

Although Mondays local derby tended to become a bit one-sided after our first goal, I feel this was more a result of good play on our side than weakness on the part of the visitors, and congratulations to Roy Chapman on his hat-trick. County played as well as we allowed them and on the nights showing we were vastly superior in every department. I hope we shall confirm this when we go to Meadow Lane for the return a week next Thursday evening, kick off 7-30 p.m. I am sure we can also expect a good following of 'Stags Supporters' to swell the gate at Notts., and believe me the atmosphere of a full house such as we had on Monday, is a great encouragement to players to produce that little bit extra. In addition it adds to the general enjoyment of the game, whichever side you may support. I understand British Railways are to run a special train from Mansfield to Nottingham for this game and no doubt further details will be published well in advance.

On Wednesday next we go to Elland Road, Leeds, to play the Second Division Club in the 2nd Round of the Football League Cup. Kick off is at 7-30 p.m., and naturally we shall hope that as many of our supporters as possible will be there

to cheer us on. For those who may be going by car I would recommend them to follow the Bradford Road from Wakefield, turning right at the Angel Hotel which leads straight down to the Football Ground. This avoids going through the centre of Leeds.

Our Reserves met with their first defeat last Saturday against Norwich who thus took revenge for our win at Carrow Road, on the first day of the Season. It is unusual to find a score of 4-3 being registered simultaneously against both first team and reserves.

This afternoon we welcome Luton Town who are strangers to Field Mill, and you know they came down from Division II last season along with Walsall. Their slide from glory has been very swift for they were members of Division I until the end of the 1960 season and only the previous year they reached the Cup Final at Wembley losing 2-1 to our neighbours Nottingham Forest. In the side today we may be seeing Ex-Stag Jimmy Weir who was transferred to them at the beginning of this season, and at least Jimmy will be no stranger to Field Mill. At Centre-half is Gordon Fincham the Ex-Plymouth Argyle pivot whom we several times tried to bring to Field Mill.

Fortunately it was found to be nothing more serious than badly bruised nevertheless it will take a little time to recover.

It is understood that the indicators on the half-time scoreboard cannot be read very clearly from certain parts of the ground, especially at the Night Matches. This is being remedied by the addition of extra lighting which we hope will enable everyone to see the scores quite clearly.

LUTON TOWN.

Founded 1885 by amalgamation of 'Luton Wanderers' with 'Luton Excelsior'; first club in South to employ professional players; Southern League 1894-6; elected 1897 to League Division II; popularly known as 'the Hatters' or 'the Strawplaiters.'

Ground: Kenilworth Road, Luton, Bedfordshire. Record crowd: 28,433.

Colours: white shirts; black shorts.

Manager: Mr. Bill Harvey

League career: Division II 1897-1900, when failed to gain re-election. (Southern League 1900-15, 1919-20). Division III 1920-1; III (South) 1921-37. Division II 1937-9, 1946-55; Division I 1955-9. Have never been relegated.

Highest positions: 8th in Division I 1957-8; 10th 1955-6; runners-up Division II 1954-5; 3rd 1952-3;

Champions Division III (South) 1936-7 runners-up 1935-6. Lowest: 17th in Division III (South) 1924-5; bottom but one in Division II 1899-1900.

Most points: 58 out of 84, 1936-7. Least: 18 out of 68, 1899-1900.

Best scoring season: 1936-7, 103 goals in 42 matches.

Best defensive season: 1921-2, conceding 35 goals in 42 matches.

Highest League scores: 12-0 v. Bristol Rovers, 1935-6 (record for Division III, South); 10-2 v. Torquay United, 1933-4.

Most goals in League match: 10 by J. Payne v. Bristol Rovers, 1935-6 (League record).

Most in League season: 55 by J. Payne, 1936-7 (record for Division III, South). H. Billington, with 28 goals, was top scorer in Division II 1938-9; E. Simms, 28 goals, was top scorer in Division III (South) 1920-1; A. Rennie, 43 goals, was League top scorer 1928-9.

Notable transfers include L. Bookman from Bradford City, 1920; B. Streten from Shrewsbury Town, 1947; J. Pye from Wolverhampton Wanderers, 1952; S. Owen from Birmingham City, 1953; G. Cummins from Everton, 1953; A. Brown from Blackpool, 1957.

International players: *Period* 1885-1914: R. Hawkes (England). *Period* 1919-39: J. Payne, E. Simms (England) L. Bookman, A. Mathieson (Ireland). J. Elvey for England on 1920 Commonwealth Tour. *Period* 1946-58: R. Baynham, S. Owen, B. Streten (England); A. Brown, M. Cullen (Scotland) T. Aherne, R. Brennan, G. Cummins, S. Dunne (Ireland); I. LUTON TOWN F.C.

Ron Baynham. (Goalkeeper). Has been with Luton Town since 1951. Was secured from Worcester City. He has represented England on several occasions. Played for the Football League on 2 occasions and also for England 'B' Team versus Yugoslavia 'B.' Was a member of the F.A. Touring Team to South America in 1959.

Alan McBain. (Full-back). Born in Aberdeen. Played for Carlisle last season when he attracted the Manager's attention. Transferred to Luton in exchange for J. Lornie and A. Ross. A very sound and capable defender.

John Bramwell. (Full-back). Joined Luton in October 1960 from Everton and has proved a very capable player worthy to be considered for International honours. Played at Wing-half on several occasions last season, proving equally successful.

Bob Morton. (Wing-half). Local born and has been with the Club since 1948. Played for England 'B' once and The Football Combination versus the Dutch XI on 2 occasions. Also for the F.A. versus The Army. Was chosen as Reserve for England at Wembley in 1955 and again when they played Ireland in 1958. Has played in most positions for Luton.

Gordon Fincham. (Centre-half). Transferred from Leicester to Plymouth 4 years ago and then to Luton in July 1963. Is the dominating Centre-half we hope will strengthen our defence.

David Pacey. (Wing-half). Born in Luton, signed for the Club in 1956.

Has played for the F.A. versus the R.A.F. and was also a member of the England under 23 team against Germany and Italy. Very strong player with a liking for getting among the goalscorers.

Harry Walden. (Outside-Right). Joined Luton from Kettering in January 1961 and stepped straight into the First Team. Severely injured at a crucial part of last seasons programme which prevented him from taking any further part in the struggle against relegation. It is hoped he has lost none of his skill as a result of that injury.

Gordon Turner. (Centre or Inside-forward.) Came to Luton as a Wing-half upon his demob from the Navy but found his true position in the No. 8 shirt. Represented the English League against the Scottish League in 1955 and also played for the F.A. XI versus the Army in 1958. The Town's leading goalscorer for eight seasons, he is a skilled player with a tremendous shot.

Michael Fairchild. (Outside-right). Came to Luton from Lowestoft in November 1960. Can be brilliant at times which makes us have great hopes for the future.

Alwyn McGuffie. (Wing-half or Inside-forward). Signed Professional forms for Luton in September 1954. Has made quite a number of appearances in the First Team these last three seasons. Is an excellent distributor of the ball with a flare for coming through to have a shot at goal.

Jimmy Weir. (Outside-left). Transferred from Mansfield to Luton at the beginning of this Season. Previously with York City and Fulham. A Scot.


