Supporters are asked to note that there is a new licensed bar under the Grand Stand which will be open at all matches this season.

Club Notes

IN most encouraging style, the season has begun for us and the 3-1 win over Colchester on Wednesday gives us three points out of four and a chance to be near the top of the Third Division table should the team triumph again this afternoon.

There was drama before Wednesday's game because just over an hour before kick-off time, there seemed little hope that David Pleat would be signed in time to make his debut.

Then, things happened quickly, his parents contacted us and the transfer which had been hanging fire for the best part of 36 hours, went through.

So, he became a much-needed reinforcement because the injury to John O'Rourke, combined with the fact that Billy Hails was still unfit, put us in a spot so far as the forward line was concerned.

Pleat made an auspicious first appearance and his form suggested that he will be an invaluable acquisition, either at outside-right, or at inside-forward which is the position which Manager Bill Harvey envisaged for him when he went to Nottingham Forest for the second time in order to try to effect the transfer.

This signing has increased the cover for the front line and also means that there will be increased competition for places which is always a healthy thing.

Encouraging was the fact that the mid-week attendance was exactly 900 up on the first match of last season which was on a Saturday and we hope to be in the five figure zone when Bristol Rovers supply attractive opposition this afternoon.

After the team's bright start, it will be a disappointment if this does not prove to be the case, especially as it is hoped that John O'Rourke's ankle injury will have cleared up sufficiently for him to return to the team. O'Rourke's scoring feats have caught the imagination of a wider public than that in Luton and he has become an established favourite with the loyal fans.

Rovers, who lost their Second Division place a season before we did, have made a similar sort of start, beating Mansfield at home last Saturday and returning with a hard won point from Grimsby on Tuesday.

That adds up to very useful form and they are a team who are always difficult to beat, though our record against them on this ground is very good.

In the main, Rovers have built their team from their own resources and although they made a couple of signings during the close season, their team is that which represented them in the majority of their home matches last season.

One personality is Alfie Biggs, now in his second spell at Bristol where he preferred to return after a stay with Preston North End. At that time, we were keen to sign him and, in fact, had agreed transfer terms with the Lancashire club, but he chose to return to the West country. Since then, he has established himself as the Rovers' leading scorer.

Considering the relative inexperience of the forward line, it was a good performance by the Reserves to take two points from their first match of the season when they beat the Rovers' second string 3-0 last Saturday.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Bernard Hall (goalkeeper). Born at Bath, July 1942. Signed as a part-time professional in September 1959 after serving as an amateur for a year. Completed an apprenticeship as a stonemason, and signed as a full-time professional in July 1963. An ever-present last season, at 22 Bernard is the oldest of Rovers' three young 'keepers.

Roy McCrohan (right back). Joined Rovers from Colchester in August 1964. Born in Reading, played for Reading Schools and signed as a professional for his home town Club in 1949. Transferred to Norwich City, June 1951, where he spent 11 years, making 436 appearances and filling eight positions. Moved to Colchester in October 1963. Roy has played well over 500 League and Cup games, and is also a fully qualified F.A. Coach.

Gwyn Jones (left back). Welsh Under-23 International. Born Caernarvon. Transferred from Wolverhampton Wanderers in July 1962 after seven years' sterling service with the famous Midland Club.

Terry Oldfield (right half). A six-footer, weighing over 12 stones, Terry was originally an inside forward, but eventually made his mark as a right half, filling the position for most of last season. Bristol born, aged 25, Terry joined Rovers from local amateur Club Clifton St. Vincents, seven years ago.

Joe Davis (centre half). Bristolian, aged 26, and cousin of colleague Bobbie Jones. Joined Rovers in 1955, direct from a local amateur side. Normally centre-half Joe also performs creditably at wing-half and full-back.

Ray Mabbutt (left-half). Current holder of the Rovers' "Clubman of the Year" Award, Ray is popular with the fans for

his non-stop never say die displays. Graduated from inside-forward to winger and established himself as regular left-half some years ago. Born in Aylesbury Bucks. Ray joined Rovers in 1955 and is aged 28.

Harold Jarman (Outside-right). Bristolian. Joined Rovers in 1959 from Victoria Athletic, a local amateur club. Harold is also a county cricketer with Gloucestershire. Regular right-winger for the last four seasons, he really came into his own in 1963-64, scoring 17 goals, most of them in spectacular fashion.

John Brown (inside-right). A farmer's son, and born in Cornwall, John is 24 years old and can play in all the forward positions other than outside-left. Joined Plymouth Argyle in season 1960-61 as a professional, and came to Rovers in July 1963. A regular for most of last season and justified his selection by hard work and an ability to snap up half-chances.

Alfie Biggs (centre-forward). Captain of the club, Bristol born, aged 28. Joined the Rovers soon after leaving school in season 1951-52. Transferred to Preston North End in the summer of 1961, and brought back again a year later for a Club record fee. Created another Club record last season by scoring 37 goals in League and Cup.

Ian Hamilton (inside-left). Bristolian. Joined Rovers in 1956, became a full-time professional early in 1962 on completion of his apprenticeship in the aircraft industry. His father and late brother were also Rovers' professional players.

Bobby Jones (outside-left). Bristolian. Can fill and forward position, and has a great natural speed that often leaves defenders standing. Can shoot with either foot. Joined Rovers in Season 1955-56, one of several players to come from Soundwell, a local amateur club.
