Club Notes

IT seems incredible but to-day, 16th March, is the first time this year that our First Team has played at Kenilworth Road in a Football League fixture. Indeed the only other time our senior side has played here this year was on the occasion of the Cup Tie with Swindon Town when, after prodigious efforts had been made by players and staff to get the pitch ready for play, we lost on a carpet of ice. Swindon had had several matches under very similar conditions whereas our lads had been out of action since our match here on Boxing Day against Chelsea and undoubtedly this experience stood the Swindon lads in good stead that day. What with the general upheaval caused by the quite large fire damage to the Main Stand on the night of December 2nd, and the worst winter conditions within living memory when of course the water pipes, etc., fully exposed to these conditions as a result of the fire, suffered very badly with consequent inconvenience all round, added to which we had a complete power failure on the day of the Swindon match as well as a warning not to use the gas supply—it proved about the blackest day in the whole history of the Club. On top of all this the team is not doing well and whatever we try to do in whatever way, such as for instance signing new players, it all seems destined to disappointment. We even have now the unprecedented action of the sports writer of a national newspaper advising a player not to come to Luton—so where do we go from here? There can be the satisfaction that we must surely have reached rock bottom and that we can go only one way now, which is

upwards. Let us hope this is the position and that a win to-day will be the beginning of that upward trend.

Even a First team match here to-day was in great doubt, for our opponents were to be Middlesbrough, but they are engaged to-day in their Fourth Round F.A. Cup Tie with Leeds United. Huddersfield's opponents to-day should have been Southampton, but they are at home to Sheffield United in the Fifth Round of the F.A. Cup and so the opportunity has been taken to play the League fixture Luton Town v. Huddersfield to-day in place of the original date of 20th October last when that match was postponed because Huddersfield had two players, O'Grady and Wilson selected for International duty that day.

Our Reserve team brought off a most unexpected and very welcome and thrilling victory here last Saturday when they defeated top of the Table Arsenal Reserves by two clear goals, both splendidly taken by Robin Chandler. What a pity the weather was so bad, heavy rain all day, that a crowd of only 477 was here to witness it. Considering the day even this number was commendable and we would like to congratulate all of you who were here for your wonderful support. We are very glad you all witnessed a game to match your enthusiasm. Would that we had more like you.

It is with much regret that we here record the passing of Mr. Joe Collier, Honorary Treasurer of the Bobbers Stand Club since its inauguration in 1935. Each winter lately Mr. Collier had found the going very hard due to bronchial trouble and this one was no

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

R. Wood (goalkeeper). This England International, who began his career with Darlington, was in the 1957 Manchester United Wembley team, and, in the following year, survived the Munich air crash. Joined Huddersfield in December 1958, and missed only three of their next sixty-four matches. Began the present season with a career record of 296 League appearances.

Coddington (right back). Signed for Huddersfield in 1955 and has played in most of the defensive positions since joining the Club. Born in Worksop.

D. Atkins (right back). This Bradford born player became a regular choice last term, after figuring in four League games in the previous two seasons. Began his professional career with Town as a wing half.

Bettany (right half). Born in Sheffield. Signed in September 1960 as an inside forward. A very versatile player with experience of forward and half back positions.

K. Taylor (centre half). Possesses the interesting distinction of being first-ever Yorkshireman to have represented a First Division Football League club and to have played county championship cricket before reaching his 19th birthday. He gained it on his debut at Liverpool in March 1954, when he played centre half. Since then has played as a back, half back and forward. From the No. 9 spot he scored four goals against West Ham United at Leeds Road in February 1957. Local born.

P. Dinsdale (left half). This Bradford lad made a splendid recovery from a broken leg in his teens. League debut at Ipswich in the opening game of the 1959-60 season on the wing. After some games in the Central League side at left half his First team chance in the No. 6 spot came at Stoke on Christmas Eve, 1960.

K. McHale (outside right). On his League debut against Leyton Orient in August 1956 he was the youngest player

to have turned out for the club. He was 16 years, 328 days old. Completed a century of Second Division appearances before his 21st birthday in October 1960. Went into 1962-63 action with 193 League games and 36 goals to his credit.

L. White (inside right). Signed from Newcastle United in February 1962 in an exchange deal when Jim Kerray went to the Tynesiders. Began his career with Rotherham United in 1950-51, joining Newcastle during the 1952-53 season. Played in their Cup winning side of 1954-55 at outside right. Started 1962-63 with a career record of 164 goals in 302 League matches.

D. Stokes (centre forward). Huddersfield paid their record fee, estimated at £25,000, in an exchange deal with Bradford City in 1960. With City, Stokes scored 44 goals in 123 League matches covering three seasons. Has collected more than 30 on Huddersfield's behalf. Has headed a goal in the first match of each of his three seasons with Huddersfield.

L. Massie (inside left). One of the club's most experienced players, joined them from Banks o' Dee, an Aberdeen junior club in 1953 as an eighteen year old. Waited for his League chance until September 1st, 1956—at Fulham. Went into the present season with the credit of 74 League goals in 210 matches. Has also played in all three inside forward spots and at wing half.

J. C. Balderstone (inside left). Another local born cricketer - footballer. Made his debut—a scoring one, too—at Cardiff in March 1960, and took over at inside right from Law a fortnight later. A capped Yorkshire cricket colt.

M. O'Grady (outside left). An England Under 23 International, made his debut in a home game against Bristol Rovers in 1960. Leeds born, he established himself in the following season, when, despite injury, his matches totalled 23. Was absent on only four occasions in 1961-62.


