Club Notes

I feel sure all our supporters will join with us and congratulate our lads on their victory at Bridgwater last Saturday. Now that they have broken the ice so to speak by gaining that long awaited "Away" win, we hope they will keep it up and gain further victories on our opponents grounds. In the Second Round we have been favoured with a Home tie, against Reading, against whom we made a 1-1 draw at Elm Park on the 24th August last. Gareth Salisbury being our goalscorer. By coincidence, our next home game in the League after today, is also against Reading, this being due on 21st December, just 14 days after the Cup Tie on 7th December. Tickets for the Cup Match are now on sale at the Office, price 7/6 each, these being for Reserved Seats. Applications can be made either by person or by post. If by the latter method, please send a stamped addressed envelope. Season Ticket Holders will be able to obtain their own seats for this game by applying up to Wednesday, 4th December. When making application please let us have the **PINK** slip from your Season Ticket Book marked **ROUND 2**. Admission to other parts of the Ground will be by payment at the Turnstiles on the day of the match. Normal prices for a First Team match will apply, viz: — Enclosure 5/-, Bobbers Stand 4/- and Ground Terrace 3/-, with Children paying half price to these parts.

Today we welcome once more, our friends from Queens Park Rangers, and we shall no doubt be hearing their rallying cry from their supporters, "up the R's." They were founded in the

same year as Luton Town, 1885, by the Rev. Gordon Young and became a professional Club in 1898. They graced the Southern League from 1899 to 1920 from whence they became one of the original members of the League, Division 3. Their ground at Loftus Road, whilst not being very spacious is very similar to Kenilworth Road, has housed a record crowd of 30,564 and this was against Luton in the F.A. Cup on February 7th, 1948. They also gained promotion to the Second Division in 1948 but returned to the Third Division (South) in 1952. Ron Springett who has represented England on a number of occasions, played for the Rangers before going to Sheffield Wednesday and at present his younger brother Peter is between the "sticks" for them. This has been a rapid rise for Peter, for as recently as last season he played in their Youth team against Luton at Stockingstone Road. The experts tip a very bright future for this lad who hopes one day he will follow his brother into the England side. Other notable players in their side are the brothers Pat and Ray Brady, Dick Whittaker and Stuart Leary, who very nearly signed for Luton last season, but decided finally to throw in his lot with Rangers. Mark Lazarus is again wearing their colours after having a spell with Wolverhampton Wanderers.

On Monday next we are to have a visit from a team from Germany and this we hope will prove to be a very good attraction. The team is Kaiserslautern who play in the South-West Region League and at present hold 7th position in a League of 20 Clubs. They include

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Peter Springett (goalkeeper). Younger brother of the former England goalkeeper Ron Springett, Peter has been tipped to follow in his brother's shoes.

Pat Brady (full back). Native of Dublin. He signed for Q.P.R. in the close season from London neighbours, Millwall. Was discovered playing football for Home Farm, the Dublin club which has produced many famous players, including Johnny Carey. Made 120 first team appearances for Millwall in five seasons.

Peter Angell (full back). Longest serving member of the club, he was signed from Slough 12 years ago. Born at Chalvey, Bucks. he has made more than 400 first team appearances and is a penalty expert.

Andy Malcolm (right half). Signed from Chelsea last season. Previously with West Ham United. Joined the Chelsea club in a player-exchange deal which took Ron Tindall to Upton Park. A tough tackling defender with considerable League experience.

Ray Brady (centre half). Brother of full back, Pat, and was signed as a full back from Transport F.C., the Irish club, but switched to centre half and soon commanded a first team place for Millwall. Captained the "Lions" last season and was watched by the Eire selectors. Joined Q.P.R. during the close season.

Mike Keen (right half). Tall and stylish player who signed for Q.P.R. as an amateur six years ago. Turned professional, July, 1958 and has been watched many times by First Division scouts. Has also played at inside forward.

Mark Lazarus (outside right). Q.P.R. received their record fee when they transferred him to Wolves in 1961-62. Five months later they paid a record fee to get him back. Thrustful goalscoring winger on either flank, he began his career with Leyton Orient and first signed for Rangers in September, 1960.

Stuart Leary (inside forward). This cricketer-footballer was signed from Charlton Athletic last December. A native of South Africa, he was a first team regular with Charlton for many years. Also a splendid right handed batsman, leg spinner and superb close fieldsman for Kent, for whom he hit over 1,300 runs last summer. Played in the first-ever England Under 23 side.

Brian Bedford (centre forward). Rated a bargain buy when secured from Bournemouth in 1959-60. Set club goal scoring record with 38 first team goals in 1961-62, having equalled it the previous season. Born in South Wales.

Malcolm Graham (inside left). Formerly with Barnsley and Bristol City, he was signed during last summer from Leyton Orient. Strong type of inside forward with a powerful shot. He played an important part in Leyton Orient's promotion to the First Division in 1961-62.

Terry McQuade (outside left). He is Q.P.R.'s third summer signing from Millwall. He joined the New Cross club from amateur side, Enfield Town and almost immediately gained a first team place. Another with a powerful shot in either foot.
