals in 32 Leagues games. He scored a hat-trick against West Bromwich Albion in November. Born at Horsford.

**Graham Moore** (forward). While playing for Cardiff City he gained international honours for Wales against England in 1959, also against Scotland and Ireland in the same year. He also played against England in the Under 23 team. Played for Wales against Spain in 1961. Moved to Chelsea in December, 1961. Born at Hengoed in Radnorshire.

**Frank Blunstone** (forward). First played for Crewe Alexandra when only 16 years old. Signed for Chelsea in February, 1953. Made his debut in First Division football against Tottenham Hotspur in March, 1953. Played for England against Wales in 1954. Broke his leg in the same place twice. Born at Crewe.
