The Development Association is doing fine work for the club these days, and their gift is yet another tangible expression of their hard work on behalf of football at the Old Show Ground.

After today's game against Luton, for which the kick-off has been moved to the afternoon at the request of our visitors, who have a home game against Norwich City tomorrow, our seniors play their

return at Luton on Monday, when we hope to repeat last season's win.

On Tuesday our reserves have an away game against Rotherham United reserves, who have proved the outstanding North Regional League team of the season.

The next home game for the first team is against Leeds United in a rearranged fixture on Tuesday, April 23rd, for which the kick-off has been put back to 7-15 p.m., at the request of Leeds. This will enable Leeds to get their supporters to the ground.

Incidentally there have been many enquiries for seats for this game, and we would point out that advance bookings will be available from the club offices as from tonight.

All those who saw the game at Leeds were thrilled by the standard of football played by both teams, and if they put on a repeat performance at the Old Show Ground on Tuesday, April 23rd it should be a game worth watching.

OUR VISITORS

PEN Portraits of the players from whom Luton Town may pick their team for today's game are :-

Roy Baynham (Goalkeeper).

Has been with Luton Town since 1951. Secured from Southern League Club, Worcester City. He has represented England on several occasions. Played for the Football League on two occasions and also for England "B" Team versus Yugoslavia "B". Was a member of the F.A. Touring Party to South America in 1959.

John Bramwell (Full Back).

One of the two players who joined Luton from Everton when Billy Bingham, the Irish International was transferred to that club in October, 1960. Is a very capable player and worthy to be considered for International honours.

B. McNally (Full Back).

Can occupy either full back position. Came from the League of Ireland Club, Shelbourne and has

been with Luton since May, 1956. Played for Eire "B" versus Rumania in Dublin in 1957 and also for Eire versus Czechoslovakia

Alan Daniel (Full Back).

A player of considerable promise who has had many games in the First Team. Signed professional for Luton in January 1958, when 18. Son of Mel Daniel who played for us during and immediately after the war.

John Groves (Wing Half).

Won Derbyshire Schoolboy honours and was signed by Luton when only 15. Uses his height to great advantage and is a most accurate distributor of the ball.

Terry Kelly (Centre Half).

Born in Luton. Played for Hitchin Town before joining us in 1950. Originally played wing half, but was successfully converted into a centre half. A very strong player who holds his own with most centre forwards.

D. Pacey (Wing Half).

Born in Luton, signed for the club in 1956. Has played for the F.A. versus the R.A.F. and was also a member of the England Under 23 team against Germany and Italy. Very strong player with a liking for getting among the goalscorers.

H. Walden (Outside Right).

Joined Luton from Kettering in January last year and stepped straight into the first team at Norwich, making 34 League and Cup appearances last season. Has a very forceful shot.

A. McGuffie (Wing Half or Inside Forward).

Signed professional forms for Luton in September, 1954. Has made numerous appearances in the First team since his demob from the Army. Is an excellent distributor of the ball with a flare for coming through to have a shot at goal.

Ron Davies (Inside Forward).

Leading goalscorer. Signed from Chester, and has quickly settled

down in Second Division football. Well built, and a forceful shot.

G. Turner (Centre or Inside For'd)

Came to Luton as a wing half upon his demob from the Navy but found his true position in the forward line. Represented the English League versus the Scottish League in 1955 and also played for the F.A. XI versus the Army in 1958. The Town's leading goalscorer for eight seasons out of the last nine. Is a skilled player with a tremendous shot.

Fred Jardine (Outside Left).

Born in Edinburgh. Played for Dundee for two seasons before coming to Luton at the end of season 1960/61. Has shown much promise since he arrived here.

T. McKechnie (Inside Forward).

Born Glasgow and came here direct from Rob Roy at the end of 1960/61. Played consistently in the first team last season making 36 appearances in League and Cup.


