### Club Notes

IN the past, Luton Town teams have had some keen tussles with tonight's League Cup opponents, Aston Villa, both in Division I and Division II and we expect no less from this meeting.

Last time, the paths of the clubs crossed in a knock-out competition was in the third round of the F.A. Cup in January, 1956, when we went out in a replay at Villa Park by 2-0 after a 2-2 draw at Kenilworth Road.

Villa still retain their First Division status and although they have not made the most promising of starts to the season, they have a crop of highly promising youngsters and the future for them looks bright.

Their most recent signing whom it is expected will be on duty tonight is John McLeod, for whom they were reputed to have paid £40,000 to Arsenal recently and there is interest in this for us in that, during our desperate bid to remain in Division I a few years ago, we went so far as to agree terms with Hibernian for this fine player, but then found ourselves unable to persuade the player to move south.

Unfortunately, the rosy picture we were able to print in these notes on the occasion of the last home match, has rather faded in the face of three consecutive defeats, two of them by the odd goal and, certainly, we did not expect to crash so heavily at Bournemouth last Saturday.

Although the margin of four goals against gives a completely erroneous idea of the way in which the game went, the plain fact is that goals that were virtually "gifts" were the means of sending the team reeling.

On the actual run of the play, there was nothing between the teams and Bournemouth officials were quick to admit afterwards that they had deserved nothing in the nature of such a sweeping victory.

While that came as some consolation, the plain fact is that points count in these highly competitive days and no team can afford to be quite so magnanimous away from home as we were on this occasion.

After tonight's match, comes another attractive fixture on Saturday when Peterborough United, now managed by Gordon Clark, who has already paid a mid-week visit to this ground, will be the visitors.

In their comparatively short career in the Football League, Peterborough have caused quite a stir and they have their sights set on a higher grade of football than Division III.

To try to bring this about, they have spent big money on such players as the Irish International centre forward, Derek Dougan, who was previously with Blackburn Rovers and Aston Villa and another former Villa player, Vic Crowe, who has earned a string of Welsh caps, who was a close season capture by "Posh" and who was elected team captain.

They include other big name players, too, and with Peterborough certain to bring a big following, this could develop into something in the nature of a local derby encounter.

Points from this match and from the one with Carlisle here tomorrow week, are urgently needed because these two games will be followed by a tremendously hard programme of four away encounters

## PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

**Sidebottom, Geoffrey** (Goalkeeper). A Yorkshireman, from Mapplewell, developed by Wolverhampton Wanderers prior to becoming professional in September, 1954 and making his League debut in November, 1958. Joined Aston Villa in February, 1961.

**Wright, Michael J.** (full back). The "Discovery of season 1963-64." Michael was born at Ellesmere and became a Probationary Professional with Aston Villa in July, 1962. Gained Representative honours over the past two seasons with the England Youth team.

**Aitken, Charles A.** (full back). Hails from Edinburgh, where he played for the Thistle before joining Aston Villa as a professional in August, 1959, made his League debut in the final fixture of 1960-61. Has earned recognition for Scotland's Under-23 team in 1961-62 and 1962-63 seasons.

**Tindall, Michael C.** (half back). Born in Birmingham, he joined the ground staff at Villa Park in April, 1956, becoming a professional two years later. Possessing eight England Youth Caps, he made his League debut in December, 1959.

**Stuurwagenhoek, John C.** (centre half). Born at Wednesfield, Staffordshire, the son of a Dutch Army Officer, John ("Tulip") signed professional for Aston Villa in February, 1961. With England Boys and Youth honours, he has also played for the Under-23 team.

**Deakin, Alan** (half back). A Birmingham boy, who has progressed through the ranks since joining the ground staff signed professional in November, 1958. Alan won his first Under-23 honour in 1961-62 and has been included in the European F.A. tour party for the past two seasons.

**Pountney, David H.** (wing half). Born at Baschurch, Shrewsbury, David joined Aston Villa in October, 1963 from

Shrewsbury Town, for whom he made over 200 appearances. A product of youth club football, he became a member of the playing staff at Gay Meadow at the age of 17, in 1957.

**Lee, Gordon F.** (full back). Aston Villa's grand utility player, having appeared in practically every position on the field, he joined the club from Hednesford to sign professional forms in October, 1955.

**Park, Robert** (inside forward). Born at Edinburgh and spotted by Aston Villa whilst playing for a County Durham works team, Bobby signed professional in July, 1963. Many of his predecessors were Scottish amateur internationals, whilst his grandfather played for Airdrie.

**Hately, Tony** (centre forward). Derby born and began his career with Notts County as a centre half in 1959, but subsequently converted to centre forward to head the Meadow Lane scorers with 27 goals in 1960-61. A boyhood ambition was realised when he signed for Aston Villa in July, 1963.

**Wylie, Ronald** (inside forward). Born in Glasgow and joined Notts County soon after leaving school, where he had won international honours. Transferred his allegiance to Aston Villa and in November, 1958, made the first of his 157 League games in claret and blue.

**Burrows, Henry** (outside left). A Lancashire lad, from near Wigan, Harry joined the ground staff at Villa Park almost straight from school. Signed professional in March, 1958. An England Under-23 international.

**Wootton, Philip** (inside forward). Born at Caerwys, Wales. Obtained B.Sc. in Physics at Bangor University. Previously played for Leyton Orient and West Ham United before joining Aston Villa in November 1962. Has 17 International caps.
