Club Notes

TODAY, for only the second time since the war, we enter the F.A. Cup in the first round of the competition proper and have been fortunate enough to have a home match against Division III rivals Southend United.

Only those who saw last season's tussle at Bridgwater at a similar stage of the competition can realise how difficult it can be to meet a non-League club on their own ground.

This was an experience we had not had since before the war and there were some uneasy moments before we finally emerged as victors.

Ultimately, we reached the third round in which we went out to Fulham at Craven Cottage and to go that far at least must be our aim this season.

Nothing is better calculated to raise the flagging interest of supporters than a successful Cup run and it will be a very unhappy afternoon indeed for us if we do not make progress at the expense of Southend over whom we did the double last season.

Naturally enough, Southend will have similar feelings and it can be confidently predicted that this will be a sterling tussle because there is so much at stake for both clubs.

Our unfortunate record in the last 16 League games has to be balanced against the fact that Southend have taken only two points out of a possible 22 away from home this season, but it is true that Cup football often produces an entirely different brand of form.

If only our forwards can find some sort of finishing power in front of goal,

then we should be in with an excellent chance of going into the second round draw on Monday.

Should a replay be necessary, it will be at Southend on Monday evening, kick-off 7.30. Southend are bringing Stand Tickets for the replay with them and they will be on sale at the club's offices after the match, if necessary.

After the debacle against Q.P.R. at Loftus Road last Friday, there just had to be changes in our team and it is a very much altered line-up this afternoon with yet another 19 years old making his first team debut at home.

He is Billy Harber, who joined us from Swindon Town at the start of the season and who was given his first chance in the unaccustomed position of outside left at Loftus Road.

He will be attempting to solve what has been a problem position at inside right where the position has been aggravated by the fact that Tommy McKechnie has been on the injured list and, in fact, was not fit enough to be considered today.

We welcome Southend and the many supporters they are bringing with them and, particularly, will be glad to see their manager, Ted Fenton who was in charge of West Ham for so long, including the time when we used to meet the 'Hammers' regularly.

Recently, they have struck some impressive form at home, with their forwards hitting six in consecutive matches which will act as a warning to our defence which has been reconstructed again.
