

THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE

Welcome to our Visitors LUTON TOWN

Ron Baynham (goalkeeper). Has been with Luton since 1951. Was secured from Worcester City. He has represented England on several occasions. Played for the Football League on two occasions and also for England "B" team v Yugoslavia "B." Was a member of the F.A. touring team to South America in 1959.

John Bramwell (full-back). Joined Luton in October 1960 from Everton, and has proved a very capable player worthy to be considered for international honours. Played at wing-half on several occasions last season, proving equally successful.

Graham Caleb (centre-half). This youngster signed as an Apprentice Footballer for us in December 1961, although he has three "A" levels. He settled down very well and showed such promise that he was offered full professional registration in April, 1963.

Fred Jardine (full-back). Born in Edinburgh. Played for Dundee for two seasons before coming to Luton at the end of season 1960-61. Played as an outside-left last season, was successfully played as a full-back.

Alan McBain (full-back). Born in Aberdeen. Played for Carlisle. He attracted our manager's attention and was transferred to Luton in exchange for J. Lornie and A. Ross. A very sound and capable defender.

Thomas McKechnie (inside-forward). Born Glasgow and came here direct from Rob Roy (Scotland) at the end of season 1960-61. Played consistently in the first team in the past three seasons, except when injury prevented him from playing.

David Pacey (wing-half). Born in Luton, signed for the club in 1956. Has

played for the F.A. v the R.A.F. and was also a member of the England Under 23 team against Germany and Italy. Very strong player with a liking for getting among the goal scorers.

John Reid (inside-forward). Previously played for Bradford and Northampton to whom we made a substantial transfer fee in November, 1963. Has settled down well at Luton. He is a tireless and energetic worker.

Gordon Ridderick (inside-forward). Turned professional in April, 1961 following a short period of apprenticeship. Tall, with good ball control and a very good shot, much is expected of this lad as he gains more experience. Has already made several first team games.


Bob Riley (wing-half). Was born near Leicester for whom he played before coming to Luton in July, 1964. Is the aggressive type of wing-half who likes to get his attack going quickly.

Ray Whittaker (outside-left). A Londoner from Bow, his only other club being The Arsenal. He gained England Youth International honours with John O'Rourke in 1962 and 1963, and when we were in need of a left-winger he was persuaded to join us, in March 1964. He went straight into the first team and held his place for the remainder of the season.

David Pleat. Transferred from Nottingham Forest in August, 1964. Strong forward and shows much promise. Ex-England youth international.

Bruce Rioch. A Luton boy, is gaining experience and great things are expected of him. Signed as an apprentice on leaving school and as a professional on reaching his 17th birthday.
