Club Notes

OUR early-season hopes of being able to reach this match to-night, our fifth, without a defeat have not materialised, but until last Friday at Barnsley we felt we had done reasonable well in that our only defeat to that date was by an only goal at Crewe as a result of a very harsh penalty. We had played a one-goal-each draw at Reading on the Saturday following our visit to Crewe which showed us with three points from the three matches played, a point behind in our calculations, and until Barnsley scored in the 12th minute we were playing the better football and all looked well for us. A harmless looking clearance from the Barnsley defence when under pressure however left both Gordon Fincham and Dave Pacey seemingly both anxious to get the ball back into the attack and both went for it. The ball somehow evaded them both, and as luck would have it went straight to centre forward Leighton who must have been the most surprised man on the park when he found the ball at his feet. He simply went on having a clear run for goal, deceived Ron Baynham to go the wrong way, and there we were a goal down all against the run of the play. Gordon Riddick brought in at inside left at Barnsley to make the first change in the side scored a very well taken goal after further good work by Harry Walden who had an excellent game, and this goal brought hopes of our lads once more getting back as a force in the game but a further Barnsley goal four minutes later put paid to those hopes and thus we lost by the unexpected margin of three goals to one.

Thus we reach to-night's match showing only three points from the four matches

played, two points behind schedule, but hoping we shall get those two points this evening in our return mid-week battle with Crewe Alexandra. This is the first visit ever of Crewe Alexandra to Kenilworth Road, and so we extend to them a very hearty welcome. They are a Club which has not enjoyed much in the way of success in their long history which began as far back as 1876 when it was founded more or less as a winter adjunct of the cricket club. It is not generally known down in the South but Crewe Alexandra were one of the original members of Division Two of the Football League when the League was extended from one Division to two in 1892/93. They were not very successful and after four years they together with Port Vale and Rotherham United had to make way for Blackpool, Gainsborough Trinity and Walsall who were elected in their places. Crewe were re-elected to the League when the Third Division (North) was formed in 1921/22. Crewe continued as members of the Third Division until the Fourth Division was formed in 1958/59 which they had to join being bottom of the Third Division at the end of the previous season. After five years in this Division, however, they had the thrill of promotion for last season they finished in third place behind Brentford and Oldham Athletic and, together with Mansfield Town, rejoined the Third Division. We trust they enjoy a good season.

We have received such a demand for tickets for reserved seats for our match with Coventry City next Saturday here at Kenilworth Road that we have extended reservations to the whole Centre Stand. There are still a few tickets available at

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Geoff. Hickson (goalkeeper). Born Crewe. Started his professional career with Stoke City before joining his home town Club during the summer of 1962. Made his debut for the Club against York City on 29th August 1962, making 47 consecutive League, League Cup and F.A. Cup appearances last season. This years recipient of the Player of the Year Award by the Junior Supporters.

Dave Whelan (right back). Born Wigan. Joined the Gresty Road staff during the great freeze up last winter. Was made captain of the side and made 23 first team appearances. A player with a wealth of First Division experience and was a member of the Blackburn Rovers F.A. Cup team defeated by Wolves in 1960 and it was in this game that he sustained a broken leg.

Peter Leigh (left back). Born Altrincham. Now in his third season at Gresty Road after joining us from Manchester City. An ever present last season, had to the end of the 1962/63 season made 84 first team appearances. Although on the small side is a player of great ability.

Stan Keery (right half). Born Mansfield. Joined Crewe from Mansfield Town on 8th October 1958 and made his debut the same day against Bradford Park Avenue scoring one of the goals in that game. Originally an inside forward, has been converted to wing half with success. To the end of the 1962/63 season had made 205 first team appearances.

Eric Barnes (centre half). Now starting his sixth season as a professional after previous service as an amateur whilst serving with the R.A.F. Primarily a centre half but has on occasions occupied the full back berth. To the end of the 1962/63 season had played 171 first team games. Born Manchester.

Lestie Riggs (left half). Born Gillingham. Previously with Newport County and Bury from which Club he joined Crewe during last winter's freeze up, making 21 first team appearances. A consistent marksman from the penalty spot.

Barrie Wheatley (outside right). Born Sandbach, near Crewe. Started his football career with Liverpool before moving to Crewe in July 1957. Is the longest serving professional on the Club's books and has played in all forward positions with the exception of centre forward. To the end of the 1962/63 season had made 152 first team appearances.

Chris Riley (inside right). In his fifth season with the Club after previous service with Rhyl. Has played in over 100 first team games in the inside forward positions. Born Prestatyn.

Frank Lord (centre forward). Born Chadderton near Oldham. Now starting his third season on the Gresty Road staff. In his first season set up a few Club record with 34 goals in 48 games and last season almost matched it with 32 goals in 49 games. A very popular player.

Johnny King (inside left). Started his professional career with Crewe before moving to Stoke City in September 1953. From Stoke he moved to Cardiff City and after one Season with the Welsh Club rejoined the Crewe staff in June 1962. An ever present last Season and scorer of 17 goals. Born Wrenbury.

Ron Smith (outside left). Born Liverpool. Started his professional career with his home town Club before joining Bournemouth where he spent two seasons. Now in his third Season at Crewe having so far made 90 first team appearances.
