Club Notes

THERE is no record of us having met tonight's visitors, Carlisle United, on a previous occasion either in the League or the Cup, so we give them a specially warm welcome.

Relegated to Division IV at the end of the 1962-63 season, they made a rapid revival last season by finishing second, level on points with Gillingham, but with an inferior goal average and their early form which has yielded them 10 points from 10 matches suggests that they will not be in any relegation danger this campaign.

Big factor in their successful promotion bid was the opportunism of the former Leicester City centre forward, Hugh McIlmoyle, who scored 39 goals in 45 matches, a feat that caused something of a buzz among the scouts of the bigger clubs.

Yet, this season we find that of the 13 goals scored by the Cumberland club, only one has been credited to McIlmoyle whom, however, it is not anticipated will be out of the limelight for much longer and we can only hope that we will not prove to be his victims.

There is a link between this club and Carlisle in that our consistent right back, Allan McBain, used to be at Carlisle who have our former goalkeeper, Alan Ross, playing for them and earning golden opinions by the quality of his play.

In the circumstances both clubs can be satisfied with the outcome of this particular deal.

Tonight's match marks the start of what will probably prove to be the busiest period of our season. Tomorrow afternoon, the team travels to Cleethorpes in readiness for Saturday's match with Grimsby Town and, on Tuesday morning, they will be on the road again, this time making for the Lake District.

Here they will stay in Keswick for the matches at Carlisle on Wednesday and Workington on Friday before returning to Luton on Saturday.

Even then, there is only a slight relief from their travels because on Monday week, they are due at Mansfield to complete a run of four consecutive away matches.

Supporters should note that while the first team are at Carlisle our "A" team will be playing a Metropolitan League match with Cambridge City Reserves at Kenilworth Road, kick-off 7.30. Admission will be to the main stand and enclosure only and supporters will be kept informed of the progress of the match at Carlisle.

Unfortunately, another home point slipped from our grasp against Peterborough last Saturday, but we felt that we were unfortunate in that what looked to be a perfectly legitimate goal by John O'Rourke, and which would have been the winner, was disallowed.

However, O'Rourke got one that counted and his form suggested that it will not be long before he is among the goals again in his consistent manner of last season.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Allan Ross (goalkeeper). Was an under-study at Luton Town to former England goalkeeper Ron Baynham before joining United in June 1963 in a exchange deal for full-back Alan McBain. Born in Glasgow.

Hughie Neil (full-back). Joined the Club in June 1961 after spells with Falkirk, Rangers and St. Johnstone. Quickly established himself as a favourite with the Brunton Park crowd. 123 League appearances in past three seasons. Born Lugar, Ayrshire.

Terry Caldwell (full-back). Signed in July 1961 from Leeds United after previous service with Huddersfield Town. Has also played on occasions at centre half. 115 League appearances in past three seasons. Born Wakefield.

Peter McConnell (wing-half). Born Aston near Manchester. Made his mark with Leeds United for whom he made 21 first team appearances. Joined United for a substantial fee in August 1962 and has since been an almost ever present Captain of the side.

Tommy Passmoor (centre-half). Transferred from Scunthorpe United for a sizeable fee in December 1963. Born at Chester-le-Street, Co. Durham and was at one time with Sunderland. 22 League appearances last season.

Stan Harland (wing-half). One of the Club's most recent captures. The ex-Bradford City Skipper joined United for a big fee in June 1964. Started his professional career with Everton. Born Liverpool.

Barry Brayton (wing-forward). Signed professional in 1960 after 4 years as an amateur. A part-time player who has had considerable first team experience both as an inside forward and on the wing. Born Carlisle.

John Evans (inside-forward). Bargain buy from Stockport County in February 1964. Sixteen League goals in fifteen appearances for the Club. Previous service with Liverpool and Bournemouth. Born Liverpool.

Hugh McIlmoyle (centre-forward). Gained a Cup medal with Leicester City in 1961. Transferred to Rotherham in 1962 but was unable to settle in that part of the country. Was Manager Allan Ashman's first signing in March 1963. Set up a new Club Scoring record last season with 44 League and Cup goals and was also leading marksman in the Football League. Born Port Glasgow.

Eric Johnstone (inside-forward). Commencing his second season as a professional having joined United during the 1963 close season from Tow Law Town the Northern League club. Scored on his League debut. At home on either wing. Born Newcastle.
