Club Notes

AFTER the disappointing failure last Saturday, it becomes all the more urgent that the team should end its curious run without a victory tonight when Mansfield Town are our visitors.

Not since the first home game of the season have we sampled victory at Kenilworth Road. This has not been for any lack of effort on the part of the players, but the goals have not come and things generally have not gone right.

Against Hull it was a completely different story, with the defence which has been so reliable and solid, particularly in away matches, showing gaps that were not only completely unexpected, but were exploited to some tune by the Hull forward line.

Reaction of our manager was to make the first voluntary changes in the defence of the season, with Mark Lownds and Gordon Fincham standing down from tonight's team.

This paved the way for the return of Dave Pacey, now recovered from the attack of boils that caused him to miss four matches and gave a first chance of the season to Graham Caleb.

At the time of writing these notes, there was a doubt about the fitness of David Pleat, who bruised a thigh muscle on Saturday and a late decision was due about his ability to turn out.

If he passed a fitness test the intention is to give him a chance to settle down at inside right and Tommy McKechnie, recovered from the injury he received

at Mansfield last Monday week is to have another chance on the wing.

Mansfield are a highly useful, compact team who caused something of a surprise last Saturday when they were beaten 5-3 at home by Workington, a result that went completely against the form book.

However, Mansfield have been conceding more goals than is good for the peace of mind of their manager Tommy Cummings, former star Burnley defender, and we can only hope that our forwards will be able to make a considerable impression on this defence.

On Saturday we meet Gillingham for the first time in nearly 27 years when we make the trip into Kent and must expect a tough fight here because Gillingham are noted for their dour defence and have conceded four goals in seven home matches from which they have taken 12 points.

Next Wednesday sees the last of the mid-week matches in the League for the time being and the hectic early season period will end with a visit from Scunthorpe United, who will be followed as visitors to Kenilworth Road by Bristol City on Saturday week.

However, we are hoping to be involved in a match a fortnight today which is the pencilled in date for the visit of West Ham for the testimonial match to Bob Morton. We are awaiting confirmation from the Hammers.

In the F.A. Cup, luck has been on our side in the shape of a home pairing with Southend United over whom we completed a double last season.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Colin Treharne (goalkeeper). Had an ever-present season in goal last term. Sound performer, first turned out for the Stags while in the Army. Signed professional December 1960, on release from R.A.O.C.

Mike Jones (right back). Joined Stags from Mansfield Co-op Pathfinders. Signed professional October 1960 and made senior debut a year ago last autumn.

Will Humble (left back). Appeared in every senior game last season. Can also play on the right. Originated from Northumberland where he played for the County Youth XI and had five year's service with Ashington, before becoming a Mansfield player in May 1959.

Ian Hall (right half). Made a few appearances in the senior front line last season. A footballer-cricketer, opening batsman for Derbyshire. First played in Mansfield schoolboy football. Had three seasons with Derby County before joining Stags, September 1962.

John Gill (centre half). Came into the senior side early last season and gained a regular place on merit. Has also played left back. Transferred from Nottingham Forest, July, 1961.

Peter Morris (left half). The team's recognised penalty taker, rarely missing from the spot. Appeared in every senior game but one last season. Started on the Field Mill Ground Staff and played for the Nottinghamshire Youth XI before turning professional on 17th Birthday, November, 1960.

Geoffrey Anderson (outside right) New 19 year old right winger signed last May on free transfer from Birmingham City. Previously played for Ramsgate in Southern League.

Ken Wagstaff (inside right). Much in the news again last season for his goal-getting prowess. Easily topped the scoring list once more with 30, including one against Forest in the County Cup. Obtained 41 in the previous season, when he headed the League list. Joined the Stags from Langwith Woodland Imps four years ago.

Jimmy Cooper (centre forward). Young centre forward who moved from Blackpool last May on free transfer. Has made First Division appearances. Blackpool secured him 12 months earlier from Southport.

Ivan Hollett (inside left). Was not much called upon last season for first team duty but is a capable forward. Has occasionally led the front line. Joined Stags from Sutton Town six years ago.

Brian Hall (outside right). Had various positions last season as winger or centre forward before finishing in the reserve side as left back. Signed April 1959 from Belper Town after making a name in Central Alliance football. Later called up for army service. Became full-time professional in April 1962.
