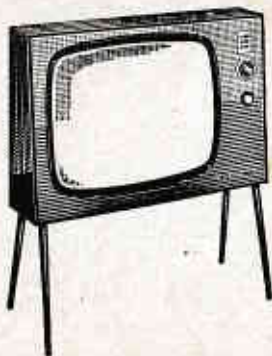

Club Notes

A splendid win last Saturday took us to third place from the bottom of the Table. Dare we hope for a further success to-night? Last evening both Walsall (away to Grimsby Town) and Charlton Athletic (away to Rotherham United) were playing, so that we shall know after this match this evening if we have been able to draw more into the safety zone. The three goals we scored last Saturday gladdened everybody's heart who saw them, first that cracker of a shot from Dave Pacey who showed he can still hit 'em. A well-taken goal which came just at the right time to put our lads on the right side for the interval. Mat Brennan's goal was indeed a beauty, well taken which showed a quick assessment of a situation. He has certainly fitted in well in the senior side since his promotion to the First team only last Wednesday. The Manager would have played this youngster earlier in the senior side but felt it unfair to do so as we were placed. However injuries forced him to change his views and we are pleased that Mat has grasped the chance with both hands. And then Ron Davies came along with his usual, fully deserved, to practically put the game beyond doubt. What an asset this lad has been to us this season. There is talk already of him being considered for the Welsh Under 23 side next season. He certainly has earned such thoughts. The inclusion of Danny Clapton after such a long lay-off was well justified for his experience helped the line to move with much better understanding. With the defence playing well and Ron Baynham on top form it was an all-round well deserved victory.

May it bring that confidence into the team which can make such a difference to a side.

We have Swansea Town as our opponents this evening in a League II fixture which should have been played Mid-February but the bad weather made the original date impossible to keep. Placed in the middle of the Table, no worries as to whether they are going up or down, Swansea are able to take this match in their stride. They rather surprisingly were held to a goalless draw at home to Portsmouth last Saturday, which gives us much hope for success this evening. The Swans have two "away" wins to their credit this season, at Derby by two clear goals and at Walsall by the only goal scored. Together with draws at Charlton, Chelsea, Middlesbrough and Portsmouth the eight points thus gained have proved most useful. It is interesting to note that whereas we have scored at home 38 goals "for" in the 18 matches played, Swansea have scored only 30 in the 20 matches at home, and our "away" record reads 16 "for" 39 "against" in the 19 matches whereas Swansea in 18 matches on opponents' grounds have scored 16 with 43 "against." Where they have the advantage over ourselves however is in the home "against" column where they have had only 13 scored against them (only Sunderland have conceded fewer goals at home in all the four Divisions) and we have had 35 scored against us. It is strange that they should have such a splendid home defensive record and yet concede so many on opponents' grounds. We hope to see a thrilling encounter with them this evening.
