

## EDITORIAL

Today we bring down the curtain on still another season; and in retrospect we may allow ourselves to look and see how we have fared.

We will finish up around seventh or eighth position in the league, which must be considered very satisfactory indeed in our first season after promotion, prior to the season if we could have forecast this everyone would have been happy, for it is a recognised fact that on entry to a higher sphere, consolidation is of primary importance.

Offset against this is the undoubtedly fact that at one stage in the season we looked like going up into the second division at the first attempt, so good was our start to the season.

Then came the injuries, and loss of form and the resultant bad patch which put paid to any hope of promotion.

The most serious thing about this bad patch was the tremendous drop in gates that it brought, and from an average of about 16,000 they dropped to an average of 7,000. Coventry in a similar position pulled in gates of over 20,000 even after a spell worse than ours.

The success of any club depends of its support through the turnstiles and if a club is solvent during a bad spell, it can always pull out of it because of the reserves it is able to build up during the good times when gates are always high. In the latter stage of the season we came back to something like form, the signing of Bobby Craig was a good stroke of business, and the introduction of some of the youngsters proves that these will be knocking at the door next season.

It has also helped the manager in getting to know the positions he will be able to fill from his present staff and the positions he will have to strengthen.

All in all, we have every reason to be satisfied with the season's work, and feel that with one or two positions filled we can look forward to next season with confidence.



## PEN PICTURES OF LUTON TOWN A.F.C.

RON BAYNHAM (Goalkeeper) 6ft, 1in., 12st. 9lbs. Born in Birmingham. He has been with the club since 1951, when he was secured from Worcester City. He has represented England on several occasions.

ALAN McBAIN (Right Back) 5ft. 8ins., 11st 3lbs. Born in Aberdeen. He played for Carlisle last season when he attracted the manager's attention. He has also had experience with Swansea Town. A very sound and capable defender.

JOHN BRAMWELL (Left Back) 6ft., 12st. 13lbs. Born in Wigan. Joined Luton in October from Everton and has proved a very capable player worthy to be considered for International honours. He played at wing half on several occasions last season.

DAVID PACEY (Right Half) 5ft. 10ins., 11st. 7lbs. Born at Luton. Signed for the club in 1956. He has been a member of the England under-23's team against Germany and Italy. A very strong player with a liking for getting among the goalscorers.

GORDON FINCHAM (Centre Half) He was transferred from Leicester to Plymouth 4 years ago and then to Luton in July, 1963. He is a dominating centre half.

MARK LOWNDS (Left Half) 5ft. 10ins., 12st. 6lbs. Born in Sunderland. Signed from Durham in January, 1960. He became a full-timer on completion of his apprenticeship with a local firm.

HARRY WALDEN (Outside Right) 5ft. 9ins., 12st. Born at Walgrave. Joined Luton from Kettering in January, 1961 and stepped straight into the first team. He was severely injured at a crucial stage of last season's battle against relegation, but he has now fully recovered.

THOMAS McKECHNIE (Inside Right) 5ft., 12st. 6lbs. Born at Milngavie. Came direct from Scotland in 1961 and has played consistently in the first team the past two seasons, except when injury prevented him from playing.

JOHN O'ROURKE (Centre Forward) Formerly an Arsenal amateur, he signed professional for Chelsea in 1962, but he never played in the league for them. He joined Luton on a free transfer last December and has scored 19 goals in 20 games.

JOHN REID (Inside Left) Formerly played with Hamilton Academicals, Bradford City and Northampton from where he was signed in November last for a fee of £13,000.

RAY WHITTAKER (Outside Left) Signed from Arsenal in March and made his league debut 3 days later. An England Youth International, he is the seventh player to fill the left wing spot this season.




JOHNNY BURDESS


