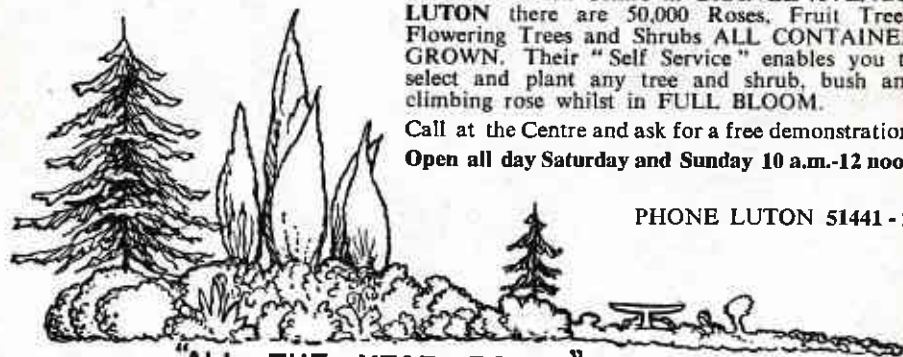

Most readily, the West Ham manager, Ron Greenwood, agreed to bring as near as is possible his Cup-winning team for a match against Luton next Wednesday evening.

Our former goalkeeper, Jim Standen, will be captain of the 'Hammers' for the occasion and the side will include the England captain and the winner of the Player of the Year award, Bobby Moore.

One absentee will be John Sissons, who is in the England under 23 team against Wales at Wrexham and Johnny Byrne may not play, but Mr. Greenwood said yesterday that the majority of the Cup-winning team will be included and he is willing to bring the F.A. Cup and put it on display.

Tickets for the stand and enclosure at normal League prices have been printed and will be available at the club's offices before and after today's match.

However, admission to all parts of the ground will be possible by payment at the turnstiles.

Kick-off is timed for 7.30 and Morton will be turning out in the Town's colours again which will bring nostalgic memories for some of the long-standing supporters. All we can do now is hope for a bumper gate so that Morton will have a worthwhile reward for the great work he did for his club and as a tribute to the sporting way in which he was willing to take over in any position.

Season ticket-holders are reminded that they may now apply for their usual seats for the Cup-tie, either personally or by post, enclosing the first round slip from their season ticket book. If postal application is made, please enclose a stamped addressed envelope together with the remittance of 7/6 per ticket.

Club Notes

THERE will be a specially warm welcome this afternoon for Bristol City because it was with this club that our manager, Bill Harvey, spent some years as trainer-coach and, as a result, the clubs are on the friendliest terms.

By the way in which the City began this season, it looked as if they might well emerge as favourites for promotion. Their forwards were scoring freely and points were coming with gratifying regularity.

Now, however, they have struck the bad patch that comes to most teams at some time or another and they have three consecutive defeats behind them, including a 7-3 drubbing at Oldham on Wednesday which was a completely unexpected occurrence.

From Bristol we hear that the City had more of the play, but it was one of those nights when practically every time Oldham broke away, the ball finished in the back of the net.

If something similar happened to us this afternoon, it would be a badly needed tonic because goals continue to be at a high premium.

Once again, we had the chances to make sure of two points against Scunthorpe on Wednesday in the first half, but apart from the fact that the finishing is not strong enough, there is the added fact that the ball is not running all that kindly in front of goal.

That be as it may, but the plain fact remains that points are being lost through the inability to make the most of the scoring opportunities that are being created and there is natural disappointment among the supporters about the

present spell that has now lasted 14 matches without victory being achieved.

As a result, the position is looking far from rosy and this comes as all the more of a disappointment because of the bright start that was made to the season.

Unfortunately, we shall not have John O'Rourke back in harness quite so quickly as we anticipated when the notes for Wednesday's programme were written.

At that time, hopes were that he would be fit for the Cup-tie with Southend United a fortnight today, but the fact that he was admitted to hospital on Wednesday for a course of injections in his ankle, has caused a re-adjustment of thought.

So far, we have no clear idea of how long his stay in hospital is likely to last and it will depend entirely on the progress he makes under the new treatment.

All we can do is to hope that it will not be long before he is able to resume training and that his recovery to complete fitness will be rapid.

To make matters worse, Gordon Riddick, the natural deputy for O'Rourke is out of action with a pulled muscle, but he is making good progress.

In the circumstances, feeling that the team had enough of the play at Scunthorpe to have won comfortably, the manager has decided against making alterations for this afternoon's match.

Next fixture on this ground is one which we hope will be a great success because it gives the opportunity to supporters to show their appreciation of the service which Bob Morton gave to the club over a period of 18 years.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Mike Gibson (goalkeeper). Born Derby, was signed in April 1963 from Shrewsbury Town, with whom he played for three seasons. Previously with Gresley Rovers and Nuneaton Borough.

Tony Ford (full back). Native of Thornbury, Glos., is only 19 years of age and has made 18 First Team appearances. Toured Israel with England Youth team May 1962.

Alec Briggs (full back). Born Sheffield. Signed professional forms 1957. Has missed only 8 First Team matches during the last three seasons.

Gordon Parr (half back). Bristol born, signed as a part-time professional in February 1957 while on engineering apprenticeship and has since signed full time. 43 First Team appearances last season.

John Connor (centre half). Born in Maryport, Cumberland. Secured from Huddersfield Town in 1960, with whom he played 8 seasons. 135 First Team appearances.

Gordon Low (wing half). Scotsman from Aberdeen, was signed from Huddersfield Town, his only previous Club, in March 1961. Has made 69 1st Team appearances.

Jantzen Derrick (outside right). Former Bristol boy who played in the successful Schools Trophy winning team 1957/58. Debut in Second Division 6 weeks prior to 17th birthday. F.A. Youth trialist. Has made 150 League and Cup appearances.

Brian Clark (inside forward). Local born captain of Bristol Boys team of 1957/58. Joined ground staff together with Jantzen Derrick on leaving school. Scored 46 goals in last two seasons.

John Atycio (centre forward). Born Dilton, Wilts. Signed for Bristol City in 1951. Capped against Brazil, Sweden Spain, Denmark and Eire. Leading goal scorer over a number of seasons, has made 324 Third Division (156 goals) and 200 Second Division (115 goals) appearances. In all has appeared in 566

League and Cup matches, scoring 323 goals.

Gerry Sharpe (inside forward). Born in Gloucester. Signed professional forms March 1964, after having been an apprentice player.

Roger Peters (outside left). Born in Cheltenham. Signed professional forms on his 17th birthday, making League debut six weeks later v. Brentford in April 1961.
