Club Notes

THERE is no disguising the fact that our present lowly position in the League table is a deep disappointment to all concerned with the club because it was thought that better things were in store after the way in which the team collected points at the start of the season.

However, through a combination of circumstances, things have not gone right recently and injuries have had more than a little to do with that fact.

Greatest handicap, of course, has been the mishap to John O'Rourke, who after an absence through ankle trouble, came back but could not find his true form because he continued to feel the injury.

Since then he has had his leg in plaster for a fortnight. In point of fact, it was removed today and we can only hope that the period of rehabilitation before he is able to return to the team is short.

Particularly are we looking at the Cup-tie with Southend a fortnight on Saturday and are hoping that he will be available to help us overcome this hurdle.

Another upset in team plans has been Billy Hail's ankle damage. Much was expected from the former Northampton winger, but we certainly did not expect that 18 matches would be played before he could have his first outing in the team.

However, we welcome his belated appearance in the line-up tonight in the hope that he will help bring the striking power in attack which has been so sadly missing recently.

Another change is in goal where Ron Baynham is superseded by Colin Tinsley,

who has been playing well in the Reserves. Baynham has had a long unbroken run in the side, but the feeling is that he has lost some of his confidence recently and that a rest will do him no harm.

That the team should go down to their heaviest defeat of the season at Gillingham last Saturday was somewhat unexpected in view of some of the good results that have been achieved on away grounds this season.

However, we met a Gillingham team full of confidence after 39 matches on their own ground without defeat and could not contain their power play.

A blitz of four goals in 10 minutes killed our hopes completely and there was no answer to that in the shape of a comeback.

Unfortunately, Gordon Riddick had to stand down after having pulled a thigh muscle in going to collect his car from the garage.

That brought in Tommy McKechnie, who was not feeling all that fit himself having had a tooth extracted in the morning, but we are not putting that forward as an alibi for the undoubted drubbing received.

Tonight our visitors are Scunthorpe United whom we last met in our Second Division days. We welcome them and hope that this match will be the means of us ending our run of 13 without a victory.

Scunthorpe are one of the managerless clubs, having parted with Dick Duckworth, who had been in charge for some time, a few weeks ago.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Reeves, Brian (goalkeeper). In his third season at Scunthorpe, having been signed from Blackburn Rovers. A native of Lancashire, he is a goalkeeper of considerable promise.

Hemstead, Derek (full back). Born at Scunthorpe, and a product of local schools' football. Has developed through United's nursery teams, and has played well in the senior side. A well built full back.

Lindsey, Barry (wing half). A local product who has quickly made the senior grade. Was originally an inside forward but has settled down well at wing half. Came up from the apprentice ranks. Born in Scunthorpe.

Neale, Peter (centre half). Joined Scunthorpe as an inside forward or wing half in 1958 from Oldham Athletic. Was switched to centre half and quickly established himself as one of the best in the business. A native of Derbyshire.

Horsted, Barry (wing half). A native of Brigg he is one of Scunthorpe's longest serving players. Started league football at centre half, but is best known as a full back. Plays well at wing half.

Hutton, Jack (outside right). Signed last season from Hamilton, against strong opposition. Has settled down well, and gained Second Division experience. Another Scot.

Sloan, David (inside forward). Signed mid-way through last season from the Irish club Bangor City. Quickly settled to English football, and after less than 10 Second Division games gained an Ireland under 23 cap. One of Scunthorpe's most promising prospects.

Lawther, Ian (centre forward). Joined Scunthorpe at the start of last season from Blackburn Rovers, after previously being with Sunderland. An Irish International from Belfast. Has also played at inside forward and wing half.
