SOCCER, thank goodness, is "off the ice" at long last. With today's visit of Luton Town, our first team get their first game at Leeds Road since December 8th.

What can we expect from Eddie Boot's team after their 5-0 Cup thrashing at Old Trafford the other night? Plenty, asserts the "Spotlight" team. The 1962-63 season is still a long way from being over and done with; there's a Second Division promotion race to be won and we're still in it.

Let's forget Old Trafford. Not all of it, for there were valuable team lessons to be learned. Town were soundly beaten; there can be no excuses offered.

Today, we're back to League football. What is really important is that this afternoon's Leeds Road crowd should demonstrate to acting skipper Ken Taylor and his teammates that despite Monday night's debacle they're still right behind them.

Besides, what about Chelsea last week-end?

The worst legacy which there could develop from Town's Cup defeat is that there should be any sapping of confidence and it's in that direction that the crowd's encouragement can prove to be of inestimable value this afternoon.

Well, what about it, Leeds Road fans? It's three long months since the cheers rang out on this fine old ground. How about a vigorous try-out of those rusty vocal chords when the Town lads run on to the pitch?

Our visitors, Luton Town, to whom we extend a warm welcome, may look to be in a sorry plight at the bottom of the Second Division table but Town know better than to underestimate their capabilities.

For one thing, Town aren't likely to forget what Southampton meted out on their last visit here. The date: October 27th. The Saints, it will be

recalled, had the worst away record in the Division. Indeed, they hadn't won a game on their travels and had scored very few goals.

Phew! but what a fright they gave our lads! With their 3-2 win, the Saints smashed Town's undefeated home record and mention of that game reminds us that we're due to play the return League fixture with Southampton at The Dell in a week's time. That should be quite a tussle!

The fact is, unfortunately, that Town have frequently been knocked out of their stride by teams from the Second Division's lower reaches. December provided two apt illustrations of this tendency.

Firstly, there was the disappointment of a 2-1 defeat at Derby which gave the "Rams" their third point from the two League meetings, and on December 29th Town had to be satisfied with only a point from their visit to Grimsby.

Well, may be that trend will alter this afternoon! Certainly, the Town lads should find last Saturday's win over Chelsea a refreshing incentive; another win today and they should be right back among the leading challengers for promotion.

When one analyses Luton's records so far this season, it is not difficult to spot the root cause of their present difficulties. In short, like Town, they've been making heavy weather of finding the net!

Luton's aggregate amounts to thirty-two goals, seventeen fewer than they have conceded. Indeed, in seven League games, the Luton forwards have failed to score at all. There have been attempts to rectify this notable deficiency but so far the results have been slow to materialise.

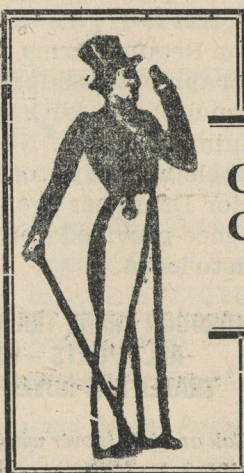

BAYNHAM, R. - Goalkeeper.

This former England international

McNALLY, B. - Right-back.

Brendan, too, played at Wembley.
Dublin-born, he joined the Bedford-
shire club from Shelbourne, following
in the No. 2 spot Seamus Dunne.

BRAMWELL, J. - Left-back.

This is John's second full season with
Luton, who recruited him from Ever-
ton in October, 1960. A Wigan lad, he
was the only player on the books with
a 100 per cent. League appearance
record in 1961-62, and has been out
once this time.

McGUFFIE, A. - Right-half.

Recently, Alwyn has been preferred
to experienced Bob Morton, who shot
a second-half winner in the corres-
ponding fixture last term. A marks-
man in away fixture matches with
Newcastle United and Plymouth
Argyle last year. Birthplace Stranraer.

KELLY, T. - Centre-half.

Terry edged out one-time Manchester
United personality Ronnie Cope. A
local lad, he was credited with four-
teen League games last season.

PACEY, D. - Left-half.

Luton's scorer in the 1959 Cup Final,
Dave, who is with his home-town
club, also collected their first goal of
1962-63 in a 2-2 draw at Southampton.
Has reverted to wing-half after a spell
in the middle.

WALDEN, H. - Right-winger.

If Harry is omitted this afternoon it
will be for the first time during the
campaign. This former Kettering
type has switched wings since Danny
Clapton - signed from Arsenal -
dropped out. Walden's goals have
been scored in home games (against
Southampton, Portsmouth and Wal-
sall) and in the odd-goal defeat at
Rotherham on December 21st.

TURNER, G. - Inside-right.

One of the game's best-known goal-
getters, Gordon (born Hull) has
scored over 200 in more than 350
League games. A member of a noted

Town had Hulme and Barclay back on the right wing; young Brook, inside-right the previous week, stayed in the team as leader of the attack, and Chivers was inside-left to Beasley.

After Lawton had headed wide for Everton in an opening move, Town raided strongly and Morton saved brilliantly from Barclay. In three minutes Town were ahead, Brook scoring at close range from a corner by Hulme. The Leeds Road men looked the better team in these early stages and for a time Everton were penned in their own half.

When the visitors' forwards got back into the game Stevenson forced Hesford to save at the expense of a corner, following which Mountford kicked out after the goalkeeper had missed the ball. After 23 minutes Everton equalised through Cunliffe, who seemed to be well offside when he took a pass from Mercer. The referee waved play on, however, and the inside-right made the most of his chance. Town were clearly upset and two minutes later Gillick beat Hesford from Lawton's pass to put the visitors in front.

Hulme, who finished the first-half limping, was little more than a passenger for the rest of the game. Still, Town had a good share of the play, chiefly through the agency of Beasley and Chivers, but could not break down a good defence.

Although Young kept Lawton in subjection, Everton were often dangerous, but the busy Hesford was not beaten again until the 80th minute, when Stevenson put the issue beyond doubt with a clever solo effort.
