Club Notes

THE "Bees" are our visitors to-day and we extend to them a very warm welcome on their first visit to Kenilworth Road since we met in a Second Division fixture in Season 1953/54, at the end of which Brentford found themselves bottom but one of the Table and so were relegated to the Third Division for the following season. Worst disaster was to follow for eight years later they were again bottom but one of their Division and were in the Fourth Division Season 1962/63, but it was only for the minimum period of one season for they finished Fourth Division Champions and were thus elevated to the Third Division for this season, bringing to a close the long downward trend which had begun really in 1946/47 when they were relegated from the First Division. New fund-raising schemes had been inaugurated last season and substantial money was spent on obtaining the services of such players as Irish International Billy McAdams, Scottish International John Dick and talented Mel Scott for the centre half position, to mention a few.

The visit of Brentford here to-day reminds us of that great Cup Series we played with them in February, 1952 when, after drawn matches first at Kenilworth Road (2 goals each) and at Brentford (no goals) we played the second Replay at Highbury on the following Monday, which was 18th February, the day of the sudden passing of H.M. King George VI. At the end of the normal ninety minutes the scores were level at two goals each, and it was beginning to look as if a further Re-play would have to be arranged when, with only eight minutes to go, Bob Morton

hit the ball with his left foot just outside the penalty box, and the moment he did so we all knew it was destined for the back of the net. It was a wonderful shot, beating Gaskell the "Bees" goalie all ends up, and which proved the winner to give us the right to meet Swindon Town in the Fifth Round. We duly beat them 3 goals to one, which took us into the Sixth Round and against the Arsenal. Although we lost that match by three goals to two we were certainly not disgraced for we fought magnificently despite the fact that Sid Owen was injured in the first half, and Roy Davies broke an ankle early in the second half. Our team, incidentally in that second Replay against Brentford that day at Highbury was Stretten; Cooke, Aherne; Morton, Hall Watkins; Davies, Taylor, Moore, Stobbart and Mitchell. Scorers Taylor, Moore, Morton. Brentford's team was — Gaskell; Horne, Munro; Harper, Greenwood, Hill; Monk, Coote, Dare, Sperrin and Ledgerton. Dare scored both goals.

Our lads did very well last Saturday when they held the Mansfield team to a 1-1 draw. Our goal was perhaps of the fortunate class, but before it was scored the Luton team had been getting more and more into the game, and in the end the Mansfield crowd were very glad to hear the final whistle. And last Wednesday evening we feel we can safely say we were rather unfortunate to be on the losing side at the end of the ninety minutes in our match with Coventry in the Second Round of the Football League Cup. In the opening stages we had practically all the play, and only a wonderful save by Wesson from a shot by Mark Lownds prevented

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Gerry Cakebread (goalkeeper). A knee injury kept Gerry out of the side for much of last season and ended a run of over 150 consecutive appearances. A part-time player who spends his days as a Civil Servant with the Admiralty, Cakebread was a former junior who has made more appearances—over 350—than any other keeper in the Club's history.

Ken Coote (right back and Captain). In his 15th season with his only professional club, having made a record number of over 500 appearances. Has been a model of consistency, whether appearing at wing half or full back, although he started as an inside forward.

Allan Jones (left back). Latest signing having been transferred last month from Liverpool for whom he had four First Division appearances last season. Only Welshman on books.

Willie Smith (right half). A close season signing from Glasgow Celtic who gave him a free transfer. A very clever distributor of the ball.

Mel Scott (centre half). Transferred last March for a five figure fee from Chelsea for whom he obtained England Under 23 international honours. A cool classy defender who always appears to have time to spare with his clearances, he scored the equaliser at Exeter which clinched the Fourth Division championship.

Matt Crowe (left half). A Scot who started out with Partick Thistle and found fame as a member of Norwich

City's famed Cup-fighting side. Joined Brentford in the 1962 close season and made 39 appearances last term.

Mike Block (outside right). Signed in January, 1962, from Chelsea, and although naturally left footed settled down splendidly at outside right. Scored eight League goals last season and netted a hat-trick of penalties in one Reserve game.

John Fielding (inside right). Signed by Brentford last March after having scored vital goal against them for Southport. Netted 3 times in 7 games and is equally at home on the wing.

Billy McAdams (centre forward). Capped 14 times by Ireland, he joined Brentford in the 1962 close season and played a big part in the promotion team with 22 goals in 34 games. Previously with Manchester City, Bolton Wanderers and Leeds United.

John Dick (inside left). Brentford's most expensive purchase, he became the Fourth Division's most highly-valued player when moving west across London from West Ham United in September, 1962. He proved his worth to become Club's leading scorer with 23 League goals. A Scottish international who is approaching his 200th League goal.

George McLeod (outside left). Another Scot who moved to Brentford in October 1958, from Luton Town; his dangerous crosses have led to many goals. Has often turned out at centre forward and has over 250 League games to his credit.
