

Club Notes

IT is hoped you have all had a very enjoyable Easter Holiday, and that the weather to-day has turned out to be just right for a good game of football with which to wind up the nice long break. These Notes were prepared last Thursday so that it was not known then (1) What the weather would be (a most important factor in a holiday) or (2) what the result of the two games we have played over the holiday have been. Certainly if the weather has been nice and we have been able to get ourselves off the bottom rung of the ladder all our supporters here to-day will look upon this Eastertide as a very happy one. We hope it is so.

Our visitors this afternoon, Scunthorpe United whom we welcome to Kenilworth Road, are a comparatively young Club, being Founded in 1912 as Scunthorpe and Linsey United. They were elected to the Football League with Shrewsbury Town when the Third Division, then divided North and South, was increased from 22 to 24 Clubs in each Division. In their first three seasons as Members of the Football League they finished half-way, but in the next two seasons 1953/54 and 1954/55 finished each time in third place. The next two seasons finished again in the middle of the Table but at the end of Season 1957/58 — the last season of the Third North and South (the Fourth Division being formed in 1958/59) — our visitors finished in top place and thus gained promotion to the

Second Division, which company they have since enjoyed. Last season they finished in fourth position.

We have now arranged a date for the playing of the Bedfordshire Professional Cup with Bedford Town. This will take place on Monday, 6th May, kick-off 7.15 p.m. We have had some exciting tussles in the past with Bedford Town in this Competition, and as our opponents have been showing improved form of late this should prove another worth seeing.

Other matches arranged on this ground other than those shown on page 11 are — Tuesday, May 7th kick-off 6.30 p.m. the Final Tie of the Bedfordshire Constabulary Cup, and on the following evening, May 8th kick-off 7.15 p.m. the Final Tie of the Luton and District and South Beds. League.

The last match which will be played on this ground this season will be on Saturday, 18th May when we have Ipswich Town Reserves as our visitors. Immediately after this match the pitch will be prepared for renovation.

Bingo Sessions are being resumed on Thursday, April 25th commencing at 8 p.m. They will be held in the Main Stand, which proved very popular last year. The same arrangements will be in operation, that is 2/6 admission to the Ground, and inside Playing Books will be on sale at 2/6 each. There is no restriction on the number of books each

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Ken Jones (goalkeeper). Former Welsh Under-23 International, who joined Scunthorpe from Cardiff City in 1959. Brilliant player, and considered to be well in the running for full International honours. Native of South Wales.

Harry Horstead (full back). Has also played well at centre half and wing half. Was for some time first team centre half, but eventually switched back to his original full back berth. Born at Brigg and came to Scunthorpe from Brigg Town.

Jack Brownsword (full back). Longest serving player, who has been with the club since 1947, and played more than 500 Football League games since Scunthorpe were admitted to the League in 1950. Born at Bentley, near Doncaster, and a former collier.

Mike Gannon (full back). Joined the club for a good fee in the close season from Everton, by whom he had been retained. Former England Youth International. Born in Liverpool and went straight to Everton on leaving school.

Archie Gibson (half back). A clever ball playing wing half back, who has proved a capable club captain. Joined Scunthorpe for a big fee three years ago from Leeds United. A native of Scotland.

Tom Passmoor (centre half). In his fourth season with Scunthorpe, and a great hearted defender of power and determination. Joined Scunthorpe from South Shields after a spell with Sunderland.

Ron Howells (half back). In his second season with Scunthorpe, whom he joined from Portsmouth. Former Welsh Under-23 International, who came to the front with Wolves.

Alan Anderson (half back). Close season capture from Millwall, being a regular player in the Lion's Fourth Division championship side last season. Big and powerfully built. Born in Edinburgh, and started his career with Falkirk.

Andy Wilson (wing forward). In his second season with Scunthorpe whom he joined from Sheffield United. Can play either wing, and had some good first team games last season. Born at Rotherham.

John Kaye (centre forward). Was originally an inside forward, but successfully converted to a centre forward when Scunthorpe sold Barrie Thomas to Newcastle last season. Strong and powerfully built, he joined Scunthorpe three years ago from Goole Town the Midland League club.

Brian Godfrey (inside forward). Gained a Welsh Under-23 International cap last season as result of consistent play with Scunthorpe. Signed three years ago as a wing forward replacement, but immediately settled down as an inside forward. Comes from Flint, North Wales, and joined Scunthorpe from Everton.

John McGuigan (inside forward). Had First Division experience with Newcastle United, whom he joined from Southend, moving to Scunthorpe as part of the deal which took Barrie Thomas to Newcastle last season. Was an immediate success at Scunthorpe as a goal scoring inside forward. A Scot from Motherwell.

Ken Hodgson (wing or inside forward). Joined Scunthorpe from Newcastle United last season and quickly developed as a useful utility forward, playing in all of the forward positions. Born at Newcastle.


