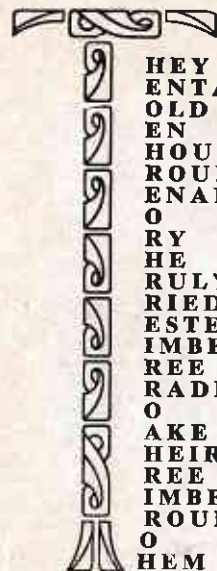

### Club Notes

WE have the pleasure of receiving Norwich City in this Easter Saturday fixture and feel we could not have chosen any better opponents even if we had any choice in the matter. The two battles we had with them four years ago when it meant that one of us would appear at Wembley for the first time in either of our histories still remain fresh in our minds. The Canaries, as they are called, have just missed appearing again in the Semi-finals of the F.A. Cup for after beating such great Cup fighting teams as Blackpool, Newcastle United and Manchester City, each one a splendid performance, they rather surprisingly succumbed at home to Leicester City by two clear goals. Well though Leicester City have been playing everybody expected Norwich to at least avoid defeat before their own crowd and in fact it was only as a result of two well-taken goals quite out of the blue following great pressure by their opponents that Leicester passed safely into the Semi-finals. Norwich had been playing so confidently during this period that they had also established a good position in the League Table and after their decisive win over Chelsea last Saturday by four goals to one there were great hopes at Carrow Road that promotion was still a possibility. Their defeat at Vetch Field last Tuesday evening however has practically killed any such aspirations. However the Norwich fans have had another splendid season of football, and although there will probably be some reaction after the fervour of these last few weeks nevertheless they can look back and remember with pride some very stirring encounters.

We picked up a very valuable point at Walsall last Saturday which, under the very trying conditions, was a good performance for any reward gained from an away match is commendable. We have had quite a few matches cancelled this season because of the snow and ice. If the Referee had declared this match cancelled also because of the very strong wind no one could have blamed him. Controlled and skilful football was entirely out of the question for passes very rarely went where intended, and even goal kicks were difficult to take because the ball would not stay put. To give you some idea of the strength of the wind any player facing it and attempting to make a run with the ball by kicking it forward found that it was not only being stopped by the wind but was coming back to him as if it was on a yo-yo string. When we crossed over at half-time on level pegging with the prospect of having to face this wind no one would have given us much chance of remaining so at the end of the match. That it was so gives great credit to the fighting spirit of our lads and in particular the splendid part played by Ron Baynham. We do not mean by this that all the defence did not play well but times out of number when all seemed lost the wearer of the No. 1 shirt emerged safely with the ball to prevent any further goals "against." On the whole a good all-round performance.

We trust our youngsters gave a good account of themselves yesterday afternoon in their South East Counties League fixture with Brighton. These lads do not often get the opportunity of playing at Kenilworth Road but one occurred yesterday and so it was arranged for them

## PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

**Sandy Kennon** (goalkeeper). Born in Johannesburg. Previous club Huddersfield (1956-59) from whom signed on month's trial February, 1959. At end of trial signed full time, making his first senior appearance in F.A. Cup sixth round replay v. Sheffield United at Carrow Road.

**Bryan Thurlow** (right back). Another local product. Born Loddon, signed professional forms for City, July, 1954, soon after 18th birthday. Came to the fore during the F.A. Cup run of 1958-59, went on F.A. tour of Far East and New Zealand 1961.

**Barry Butler** (full back). Born Stockton-on-Tees. Previous club was Sheffield Wednesday (1952-57). Signed for City, August, 1957. Record run of 208 successive League and Cup games ended last season when chosen for F.A. XI v. R.A.F. at Peterborough. F.A. XI won 13-0.

**Ollie Burton** (right half). Signed for Norwich from Newport County, March, 1961, for five figure fee when still only 19. Welsh schoolboy, youth and under-23 international. Came successfully into the League side last season.

**Ron Ashman** (centre half). Acting Manager and Skipper. Holder of City's long-service record, over 600 League and Cup appearances since signing in May, 1944. 56 goals mostly scored either at start of career at centre-forward or from penalty spot when moved to left half. Born Whittlesey.

**Joe Mullett** (left half). Born Blackheath, Birmingham. Played for Birmingham 1955-59, signed for Norwich January, 1959. Only five League appearances in first three seasons, but last season struck up wing-half partnership with Burton.

**Gerry Mannion** (outside right). Born Burtonwood, signed for a £12,000 fee from Wolves, August 1961. Toured East

Europe with England Under-23 party, 1960. In Wolves' F.A. Cup semi-final team, 1960.

**Terry Allcock** (inside or centre forward). Born Leeds. Previously with Bolton. Signed for Norwich, March 1958. Leading scorer for past three seasons including 1960-61 when out for more than three months with a broken leg. Plays cricket for Norfolk as wicketkeeper-batsman.

**Jim Conway** (centre forward). A Scot signed from Glasgow Celtic for five figure fee, April 1961, but did not make League debut for Norwich until 1961-62 season.

**Jimmy Hill** (inside left). Irish international. Born Carrickfergus. Previous clubs Linfield, Newcastle. Signed for Norwich as right-winger, June 1958, but converted to inside forward, in which position picked four times for Ireland.

**Bill Punton** (outside left). Scot from Aberfeldy. Wanted by City when playing for Newcastle, but had season with Southend before joining Canaries July 1959.

**Tommy Bryceland** (inside forward). Born Greenock. Played several seasons for St. Mirren during which time he gained a Scottish Cup winners medal. Joined City from that club early this season for a club record fee. Good ball player.

**Alistair Miller** (winger). Scot signed on free transfer from St. Mirren, May, 1962. Five seasons with St. Mirren, making 160 appearances with 55 goals. Scottish Cup medal 1959. Previously three seasons with Third Lanark, whom he joined from junior football.

**James Oliver** (outside or inside forward). Born near Falkirk and played for the Brockville Park club for several seasons. Can play in almost any forward position, but prefers right wing. Signed for City from Falkirk in August, 1962, for a four figure fee.

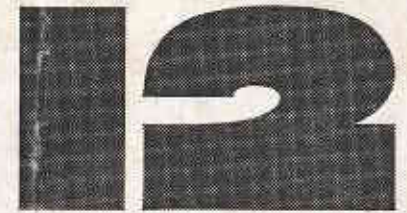
