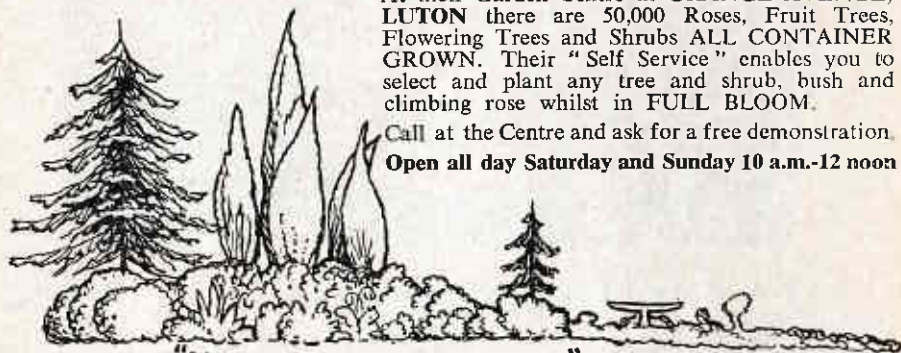

Club Notes

MAYBE, the "silly season" has descended upon us prematurely or, maybe, the fact that there has been little racing this week which has left wide open spaces, but half of the National newspapers have been attempting to put football to rights in their own inimitable way.

They must know, as do we, that all their lobbying for super Leagues and 30 or 40 clubs on the scrapheap has little substance in reality although, of course, in the future, there may have to be some trimming of the present set-up.

But in all their planning, they have completely overlooked the fact that this club, despite the fact that they have fallen from grace so far as results on the field are concerned, were probably the first to advocate the necessity for more spectator comfort.

As long as four years ago, we envisaged a completely new, modern stadium for which we have a readymade site waiting and have been held up in our plans only by the fact that planning permission has been denied us so far.

This we expect to receive in the not too distant future and, when that happens, we are committed by a unanimous decision of the Board to provide a stadium with accommodation for 50,000 with car park facilities for all

who require them and easy access from both Luton and Dunstable and from the M.I Motorway, within two years.

This is not fiction, but solid fact and we regard the building of a new stadium as the first requirement to our climb back to the pinnacle on which we were some five years ago. Maybe, when this becomes an accomplished fact, the amateur planners of the game will have a different story to tell because, if, or rather when, our plans materialise, we shall have a ground second to none.

Today, we welcome Reading whom we meet for the third time this season and whom we dismissed from the F.A. Cup after a tremendous battle a fortnight ago.

After our disappointing display at Walsall last Saturday, we badly need both points from this encounter, but know only too well that it will be a hard fight.

However, we hope that, the changes that have brought about completely new forward line, including two players who will be making their debut before the home crowd, John Reid and John O'Rourke, will enable us to finish on the winning end.

While we applaud enthusiasm for the team and, indeed, would like to see a good deal more of it, we do wish to

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Arthur Wilkie (goalkeeper). Joined the Club's ground staff on November 11th, 1958 as an amateur player and signed as a professional player on October 8th, 1959. Reserve for England F.A. Youth XI that toured Germany in January 1959. Born Woolwich.

John Walker (full back). Captain of the Club. An experienced player who was transferred from Southampton on December 12th, 1957. He assisted Southampton for five seasons and was previously with Wolverhampton for a similar period. Born in Glasgow.

Colin Meldrum (full back). Born in Glasgow. Joined our Club on April 4th, 1963, when he was transferred from Watford. Prior to joining the Hertfordshire Club, Colin assisted Arsenal for two seasons.

Maurice Evans (left half). Born Didcot. Now in his twelfth season with our Club. Joined the ground staff in September 1952 and signed as a professional player a year later. Played in many Representative matches for the Royal Air Force.
