After struggling for a long time last season against the possibility of relegation, the outlook for the Hatters is now considerably brighter, thanks to their opening games having returned a much more encouraging ratio of points.

We do not begrudge them their good start, but we certainly hope our players will see they do not make further progress at our expense today, and when the final whistle goes we hope to see both points safely in our keeping.

At one period last season Luton were bottom of the table, a very ominous plight for a club which only a few years previously had not only been in the First Division, but had also appeared in the Cup Final.

Then Luton entered one of those lean periods which strike most clubs at some time or other. They lost their First Division membership only twelve months after Nottingham Forest had beaten them in the Cup Final, and three years later their ill-luck persisted to the extent that they dropped into the Third Division.

It would have been a tragedy had they fallen to the Fourth, but happily for them, just when the outlook seemed so grim, they staged a splendid revival. It may not have been exactly a world-shaking one, but it must have been highly encouraging to those who had worked so hard for the club during its lean spell.

Bottom at the beginning of February, with only 19 points from 30 games, the first glimmer of the silver lining was seen a week later, when the Hatters won their first away game of the season after fourteen unsuccessful attempts. And they won it in no half-hearted fashion either, for they hammered Brentford 6-2, four of their goals being scored by newcomer John O'Rourke.

The psychological boost to their morale must have been great, and though we took a bit of the shine off things when we defeated them 3-1 here a fortnight later, this was only a temporary setback. From then to the end of the season, Luton suffered only one other defeat, when visiting Hull, and their concluding sixteen matches brought them 23 points.

What the future holds for them this season is something only time will show, but if they maintain the form they have shown so far, they are not likely to be beset by the same anxieties as a year ago.


Their first three away games brought a draw at Brentford (2-2) and victories over Colchester United (1-0) and Oldham Athletic (2-0). Last Monday they played their fourth away fixture, when visiting Port Vale, and this game ended in a 0-1 defeat.

Their home record, strangely enough, has not been quite so good. Their only victory at Kenilworth Road was a 3-1 success over Colchester United in the opening home fixture, followed by a 2-0 defeat against Bristol Rovers, a draw with Port Vale (1-1), and a further home defeat when Exeter City won a tough match by the odd goal of three last Saturday. In between, the Hatters were away to Port Vale in the First Round of the League Cup, the Potteries side being beaten by the only goal.

Although manager Bill Harvey has been satisfied with his defence this season and made no change in the first six names on the Team Sheet in the opening seven League games, he has had forward alterations enforced on him by injuries to centre-forward O'Rourke, for whom Gordon Riddick has deputised on four occasions.

O'Rourke is the player whom the Hatters signed on a free transfer from Chelsea last season and who finished with the excellent record of 22 goals in 23 League appearances, a contribution which was a material factor in Luton's escape from the lower reaches of the League table.

Other regular members of the attack are David Pleat at outside-right, who was signed from Nottingham Forest at the end of August; Tom McKechnie at inside-right; former Northampton Town player, John Reid, at inside-left; and Ray Whittaker on the left wing. Whittaker was signed from Arsenal at a modest fee in March.



DAVID PACEY (Captain)

Ron Baynam (Goalkeeper). He has been with Luton since 1951. Was secured from Worcester City. He has represented England on several occasions. Played for the Football League on two occasions and also for England 'B' Team versus Yugoslavia 'B,' and was also a member of the F.A. Touring Team to South America in 1959.

Alan McBain (Full Back). Born in Aberdeen. Played for Carlisle. He attracted the Manager's attention and was transferred to Luton in exchange for J. Lornie and A. Ross.

John Bramwell (Full Back). Joined Luton in October, 1960, from Everton. Played at wing-half on several occasions last season.

David Pacey (Wing Half). Born in Luton, signed for the club in 1956. A member of the England Under-23 Team against Germany and Italy.

Gordon Fincham (Centre Half). Transferred from Leicester to Plymouth and then to Luton in 1963.

Mark Lownds (Wing Half). Signed from Durham in January, 1960. Became full-timer on completion of his apprenticeship with a local firm.

David Pleat (Outside Right). Signed from Nottingham Forest at a fee of about £8,000.

Thomas McKechnie (Inside Forward). Born in Glasgow and came to Luton direct from Rob Roy (Scotland) at the end of Season 1960-1961. Played consistently in the First Team during the past three seasons.

John O'Rourke (Centre Forward). Was previously with Arsenal and Chelsea, from whom he was transferred to Luton on a free transfer in December, 1963. He immediately made his mark at Luton and scored 22 goals in 23 League appearances.

John Reid (Inside Forward). Previously played for Bradford and Northampton, to whom Luton made a substantial transfer fee in November, 1963.

Ray Whittaker (Outside Left). A Londoner from Bow, his only other club being Arsenal. He gained England Youth International honours with John O'Rourke in 1962 and 1963, and when Luton were in need of a left wing, he was persuaded to join them in March, 1964.

MORE VIEWS FROM THE REFEREE'S ANGLE

By JACK H. CLOUGH (International and Cup Final Referee)

Language Difficulties

You will have often seen it — players rushing on with play after the referee has signalled a stoppage — or individuals who appear slow in interpreting the wishes of the official. I call it a shrewd form of gamesmanship. And it is nearly always done when the offending team are in a winning position.

It is not peculiar to any one team; most of them try it and referees are ever watching to check this misbehaviour and make a time allowance to compensate. I saw it happen in a game last week and after the match I was asked: "If it is so difficult to make English players understand the rules when speaking the same language, how are the difficulties overcome when taking International games on the Continent?"

Before I took part in these games I, also, was a little concerned and wondered how I would reconcile these foreign tongues. But I imagined obstacles that did not exist, and although I have refereed matches in most countries, covering hosts of languages, I have never found it difficult.

The laws are truly International and players know when they are guilty of misconduct. Terms common in English football have been adopted by many countries: "hands," "offside" and "penalty" being some which are frequently used. Amusing incidents, of course, often arise, and occasionally one hears a claim for "hands," when "offside" is really meant.

Quite a lot is done by gesticulation and hand and arm movements are exaggerated compared with methods adopted in the control of games in this country.

Naturally it is necessary on many occasions to check excess enthusiasm. Probably this is most marked when the Latin players are involved and certain individuals are noted for their impulsive reaction. A timely rebuke usually meets with success.

Response to discipline is commendable and the facial expression of the offending player usually conveys a mark of respect and a fear of the consequences which may follow.

Crowds are often appreciative of any intervention which tends to improve the tone of the game and frequently applaud if this is done, even though it is their own player who is involved. I have never noticed this happening in this country!

Sometimes you must speak. After finding that the offender does not speak English, you attempt by speech and gesticulation to convey your wishes.

Maybe the determination shown has some effect, but I have never met failure in making the individual understand. The result has usually been good, so that I am tempted to feel that the Lancashire dialect provides the basic principles to all languages!

I do, however, recall a game I took between Holland and Portugal, when I found it necessary to speak to a Portuguese player for a vicious tackle on an opponent. My gesticulations were pronounced — my speech was chosen carefully, with the hope that some passage would register with this player as to my intentions if he further transgressed. I must confess that I was feeling quite warm with my efforts, and as a parting remark I said: "I hope you understand?"

He turned to me and in a perfect English voice said: "I fully understand, Mr. Referee, I won't trouble you again."

It would appear, I found out later, that he had studied extensively in English and his use of the English language was probably equally as good as mine. He must have really enjoyed the "music hall" act that I was putting on, but he had the common sense not to show his appreciation at the time of the incident!

Generally, however, the respect of the English referee in the football world is extremely high. The officials like our liberal use of the advantage rule and appear baffled, but appreciative, of our economy with the use of the whistle.

It always presented a challenge which I was delighted to accept, and it pleased me to play a part in the International sphere.

Our new stocks of lapel badges, ties and car badges are available at the Supporters' Club Room and the prices are still unchanged. We hope, one day, to see every local car in the Park at Dean Court sporting the car badge. They make a jolly good present for anyone you feel has most things; a gift that is different and usually greatly appreciated.

It is good to note that the Team's "invalids" are making progress, and it proves once again that any team is only as good as its reserves. Anyone watching the Reserve games under lights will agree that we have a number of youngsters who are coming along very well. If the need arises to buy to strengthen the team, we are confident the Management will take the right steps and the Supporters' Club will pledge their financial assistance.
