Club Notes

OUR match to-day with Coventry City brings back to mind the many sterling battles our two Clubs have fought over the years. Many a ding-dong struggle have we witnessed, and such names as the two Masons (no relation) Billy Frith, Snape, Simpson readily come to mind when we revive those battles in our memory. The great days were those particularly in Season 1933/34 when the City finished in second place in the Third Division (South) and we finished in 6th position; the following season Coventry finished in third position and we in fourth, and then the next season the City pipped us by one point to finish Champions of the Third (South) and so become members of the Second Division for the second time in their history. Coventry's first entry into the Football League was in 1919/20 upon the resumption of football after the First World War. The two Divisions were each increased from 20 to 22 Clubs, and Coventry, Gateshead, Rotherham United, Stoke City and West Ham United were elected to make up the number of Clubs, Glossop North End having resigned from the League after the war. The City were members of the Second Division from 1920 until 24/25 when they were relegated to the Third (South) where they stayed until their promotion to the Second Division as already described. Due to this success by the City our annual battle both at Highfield Road and Kenilworth Road did not take place, but it was only a temporary respite for the following season, 1936/37, we finished as Champions of the Third (South) and so resumed our battles with the City the following season in Division II. These continued until 1951/52 when the City,

finishing in bottom place but one, were back in the Third (South) the following season. We today resume the struggle, and with the City having begun the present season with enormous success, which has brought back a revival of support once lost, the stage is set for a real exciting match. We trust the best side wins.

As a matter of interest the last time our two teams met at Kenilworth Road was on Easter Monday, 14th April, 1952 when we won by two goals to one, the teams being:—

Luton—Streten; Dunne, Aherne; Morton Owen, Watkins; Shanks, Turner, Moore, Sexton and Mitchell.

Scorers—Sexton and Moore.

Coventry—Taylor; McDonnell, Mason; Dorman, Kirk, Cook; Warner, Jamieson, Brown, Lowrie and Lockhart.

Scorer—Jamieson.

Our last match at Coventry in a League encounter was played the following day, Tuesday, 15th April, when the City won by five goals to two. City fielded the same team, but we made two changes, Stobbart and Wyldes coming in for Sexton and Mitchell. Scorers for the City were Dorman (2) Lockhart (2) and Brown. Wyldes and Moore scored for Luton. Mr. W. Ling of Cambridge, refereed on both occasions.

Our match here last Wednesday evening against Crewe Alex. produced six goals all well taken, and if only we could have scored the extra one to ensure victory we feel sure the crowd would have been satisfied with the evenings entertainment. A goal up in four minutes was a real tonic, and it could have been two in ten if the ball had not risen sharply just as

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Robert William Wesson (Goalkeeper). Height 6 ft., weight 13 st. 11 lbs. Born in Thornaby-on-Tees, Yorkshire. Coventry City is his only Club. He has become number one goalkeeper during the 1962/1963 season playing in 45 league matches including a 23 game spell in which the team was unbeaten. His hobbies are photography and modelling planes.

John Charles Sillett (Right Back). Height 6 ft., weight 12 st. 7 lbs. Born in Southampton. He came to Coventry in 1962 transferred from Chelsea, his only other League Club. He has represented the English League against the Irish League. He is the brother of Peter Sillett England International full back and they made many appearances together in the First Division for Chelsea. His hobbies are golf and cricket.

Michael David Kearns (Left Back). Height 5 ft. 11 ins., weight 12 st. Born in Nuneaton. A player who graduated through local football to make 150 league appearances for Coventry City F.C. He has made over 30 appearances for the British Army XI at left back and was a member of their successful touring party of the Far East in 1962. His hobbies are golf and bowls.

Brian William Hill (Right Half). Height 5 ft. 8 ins., weight 12 st. Born in Bedworth, near Coventry. Formerly an inside forward he has now developed into a most useful wing half. Hobbies are tennis and weightlifting.

George William Curtis (Centre Half). Height 5 ft. 11 ins., weight 13 st. Born in Dover. Youth and Under 23 International. Four Youth matches against Spain, Ireland, Hungary and Denmark and one Under 23 cap against Holland. Also played for the R.A.F. team. Has over 300 league appearances for Coventry City. His hobbies are tennis and golf.

Ronald Farmer (Left Half or Inside Forward). Height 5 ft. 8 ins., weight 11 st. 12 lbs. Born in Guernsey, Channel Islands. He represented Guernsey Schoolboys against Jersey on two occasions. His hobbies are golf and fishing.

William Humphries (Outside Right). Height 5 ft. 4½ ins., weight 9 st. 12 lbs. Born in Belfast. Previously with Leeds United and Ards. Has gained 6 International Caps for Northern Ireland and has made 7 appearances for the Irish League. He has also to his credit 3 International Amateur Caps and one 'B' International Cap. He is a member of the present Irish International Team. His hobbies are cricket and golf.

Kenneth Hale (Inside Right). Height 5 ft. 7 ins., weight 11 st. Born in Blyth. A transfer from Newcastle United on December 15th last year for £10,000. His hobbies are fishing and tennis.

George Hudson (Centre Forward). Height 5 ft. 10 ins., weight 12 st. Transferred from Peterborough on April 3rd this year for a fee of £21,000 which is the largest amount ever paid by Coventry City for a player. Born in Manchester his previous clubs were Blackburn Rovers and Accrington Stanley. As a Schoolboy he represented the North Manchester Boys and played for Eintracht, Luneburg when on National Service. His hobbies are swimming and records.

Ernest Machin (Inside Left). Height 5 ft. 7 ins., weight 10 st. 5 lbs. Born at Little Hulton, near Bolton. He joined the Club from Nelson F.C. last year after being on the ground staff with Bolton.

Ronald Rees (Outside Left). Height 5 ft. 8 ins., weight 10 st. Born in Ystradgynlais, South Wales. He has represented the Birmingham County Youth Team and has gained 2 Under 23 International Caps for Wales. His hobbies are tennis and fishing.
