AFTER a brave battle against relegation last season producing such a high standard of football that many people tipped them to be promotion challengers this term, Luton have once more slipped back in their efforts to recapture their former glory. They have lost their last 3 away matches.

Injuries have played a large part in halting Luton's challenge this season and the loss of centre forward **John O'Rourke** has been a bitter blow.

This season he was hurt in the opening match of the season at Brentford. He has played several times since but last week was ordered to hospital because the injury had failed to heal.

For almost 14 years the position of goalkeeper has been in the safe hands of former England 'keeper **Ron Baynham** but his familiar frame has been missing recently. **Colin Tinsley**, a close season signing from Exeter, has taken over between the posts.

Alan McBain has the position of right back with another Scot, **Fred Jardine** at left back.

Local discovery **Graham Caleb** is holding down the centre half position with long-serving player **David Pacey** at right half. Pacey has won Under-23 honours for England. Former Everton player **John Bramwell** is at left half.

Left winger **Ray Whittaker** was signed last season from Arsenal and **David Pleat** was obtained from Nottingham

Forest this season. Normally a winger, **Pleat** has come into the side at inside forward to partner another close season signing, **Billy Hails** from Northampton Town.

Hails should feel at home with the club, for inside left **John Reid** is also a former "Cobbler", being signed for a substantial fee in November of last year. Scottish-born **Tom McKechnie** has taken over the centre forward role from the injured O'Rourke.

NEXT HOME MATCH

The thrills of the F.A. Cup, the most exciting football competition in the world, are with us again next Saturday — REMEMBER THE DAY — when we take on Southern League Premier Division side Bath City in the first round proper.

There is always an added attraction when the opposition comes from outside the Football League, especially where Bath are concerned. They are noted Cup fighters and last season reached the third round before going out to Bolton Wanderers in a replay.

Last season Bath finished third in the Premier Division of the Southern League under the guidance of Malcolm Allison who is now with Plymouth. Their new manager is an old friend of ours, Ivor Powell, one of the most famous players to have appeared in a Rangers' shirt.

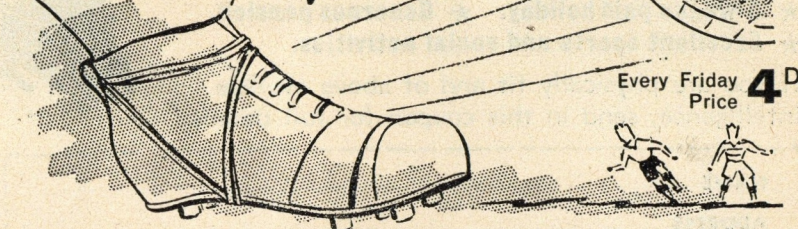
