

County Chatter

Good evening, ladies and gentlemen, and may we take this opportunity of wishing you all a very happy Easter.

We extend a warm welcome to "The Hatters" from Luton, and thank them for their co-operation in re-arranging this match for tonight.

Like ourselves they are deep in trouble at the wrong end of our Division, and will be fighting very hard this evening.

Among their ranks are such notable performers as England International goalkeeper Ron Bayham, and inside-forwards Gordon Turner and John Reid. The next visitors to this ground will be Barnsley, who appear here on Saturday next, 28th March, kick-off 3 p.m. Once again they are a club situated in the relegation area. Yes, this Easter holiday period could solve several of the relegation and promotion struggles up and down the country, and one might say that this is our last chance of survival in the Third Division.

Barnsley, of course, have always been noted for their fighting spirit, and have several useful players on their books, notably left full-back Eric Brookes, a former England Youth International, outside-left Eddie O'Hara, and centre-forward Tony Leighton, their leading scorer. On Monday next our Reserves will be at home to Luton Town Reserves, kick-off 3 p.m. Incidentally, this is the only first-class match in Nottingham on this day.

The County Cup Final, versus neighbours Nottingham Forest, has been arranged for Tuesday, April 14th, kick-off 7.30 p.m. on this ground.

Usual prices of admission with the exception of the Grandstand, which will be 5/- to all parts. All seats for this match will be unreserved. The First XI were decidedly beaten at Roots Hall by three goals to one. Southend including many newcomers to the team this season were much more together, and carried far too much craft and experience for County.

The ground, considering adverse weather conditions, was in fine shape, and was ideally suited for good football as proved by the Southend team.

We conceded two goals in eight minutes; rather a heavy handicap to overcome, particularly against a team playing with such confidence and skill as United. A good goal scored by Edwards from clever work by Fry looked likely to give us a chance to have the game, but this was not to be.

LUTON TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB

BAYNHAM, Ron (goalkeeper). Has been with Luton Town since 1951. Was secured from Worcester City. He has represented England on several occasions. Played for the Football League on two occasions.

BRAMWELL, John (full-back). Joined Luton in October 1960 from Everton and has proved a very capable player worthy to be considered for International honours.

CALEB, Graham (centre-half). This youngster signed as an apprentice footballer for us in December 1961, although he has three "A" levels. Settled down very well and showed such promise that he was offered full professional registration in April 1963.

McGUFFIE, Alwyn (wing-half or inside-forward). Signed professional forms for Luton in September 1954. Has made quite a number of appearances in the First Team these last three seasons. Is an excellent distributor of the ball with a flair for coming through to have a shot at goal.

MORTON, Bob (wing-half). Local born and has been with the club since 1948. Played for England "B" once and the Football Combination versus the Dutch XI on two occasions. Also for the F.A. versus the Army. Was chosen as Reserve for England at Wembley in 1955 and again when they played Ireland in 1958. Has played in most positions for Luton.

PACEY, David (wing-half). Born in Luton, signed for the club in 1956. Has played for the F.A. versus the R.A.F. and was also a member of the England Under-23 team against Germany and Italy. Very strong player with a liking for getting among the goalscorers.

TURNER, Gordon (centre- or inside-forward). Came to Luton as a wing-half upon his demob from the Navy but found his true position in the No. 8 shirt. Represented the English League against the Scottish League in 1955 and also played for the F.A. XI versus the Army in 1958. The Town's leading goalscorer for eight seasons, he is a skilled player with a tremendous shot.

WALDEN, Harry (outside-right). Joined Luton from Kettering in January 1961 and stepped straight into the First Team. Severely injured at a crucial part of last season's programme which prevented him from taking any further part in the struggle against relegation. It is hoped he has lost none of his skill as a result of that injury.


