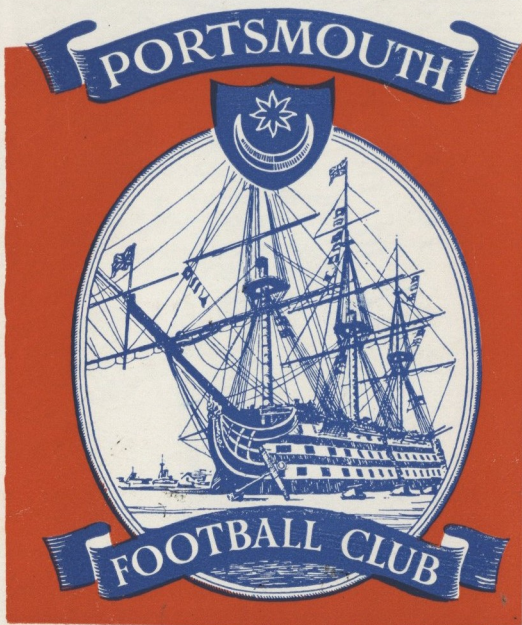

OFFICIAL NOTES

Clubs have spent sums ranging from £200 - £500 trying to get their pitches ship shape and in the majority of cases, all to no avail, which must be so disheartening to say the least.

Our Cup replay with Scunthorpe United is causing their ground staff excessive work and worry. During the past weeks it has meant continuous snow shifting and ice breaking, and when success was in sight back came more snow and frost.

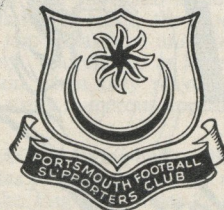
The Continent also suffered. Belgium and the Netherlands had almost complete disruption of their fixtures. The other countries were able to make satisfactory re-arrangements.

We give John Armstrong a warm welcome to this his first match at Fratton Park and wish him every success. He should of course have made his debut with the Club at Stamford Bridge last Saturday, but the match was postponed.

A warm welcome also to our visitors from Luton. Their position in the League must be a little worrying to them. Having suffered ourselves, we readily sympathise with others trying to steer clear of the bottom positions. However this should only help make them try even harder to-day, and no quarter given or asked. The "Strawplaiters" have a long and outstanding history since their baptism in 1885. They were for many years in the Southern League. In fact the records show us as playing against them in that League from 1900 to 1920. It was not until 1920/21 season we started our League Fixtures with them. All in all we have now met on 64 occasions – 28 having been won and 12 drawn, the last time being a 3–3 draw at Luton.

PEN PICTURES OF LUTON TOWN PLAYERS

RON BAYNHAM (Goalkeeper).—Has been with Luton Town since 1951. Secured for Southern League Club, Worcester City. He has represented England on several occasions. Played for the Football League on two occasions and also for England 'B' Team versus Yugoslavia 'B'. Was a member of the F.A. Touring Party to South America in 1959.

JOHN BRAMWELL (Full-back).—One of the two players who joined Luton from Everton when Billy Bingham, the Irish International was transferred to that club in October, 1960. Is a very capable player and worthy to be considered for International honours.

FRED JARDINE (Outside-left).—Born in Edinburgh. Played for Dundee for two seasons before coming to Luton at the end of season 1960/61. Has shown much promise since he arrived here.

TERRY KELLY (Centre-half).—Born in Luton. Played for Hitchin Town before joining Luton in 1950. Originally played wing-half, but was successfully converted to a Centre-half. A very strong player who holds his own with most Centre-forwards.

B. McNALLY (Full-back).—Can occupy either full-back position. Came from the League of Ireland Club, Shelbourne and has been with Luton since May, 1956. Played for Eire 'B' versus Rumania in Dublin in 1957 and also for Eire versus Czechoslovakia.

R. MORTON (Wing-half or Centre-forward).—Local born and has been with the Club since 1948. Played for England 'B' versus Switzerland 'B' team, the Football Combination versus the Dutch XI (on two occasions) and also for the Football Association versus the Army. Was chosen as Reserve for England at Wembley in 1955 and again when they played Ireland in 1958. Usually a wing-half but has made numerous appearances at Centre-forward.

D. PACEY (Wing-half).—Born in Luton, signed for the Club in 1956. Has played for the F.A. versus the R.A.F. and was also a member of the England Under-23 team against Germany and Italy. Very strong player with a liking for getting among the goalscorers.

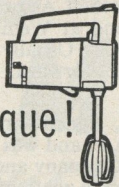

G. RIDDICK (Inside-forward).—Turned professional April, 1961 following a short period of Apprenticeship. Tall, with good ball control and a very good shot, much is expected of this lad when he has gained more experience.

G. TURNER (Centre or Inside-forward).—Came to Luton as a Wing-half upon his demob from the Navy but found his true position in the forward line. Represented the English League versus the Scottish League in 1955 and also played for the F.A. XI versus the Army in 1958. The Town's leading goalscorer for eight seasons out of the last nine. Is a skilled player with a tremendous shot.

H. WALDEN (Outside-right).—Joined Luton from Kettering in January last year and stepped straight into the first team at Norwich, making 34 League and Cup appearances last season. Has a very forceful shot.

RON COPE (Centre-half).—Signed from Manchester United just before the opening of the 1961/62 season. Signed for them as an Amateur in 1950, turning Professional in 1951. Was an England Schoolboy International. Made 150 appearances for Manchester United's First Team.

J. LORNIE (Centre-forward).—An Aberdonian, he arrived at Luton from Leicester City whom he joined in 1958 as an Inside-forward. Was converted to Centre-forward, in which position he played several times in the City First Team.

A. McGUFFIE (Wing-half or Inside-forward) Signed Professional forms for Luton in September, 1954. Has made numerous appearances in the First Team since his demob from the Army. Is an excellent distributor of the ball with a flare for coming through to have a shot at goal.

T. McKECHNIE (Inside-forward).—Born Glasgow and came to Luton direct from Rob Roy at the end of Season 1960/61. Played consistently in the First Team last season, making 36 appearances in League and Cup.

B. REED (Full-back).—Secured season 1960/61 from Leicester City with whom he has been two seasons as a full-time Professional. Previous to that he was on their books for five seasons as an Amateur and part-time Professional. Hails from Peterborough. A very methodical player.

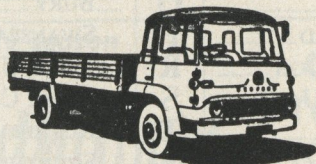

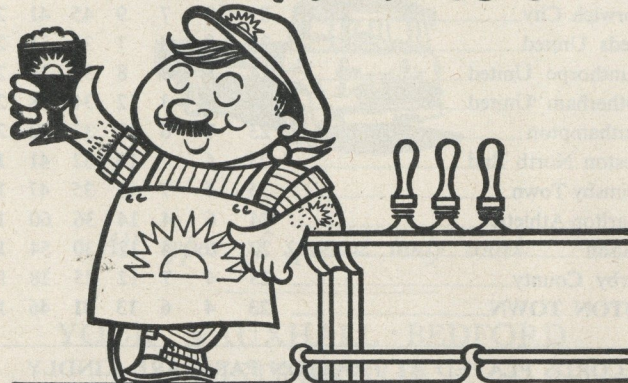
