

Our Visitors

LUTON TOWN F.C. was formed in 1885 but did not achieve League status until 1897 when they were elected to Division II. Finishing next to the bottom in 1900 they did not apply for re-election again until 1920, when they joined the newly-formed Division III. In 1936 they had a good year, finishing second in the table to Coventry City. During that year, Luton supporters will remember centre-forward Joe Payne scoring ten goals against Bristol Rovers. In 1955 they won promotion to Division I, finishing runners-up to Birmingham City who had a superior goal average—both teams totalled 54 points. They reached the Cup Final in 1959, but lost to Nottingham Forest 1-2. Since that Cup Final appearance, the fortunes of our visitors have been somewhat on the decline, for they were subsequently relegated from Division I the following season and have since found the going in Division II a little tough. This game today is vital to both the *Rams* and the *Hatters*—both are placed close to the bottom of the table with 2 points separating them, so a win will be a great help to either team.

The following pen pictures are of the players from which today's team will be chosen.

RON BAYNHAM, *goalkeeper*. Has been with Luton Town since 1951, being secured from Southern League Club, Worcester City. Has represented England on several occasions, playing for the Football League on two occasions and also for England 'B' team v. Yugoslavia 'B'. Was a member of

the 1959 F.A. Touring Party to South America.

JOHN BRAMWELL, *full-back*. One of the two players who joined Luton from Everton when Billy Bingham, the Irish International was transferred to that club in October, 1960. A very capable player and worthy to be considered for International honours.

MATT BRENNAN, *inside-forward*. Signed from Scottish Club, Glasgow St. Roch last June on the recommendation of our old player, Dave Hutchison, our Scottish representative.

ROBIN CHANDLER, *centre-forward*. A local lad who made a name playing for his county youth team. Also holds England schoolboy caps. Made quite an impression at Ipswich last season in our Cup clash. Is apprenticed to a local firm.

ALAN CLARKE, *wing-half*. Another local lad who has played considerably well since he joined us as an amateur in the 1957-8 season. Signed as a part-time professional last October.

RON COPE, *centre-half*. Signed from Manchester United just before the opening of the 1961-2 season. Signed for them as an amateur in 1950, turning professional in 1951. Was an England schoolboy international. Made 150 appearances for Manchester United's First team.

ALAN DANIEL, *full-back*. A player of considerable promise who has had many games in the First team. Signed professional for Luton in January, 1958, when 18. Son of former Luton player, Mel Daniel.



MICHAEL FAIRCHILD, outside-right. Came to Luton from Lowestoft in November, 1960. Still only 19, a great future is forecast for this lad.

JAMES FLEMING, outside-left. Came to Luton from Partick Thistle when Joe McBride was transferred, in November 1960. A very capable player with a tremendous shot and good turn of speed.

JAMES GOLDIE, inside-forward. Signed in April 1962. His first game, against Arsenal Reserves, showed him to be a player of great potential.

JOHN GROVES, wing-half. Won Derbyshire schoolboy honours and was signed by Luton when only 15. Uses his height to great advantage and is a most accurate distributor of the ball.

FRED JARDINE, outside-left. Born in Edinburgh. Played for Dundee for two seasons before coming to Luton at the end of season 1960-1. Has shown much promise since he arrived here.

TERRY KELLY, centre-half. Born in Luton. Played for Hitchin Town before joining Luton, 1950. Originally played wing-half, but was successfully converted into a centre-half. A very strong player who holds his own with most centre-forwards.

L. KER, goalkeeper. An English schoolboy international who hails from Durham. The first apprentice player engaged by Luton, joining in the summer of 1960.

J. LORNIE, centre-forward. An Aberdonian, he arrived here from Leicester City whom he joined in 1958 as an inside-forward. Was converted to centre-forward in which position he played several times in the City First team.

A. McGUFFIE, wing-half or inside-forward. Signed professional forms for Luton in September, 1954. Has made numerous appearances in the First team since his demob from the Army. Is an excellent distributor of the ball with a flare for coming through to have a shot at goal.

T. McKECHNIE, inside-forward. Born Glasgow and came here direct from Rob Roy at the end of season 1960-1. Played consistently in the First team last season, making 36 appearances in League and Cup games.

B. McNALLY, full-back. Can occupy either full-back position. Came from the League of Ireland Club, Shelbourne and has been with Luton since May, 1956.

Played for Eire 'B' v. Rumania in Dublin in 1957 and also for Eire v. Czechoslovakia.

R. MORTON, wing-half or centre-forward. Local born, has been with the Club since 1948. Played for England 'B' v. Switzerland 'B' team, the Football Combination v. the Dutch XI (on two occasions) and also for the Football Association v. the Army. Was chosen as Reserve for England at Wembley in 1955 and again when they played Ireland in 1958. Usually a wing-half but has made numerous appearances at centre-forward.

D. PACEY, wing-half. Born in Luton, signed for the Club in 1956. Has played for the F.A. v. the R.A.F. and was also a member of the England Under-23 team against Germany and Italy. Very strong player with a liking for getting among the goalscorers.

B. REED, full-back. Secured season 1960-1, from Leicester City with whom he had been two seasons as a full-time professional. Previous to that he was on their books for five seasons as an amateur and part-time professional. Hails from Peterborough. A very methodical player.

G. RIDDICK, inside-forward. Turned professional April, 1961, following a short period of apprenticeship. Tall, with good ball control and a very good shot. Much is expected of this lad when he has gained more experience.

G. TURNER, centre- or inside-forward. Came to Luton as a wing-half upon his demob, from the Navy but found his true position in the forward line. Represented the English League v. the Scottish League in 1955 and also played for the F.A. XI v. the Army in 1958. The Town's leading goalscorer for eight seasons out of the last nine. Is a skilled player with a tremendous shot.

H. WALDEN, outside-right. Joined Luton from Kettering in January last year and stepped straight into the first team at Norwich, making 34 League and Cup appearances last season. Has a very forceful shot.

M. LOWNDS, left-half. Signed from Durham in January, 1960. Became a full-timer on completion of his apprenticeship with a local firm last season. Is a wing-half who never knows when he is beaten.

J. ROSE, goalkeeper. A young goalkeeper from Petershill F.C. Glasgow, who has already made a big impression. With a little more experience this lad will become a first-class goalkeeper.
