

Club Notes

FOLLOWING our very good performance last Saturday when beating Charlton Athletic by such a decisive margin as four goals to one we this evening have another difficult hurdle in facing a Sunderland team flush with their magnificent win at Swansea last Saturday, a win which has made them odds-on promotion candidates with Stoke City. Our victory over Charlton almost certainly pushed them into relegation, and now it would seem that it is a battle between Walsall and ourselves as to who is to accompany them. This evening we take on Sunderland, tomorrow evening Walsall are at home to Norwich City, leaving us both with one match to play. What an intriguing position it is — and what a lot is going to be decided over the next few days. A win this evening would give us still a very good chance of remaining in the Second Division whereas if Sunderland lose their chances of promotion would be much impaired with Chelsea so very near to them and thus just waiting for them to make a slip. Last season Sunderland would have gained promotion if we had won or even only drawn our last match at home to Leyton Orient but they beat us against the run of the play by three goals to one and so Sunderland, with a better goal average than Leyton Orient, missed promotion by one point. And here we are twelve months later playing another important part in Sunderland's aspirations. We said in last Saturday's Programme that this match tonight would be a humdinger. It is going to be even more-so following last Saturday's results at Swansea and Chelsea.

We welcome the Sunderland Officials and players once again to Kenilworth Road, wondering how long it will be

before we have the pleasure of receiving them again. Known as 'The Team of all the Talents', a title bestowed on them by a President of the Football League when he visited Roker Park in 1894 and was amazed at the skill of each individual player as well as their skill in playing together as a team it is a title which has remained with them all these years. Although Sunderland were not one of the original twelve Clubs when the Football League was formed in 1888 it was only two years later when they became members and until 1958 they were the only Club who could boast they had never played outside the First Division. They now cannot boast that unique honour (we mean boast in the nicest sense) but the way they have been playing these last two seasons their return to the higher status cannot be much longer delayed. Certainly with their Ground facilities and potential they are a Club worthy of that status.

It was a most pleasing sight last Saturday to see Ron Davies continuing his goal scoring activities and to see also Gordon Turner once again amongst the goals. How Frank Reed the Charlton goalie saved Ron Davies' point blank shot at the Oak Road end we just do not know but it prevented Ron from registering a hat trick. What a difference this lad makes to our forward line when he is playing. Our defence played very well too, with John Bramwell taking on the role of wing half as if he had played there all his career, and it was also pleasing to see Ron Baynham back to his very best form. Never at any time during the match was there any fear that Charlton would repeat their amazing success which they enjoyed on their last visit here. J. Montgomery (goalkeeper). 5 ft. 11 ins. 11 st. 2 lbs. A local boy who is a Youth International. Brilliant display on getting into the first team late last season.

C. Nelson (right back). 5 ft. 9 ins. 11 st. 10 lbs. A local player who joined the club after asking for a trial. Quick in recovery with a sound temperament. He is a most reliable defender.

L. Ashurst (left back). 5 ft. 9 ins. 11 st. 4 lbs. Under 23 International. This Liverpool born player with a reputation for sound, determined play.

S. Anderson (right half). 5 ft. 9 ins. 11 st. 12 lbs. An Under 23 International and reserve on many occasions for the full England XI and now a full International who was in the England Party that went to South America in the World Cup Tournament.

C. Hurley (centre half). 6 ft. 1 in. 13 st. 10 lbs. This Eire born International has been the envy of many Clubs. Dominating in the air, very clever on the ground, now hitting his best form.

J. McNab (left half). 5 ft. 9 ins. 11 st. 7 lbs. A product of the Youth team, this young Scot, noted for his terrier-like tackling should go far in the game.
