Club Notes

WHILE, naturally, we were keenly disappointed about the adverse results in the Christmas matches with Watford, it is a fact that the best of luck did not come our way in either.

In the home game, 11,020 fans, an encouraging attendance on such a cold day, were thrilled by the way in which the team wiped out a two goals deficit with a splendid fight back.

At that stage, it looked as if we might turn the tables completely, but two more goals by Watford and the fact that shots by Dave Pacey and Gordon Riddick hit the bar, completed our disappointment and away flew two valuable points.

Unfortunately, for the return on Monday, again in bitterly cold weather which cut down the crowd drastically, we were without Ray Whittaker and Freddie Jardine, both of whom were injured in the first match. This caused wholesale changes down the left flank and paved the way for a first appearance by the former Tottenham full-back, Ken Barton, who did very well.

As are all meetings with our near rivals, this was a hard fought encounter and two snap goals by Watford tipped the scales in their favour, though we felt, at the end, that we might well have had a point.

These defeats have had the effect of increasing the anxiety about relegation, though it is felt that better results will be achieved in the heavier going.

However, it makes today's encounter with Oldham Athletic doubly important because it is absolutely vital that two points should come our way.

After an unhappy sort of start to the season during the course of which we beat them 2-0 at Boundary Park, Oldham have shown marked improvement and, recently, have been living up to their obvious potential, despite the fact that their former England inside forward, Albert Quixall, is on the injured list.

In their case, form was turned upside down at Christmas because they went to Shrewsbury and won 3-1 on Boxing Day, but were beaten on their own ground by a similar margin in the return.

Like ourselves, Oldham have sampled football in the highest circle, though not so recently as this club and we bid them a warm welcome today.

Apart from the need for points, victory in this match would boost the confidence of the team for their stiff
