Club Notes

TONIGHT we receive Bristol City in our last home mid-week League fixture before Christmas, leaving only one more to be played mid-week which is the return match with the City to be played at Ashton Gate next Tuesday evening. It is always a relief when these mid-week matches have all been played off, and particularly is this so when injuries have been prevalent. In our case for to-night for instance we have two wingers in Mike Fairchild and Freddy Jardine who could not be considered for selection and there are several players who received knocks last Saturday which have had to receive special attention to get them fit for to-night which would undoubtedly have been better if they could have continued treatment for a few more days before having to play again. These mid-week matches are however necessary if the full League programme is to be completed, and in this respect although we do not go into matches with a defeatist attitude we wonder if the fact that we came out of the Football League Cup at the first attempt was not after all a blessing in disguise. Certainly any Re-plays would have proved a great embarrassment.

We welcome the City to our Ground this evening, another of the teams we have not met since we left the Third Division in Season 1936/37. This does not mean to say that the City have remained in the Third Division all that time for they were promoted to the Second Division at the end of the 1954/55 Season, the season we were promoted to the First Division, and exactly the same five years we were members of that Division, Bristol City were members of the Second Division when, at the end of

the 1959/60 season they were relegated to the Third Division and we to the Second.

The City have had rather a chequered career since they were elected to the Second Division of the Football League in 1901. In 1905/06 they were Champions of that Division and so were promoted to the First Division, and in that first season in that company they finished in second place to Newcastle United. They never again reached such heights although holding their own until Season 1910/11 when they finished bottom place but one to Nottingham Forest and so accompanied them to the Second Division the following season. They had the honour during that period of appearing in the Cup Final, Season 1908/09 against Manchester United at Crystal Palace, only to be beaten by the only goal scored. They were also Semi-Finalists on two occasions. This season so far for them has been rather disappointing, but on Saturday last they accomplished what no other team has been able to do for eighteen months and that was to come away from Dean Court, Bournemouth with both points in the bag. According to all accounts it was a well-deserved win, so we shall have to be on our toes this evening to prevent them enjoying their second away win in such a short time.

We should have come away from Watford last Saturday with at least a point, for until half time we feel we were the better side and were most unlucky not to have opened the scoring on three occasions when, before Watford had opened their scoring with a very chancey shot, Tom McKechnie had hit

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Mike Gibson (goalkeeper). Born Derby, was signed in April 1963 from Shrewsbury Town, with whom he played for three seasons. Was previously with Gresley Rovers and Nuneaton Borough.

Alec Briggs (right back). Born Sheffield. Signed professional forms in April 1957 after one season with Colts XI. Made 4 Second Division appearances in first season and has been ever present last two seasons.

Mike Thresher (left back). Born in Bradninch, Devon, was signed from Chard Town in 1954, and converted from inside left to full back, appearing in 22 matches in promotion team 1954/55. Made 213 Second Division appearances in five seasons and 140 First Team appearances in last three seasons.

Gordon Parr (centre or wing half). Bristol born. Signed as part time professional in February 1957 while on engineering apprenticeship. Delayed entrant to National Service which did not finish until October 1962, but has since signed as full time professional. Tall and strong in his tackle has already appeared in League side.

John Connor (centre half). Born Maryport, Cumberland. Was transferred from Huddersfield Town in October 1960, with whom he played 8 seasons. 90 First Team appearances to date.

Gordon Low (left half). Scotsman from Aberdeen, only previous Club Huddersfield Town, whose transfer was secured in March 1961. Has made 37 First Team appearances.

Jantzen Derrick (wing forward). Bristol boy, played with Clark in Schools' Trophy winning Bristol Boys' team 1957/58. Debut in Second Division six weeks prior to 17th birthday. Took part in F.A. Youth trial. Has made 112 League and Cup appearances.

Brian Clark (inside right). Bristol born. Was captain of successful Bristol Boys' team 1957/58 and with Jantzen Derrick joined ground staff on leaving school. Has progressed through City Junior sides and made League debut April 1961. Scored 26 goals in 47 First Team appearances last Season.

John Atyeo (inside right or centre forward). Born Dilton, Westbury. First signed for Bristol City in June 1951. Capped against Brazil, Sweden, Spain, Denmark and Eire. Leading goal scorer over a number of seasons, has made 278 Third Division (135 goals) and 200 Second Division (115 goals) appearances. In all has appeared in 514 League, F.A. Cup, Football League Cup and Club representatives games and scored 296 goals.

Bob Williams (inside left). Ex-Bristol schoolboy player, is Bristol born and a product of City Junior sides. Signed professional May 1958 and made First Team debut 1959/60 season. Has made 128 League appearances and scored 51 goals.

Alex Tait (centre or wing forward). Born Bodmington, Northumberland. After six seasons with Newcastle United, has just completed third season with Bristol City, having played in 123 First Team matches and scored 43 goals. A schoolmaster who has specialised in Physical Education after a course at Loughborough College.
