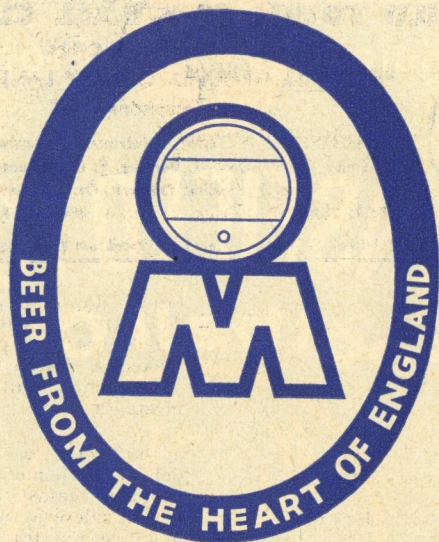

Club notes . . .

Injuries caused us to re-arrange our team somewhat for the visit to Port Vale last Monday, but even so we brought back a well deserved point from the 2-2 draw—a repeat of the previous Monday night's match at Field Mill. Mick Jones, Roy Chapman and Gerry Graham were all out of action through injury, so Bill Poynton moved to his more accustomed position at Right Back and Brian Hall came in for his first game at Left Back in the Senior side and weighed in with an excellent goal from fully 30 yards following a dash up the left flank. Ian Hall replaced Gerry Graham at Right Half and fully justified his selection with a classy display. Jim Cooper was at Centre Forward with Ken Wagstaff moving to Inside Left, a switch which worked very well. I would mention that in most of the reports on this match—including that in the local weekly paper, it seemed to have escaped the notice of reporters that Jim Cooper was wearing the No. 9 jersey and 'Waggy' No. 10. Jim was credited with our second goal which was in fact scored by Ken and quite obviously so. Unfortunately heavy rain which started shortly before kick-off and persisted throughout the game made conditions very difficult and kept the

crowd down to less than 5,000. The extensive Vale Park enclosure which has a capacity of 50,000 looked a deserted sight and was consequently quite lacking in atmosphere.

Our Reserves suffered a 3-0 defeat at home last Wednesday evening against a strong Portsmouth side who scored twice in the first five minutes, and again in the closing moments of the match. In between it was a good game of football and although 'Pompey' were the better side our lads fought well and might easily have pulled back through some good scoring chances which were allowed to go begging. Full marks to young Ian Sharp who again showed that he has the talent to make his mark in the game. Russell Rogers has now left us and signed for neighbours Sutton Town, and we hope he will do well with his new club.

These notes are of course being written before the Watford match, and without being too optimistic let's hope we can continue in the form away from home which has brought us 7 out of the last 8 points and also victory at Maine Road, Manchester, in the League Cup. In this competition we again travel to Coventry on Wednesday night and we hope we can expect to hear from 'Stags' supporters at Highfield Road to help us over the next hurdle.

PEN PICTURES

BAYNHAM Ron (Goalkeeper). Has been with Luton since 1951. Was secured from Worcester City. He has represented England on several occasions. Played for the Football League on 2 occasions and also for England 'B' Team versus Yugoslavia 'B'. Was a member of the F.A. touring team to South America in 1959.

McBAIN, Alan (Full Back). Born in Aberdeen. Played for Carlisle. He attracted the Manager's attention and was transferred to Luton in exchange for J. Lornie and A. Ross. A very sound and capable defender.

BRAMWELL, John (Full Back). Joined Luton in October 1960 from Everton, and has proved a very capable player worthy to be considered for International honours. Played at Wing-half on several occasions last season, proving equally successful.

PACEY, David (Wing Half). Born in Luton, signed for the Club in 1956. Has played for the F.C. versus the R.A.F. and was also a member of the England Under 23 team against Germany and Italy. Very strong player with a liking for getting among the goalscorers.

FINCHAM, Gordon (Centre Half). Transferred from Leicester to Plymouth, and then to Luton in 1963. Is the dominating Centre Half who has proved his value at Luton.

LOWNDS, Mark (Wing Half). Signed from Durham in January 1960. Became full-timer on completion of his Apprenticeship with a local firm. Is a wing half who likes to get on with the game. A tireless worker.

PLEAT, David (Outside Right). Recently signed from Nottingham Forest where he made frequent team appearances. A schoolboy international with Nottingham Boys.

McKECHNIE, Thomas (Inside Forward). Born Glasgow and came here direct from Rob Roy (Scotland) at the end of season 1960-61. Played consistently in the First Team in the past 3 seasons, except when injury prevented him from playing.

O'ROURKE, John (Centre Forward). Was previously with Arsenal and Chelsea from whom he was signed on a free transfer in December 1963. He immediately made his mark at Luton and scored 22 goals in 23 League appearances for us. He has also played for London School Boys and the England Youth Team.

REID, John (Inside Forward). Previously played for Bradford and Northampton to whom we made a substantial transfer fee in November, 1963. Has settled down well at Luton. He is a tireless and energetic worker.

WHITTAKER, Ray (Outside Left). A Londoner from Bow, his only other Club being the Arsenal. He gained England Youth International honours with John O'Rourke in 1962 and 1963, and when we were in need of a Left Wing he was persuaded to join us, in March 1964. He went straight into the First Team and held his place for the remainder of the season.
