Club Notes

WITH a feeling of poignancy, we recall that Sunderland were our last visitors in the Second Division and that victory for us in that match, as things turned out, would have saved us from relegation.

However, it was not to be, because the Wearside team won worthily enough by 3-0 to exact some measure of revenge for some heavy thrashings they had received on this ground in the past.

Narrowly, Sunderland missed gaining promotion that season to the First Division which they graced for so many years, but they atoned by winning the honour last April.

Since then, they have been faced with something of a struggle, mainly because results have failed to come their way on opponents' grounds.

Recently, there have been signs of an improvement in their away form but, even so, they are faced with something of an uphill struggle in order to retain their newly regained status.

Not that they will allow their anxiety about the League position to undermine their determination this afternoon because every club in the country wants the glory that the Cup can bring. We go into this tie hopefully, but with the full knowledge that this will be the biggest test of the season for our team and that they will be meeting players a cut above in class the majority of those in the Third Division.

However, the Cup is a great leveller and under trainer-coach, Charlie Watkins our boys have trained hard to meet the biggest task that has come their way for a very long time.

It was way back in 1937 when the teams last met in this competition and then the Town caused a shock by building up a two goals lead by half-time through goals by Freddie Roberts.

In the second half, there was a distinct change in the frozen hard going and Sunderland came back to earn a replay at Roker Park the following Wednesday which they won 3-1 and which, if memory serves us right, was watched by a crowd of 55,000.

Sad to relate, news arrived in this country this week, that our goalkeeper in those two matches, Bill Dolman, died in Canada just before Christmas and we offer our condolences to his family.

Incidentally, after their scare in that fourth round tie, Sunderland went on to win the Cup.

Should a replay be necessary, it will take place at Roker Park on Wednesday, kick-off 7.30, and stand tickets at 11/6 and 9/6 will be on sale at the club offices from Monday morning.

Supporters should note that the home match with Shrewsbury Town which should have been played today, has not yet been re-arranged.

In the past, it has been normal for teams engaged in Cup ties on the Saturday to play their re-arranged League match in the following mid-week.

However, with both ourselves and Shrewsbury having to face the possibility of a replay, it was felt that the position was altogether too confused for anything hard and fast to be arrived at, and it is likely that the game will be held over until the better weather later in the season.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

A. McLaughlan (goalkeeper). Scottish Under 23 International. Joined Sunderland in September 1964 after 4 seasons with Kilmarnock. Went straight into first team on day he signed. A reliable player. Age 25 years.

J. Parke (full back). Born Bangor, Northern Ireland. Played for Linfield F.C., for 8 years and Hibernian F.C. 1 year, before joining Sunderland in November 1964. Irish International. First team player.

L. Ashurst (full back). Under 23 International. This Liverpool born player with a reputation for sound determined play. Age 24 years.

M. Harvey (wing half). A clever footballer who has taken over from Danny Blanchflower for Ireland. Very strong in defence, and clever distribution. Age 22 years.

R. Rooks (centre half). Graduated from the Sunderland Junior team. A very capable deputy for Hurley. Strong and reliable. A local boy.

C. Hurley (centre half). This Eire born International has been the envy of many Clubs. Dominating in the air, very clever on the ground. Considered to be one of the world's leading centre half's. Age 26 years.

J. McNab (wing half). A product of the Youth team this young Scot, noted for his terrier-like tackling, consistently plays well. A real team man. Age 24 years.

B. Usher (outside right). A versatile clever player, and was a regular member of the Youth team until the opening of this season when his Practice Match form took him into the first team. His rapid progress has earned him an Under 23 Cap for England. Age 19 years.

H. Hood (inside forward). Born Glasgow. Played 2½ years for Clyde before joining Sunderland at the beginning of November

1964 and has been in the first team ever since.

D. Sharkey (centre forward). This young Scots centre forward currently playing in the first team. A quick lively player. Made a great reputation as a goal scorer in the Junior team. This season won his place in Scotland's Under 23 team. Age 20 years.

G. Herd (inside forward). This clever brainy Scottish International really is a treat to watch. Fast, clever, he is yet a terrific worker. Age 25 years.

J. Crossan (inside forward). Has settled in nicely to English football after 4 years Continental experience. Northern Ireland International with a very promising future in football. Age 24 years.

G. Mulhall (outside left). Played for Aberdeen for nine seasons and played for the Scottish League in 1956 after only 30 first team appearances spread over 5 seasons. Since then he has played twice for the Scottish League and gained a full Cap against Ireland last season and this. Age 26 years.
