

Club Notes

WHILE, naturally, there has been some disappointment among supporters that we have not been able to sign new players to aid our fight against the ogre of relegation, we would point out that it has not been for the want of trying.

In the last three weeks, the aggregate of miles travelled by Directors, manager and scouts runs into some thousands and there has been only disappointment at the end of it so far.

However, when the search first became intensified, we did underline that we would not be panicked into buying until we were absolutely certain that the players we saw would be able to help us in our present extremity.

In our financial position, buying merely for the sake of buying, would be disastrous and, although many players are on offer, there has been no indication yet in most of our travels that the ones seen are those to help us out.

Last weekend's trip to Scotland ended disappointingly but, last night, a contingent from the club was at Walsall to have a final check on George Meek, a winger who has always caused us a good deal of difficulty when he was with Leeds United. It may well have proved that he is the player needed to solve that long-standing left wing problem which, so far, has defied solution.

To some extent, the urgency of the search has been modified by the improvement shown by the team these last weeks and it would have been lessened even more had they gained the reward to which their play entitled them at Bournemouth last Saturday. There was general agreement, even among Bournemouth officials, that we should not have

lost but, unfortunately, scoring chances which might well have been taken in other circumstances, were allowed to slip by, with disastrous consequences.

Today's visitors, Hull City, we welcome as old friends of the post-war era in the Second Division. Managed by the former England and Everton star, Cliff Britton, who afterwards was manager at Goodison Park, and of Preston North End, they are in the somewhat unusual and enviable position, of having plenty of money to spare for new players.

However, Cliff, wise in football knowledge, has refused to be stampeded into buying big names who might not fit in with his scheme of things. Instead, he prefers to build quietly for the future in the hope that, in time, he will be able to cash in wholly on the vast potential of support in the Hull area.

Potentially, Hull are capable of great things, but success does not come quickly and it may well be that Cliff's patience, unpopular approach though it may have been locally, will pay off sooner than is expected.

Meanwhile, this season, we have been having a glimpse into what we hope is a more successful future through the accomplishments of our youth team.

In visiting Stoke in the fourth Round of the F.A. Youth Cup on Wednesday evening, we expected a tough struggle for survival and were more than satisfied that the team earned a 2-2 draw.

Replay will be at Kenilworth Road on Wednesday week, kick-off 7.30 p.m., and if this match is as good as the first meeting at the Victoria Ground, then the fans will certainly have value for their money.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Maurice Swan (goalkeeper). Born in Dublin was transferred to Hull City during the close season from Cardiff City having been with the Ninian Park Club for three seasons. A very capable keeper.

Andy Davidson (full back). Captain of the team. A perfect example of a good club man 'Jock' as he is known locally joined the club in 1948. Despite suffering broken legs on three occasions Jock has fought his way back to fitness and still remains a fearless defender. Born at Douglas Water, Lanarkshire. Has made over 500 1st XI appearances for his club.

Dennis Butler (full back). Signed for Hull City from Chelsea in July 1963. Has the reputation for strong work in defence and for starting attacking moves. His speed of recovery, if needed, is one of his strong points.

Len Sharpe (half back). Transferred from Scunthorpe United in 1962. Has filled the full back positions when needed with the skill and determination he uses as a half back.

Mike Milner (centre half). Recently signed as full time professional after serving the club since 1955 as an amateur and part time professional. A strong determined young player Mike made six 1st XI appearances last season and underlined his potential.

Chris Simpkin (half back). Like many of his team mates came to prominence

through City's Junior sides. Local born, signed full time professional last year after serving as an apprentice professional. Has also operated at forward. Tenacious and strong.

Chris Chilton (outside right). Still only 20 Chris has 3 full seasons of League football behind him and is always prominent in the Tigers goal scoring records. Many clubs have shown interest in this young player. Well built, a natural intelligence to "read" a game, coupled with his great ability gives the Tigers a fine player.

Billy Wilkinson (inside right). Born at Stockton-on-Tees, signed professional after trials with the club. At either centre forward or inside forward this teenager is showing great promise.

Ron Rafferty (centre forward). Signed in July from Grimsby Town where he had considerable success. A hard hitting forward with a strong shot.

Ray Henderson (inside left). Signed from Middlesbrough in June 1961. An intelligent positional player who can make the best of a half-chance.

John McSeveney (outside left). Has become an established favourite with the Boothferry Park fans since joining Hull City from Newport County in 1961. Has played in a number of positions in the team, including goalkeeper when necessary. City's leading scorer last season with 22 goals — from the wing.
