Club Notes

WHILE these are early days yet for jubilation, we cannot be other than pleased that the prospect of a victory over our old friends from Port Vale tonight opens up the probability that we shall figure at the top of Division III.

Promotion, of course, is the prime aim of the club and it is best guaranteed by the acquisition of points at this early stage of the season.

That we have secured seven out of 10 five of them away from home is a matter for satisfaction all around and this was increased on Monday when a much-weakened team went to Port Vale and, by scoring the only goal, qualified for the second round of the League Cup.

For various reasons, and the injury situation figured largely in them, we fielded only three of the team that achieved such a fine victory at Oldham on Saturday, but the reserves, and seven who played against Aldershot Reserves were included, did us proud.

In fact, the performance signalled that we have the second line strength necessary to make the club an important factor in the top of the table struggle in the Third Division this season.

Tommy McKechnie, who was captain for the night on the basis of being the senior player in the team, celebrated by scoring the only goal and we now await the outcome of the draw for the second round of this competition which will be played on September 23rd.

At Oldham, it was a dour struggle in which John Reid gave us the advantage of an early lead which might easily have been built up considerably by the time 20 minutes were over. After that, there

was some heavy work, successfully accomplished by the defence until Reid relieved the tension by scoring his second goal with nine minutes left.

This was the former Northampton player's first double for us and we hope it will be followed by many more goals, though primarily, his job is that of the link-man.

We welcome Port Vale, for whom we can have some fellow feeling in that they have made an unfortunate start to the season. Unfortunately, our former outside right star, Billy Bingham, will not be in their line-up because he suffered a compound fracture of a leg at Brentford last Saturday.

It is estimated that this will keep him out for at least six months and we can only hope that this bad injury will not affect the remainder of his distinguished career in the game.

On Saturday, the first team will be at home again with Exeter City, old pre-war rivals of ours in the Southern Section of Division III, the visitors, after having won promotion from Division IV last season.

Last time we met this opposition was on January 9th, 1959, when, somewhat luckily, we knocked them out of the F.A. Cup at St. James's Park.

For the third time in eight days, we meet Port Vale on Monday, in a League match at Vale Park, and supporters can have news of how this game is going by attending the Metropolitan League match between our 'A' team and Bedford Town Reserves on this ground, kick-off 7.30 p.m.
