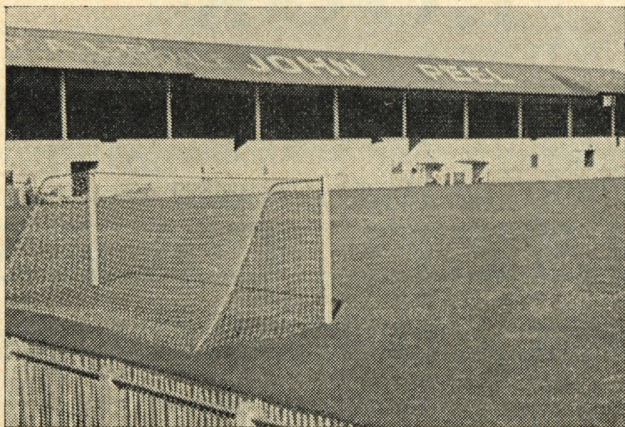

PERSONALITY PARADE

Barry Lowes, Reds' speedy outside right, played a lot of rugby during his schooldays—for the simple reason that soccer wasn't on the curriculum. But football was always Barry's first love.

"I used to like playing rugby for the school on a Saturday morning, but I much preferred a game of football in the afternoon," he told me the other day.

It was his form in local football which attracted the attention of Barrow and he eventually made his debut during the 1959 season, playing in seven first-team games that term. The following season he established a regular place for himself.

During the 1961-62 season he was transferred to Blackpool where he teamed up with Kit Napier, Alan Johnston and John Ogilvie, but his chances were limited and he was released during the close season.

He then had the choice of either returning to Holker Street or trying his luck with Workington, and he plumped for Borough Park, receiving permission to live and train in Barrow.

There is no faster winger in the League than Lowes and on his day he can be as dangerous as any forward, cutting in speedily and hitting the ball hard.

Reds fans had a lot to thank Lowes for when they won promotion last season. After a loss of form and run in the reserves, he was recalled for the last 18 games and, as the promotion battle hotted up, hit home 11 goals to clinch some valuable points.

TONIGHT'S VISITORS

LUTON TOWN were First Division members as recently as 1960 but then they plunged to Division 3 in three seasons. "The Hatters" as they are known, went down 3-1 to Notts For. in the Cup Final of 1959. At one stage last season they looked doomed to drop to Division 4 but John O'Rourke arrived from Chelsea and banged in 22 goals to pull them clear. Ten years ago Reds travelled to Kenilworth Road for a 5-0 F.A. Cup hiding. This is our first chance of revenge. Of that cup defeat only Ron Baynham remains for Luton. Reds team was Newlands, Fleming, Vittey, Stokoe, Aitken, Dunlop, Jones, Bertolini, Dailey, Whittle, Cameron. We offer a real Cumberland welcome on this their first visit to Borough Park.

PEN PICTURES

Goal.—RON BAYNHAM: Has been with Luton, his only League Club, since 1951. Has several England caps as well as two games for Football League. Played for England "B" and a member of England party for South America tour of 1959. Has played centre forward for Luton in an injury crisis.

Fullback.—ALAN MCBAIN: Born Aberdeen, was transferred from Carlisle in exchange for Lornie and Ross. Twenty-two first team games last season.

Fullback.—JOHN BRAMWELL: Ever present last season. Signed in 1960 from Everton. Also operates at wing half. A fine player and good clubman.

Wing half.—DAVID PACEY: A local boy who made good. Played for F.A. against R.A.F. and England under-23 against Germany and Italy. Has an eye for the goals. Missed only one game last season.

Centre half.—GORDON FINCHAM: A dominant pivot who has done well taking over from long international Syd Owen. Ex Leicester and Plymouth. 35 games last term.

Wing half.—MARK LOWNDS: Signed as amateur from Durham in 1960. Turned pro after finishing apprenticeship locally. A tireless worker who had 29 games last term.

Inside forward.—GORDON RIDDICK: Great things are expected of this youngster when he gains further experience. Eleven first team games last season and has already sampled first team football this term.

Centre forward.—JOHN O'ROURKE: Played for England schoolboys and youth teams, also ran for England Schools and could have had a bright future in athletics but chose soccer. Joined Arsenal from school when he had the pick of about any club. Failed to make the grade as he did when he moved to Chelsea. Signed for Luton in December, 1963, on a free and scored 22 goals in 23 games. A case of third time lucky.

Inside forward.—JOHN REID: A costly signing from Northampton in November, 1963, previously with Bradford. A grafter with boundless energy.

Wing forward.—RAY WHITTAKER: Signed from Arsenal. A Londoner from Bow. Gained England youth international honours in 1962 and 1963. Ever present after signing.
