Club Chatter

There is no point in adding anything to the criticism that has been directed at our Third Division side since their shocking display against Scunthorpe United. The players know full well that they were sadly out of touch in that game so there is nothing to be gained by prolonging the agony.

The Exeter v. Scunthorpe match is now a thing of the past and we must hope that the team will be all out to erase this memory today and see about completing our first 'double' of the season with a victory over Luton Town.

The position near the bottom of the Third Division has been more or less static for the last eight weeks. At least we are in exactly the same place as we were two months ago and the same five

clubs are below us, although those five have moved around a bit among themselves.

Colchester is the side that seems to have shown the most improvement in recent weeks among the lower clubs and their win last Saturday over fellow stragglers, Barnsley, means that they could draw level with us on points after today's games if we were to suffer another home defeat and they were to win at Brentford. However, I don't think that either of those results is likely!

Of course the team that presents the greatest danger to our present League position is right here this afternoon, for Luton Town are only one point below us.

Club Chatter—Cont.

This is Luton's 25th visit to St. James Park. The last time they were here they were a First Division side, and that was five years ago last Saturday when they beat us 2—1 in the 3rd Round of the F.A. Cup. Obviously, therefore, Luton Town is a club that has suffered a severe set-back in recent years.

Among all the present Third Division clubs, Luton Town is the one most recently numbered among the elite of the First Division for it was only at the end of that 1959-60 season, when they last paid us a visit, that they were relegated.

Another significant fact which further emphasises the tumbling that Luton has suffered these past few years is that they were Cup Finalists only six years ago and are now one of only three clubs at present in the Third Division who have previously figured in the Cup Final. The other two are Barnsley and Bristol City.

Of the Luton players who played with them in the First Division, and also appeared in the Wembley Final when they

were beaten 2—1 by Nottingham Forest, only two are still in action with the club. Those two stalwarts are goal-keeper Ron Baynham, and wing-half David Pacey.

Both of those players figured in Luton's Cup line-up on this ground five years ago. The teams then were:—Exeter City—Lobbett; Foley, MacDonald; Mitchell, Oliver, Thompson; Stiffle, Rees, Wilkinson, Micklewright, Dale. Luton Town—Baynham; Dunne, Daniel; Groves, Kelly, Pacey; Bingham, Turner, Brown, Morton, Gregory.

Just to complete this particular record the goals were all scored by Luton players. Before the interval left-back Alan Daniel put the City ahead with one into his own net, but in the second half, inside-right Gordon Turner won the game for the visitors with two goals.

Luton Town have won on this ground more often than they have lost. The tally for all first-team games so far reads Exeter won 9, Luton won 10, and 5 games drawn.

Our victory at Luton earlier this season was the first time we had won there since December 1929 when goals by Harold Houghton (2), George Purcell, and George Guyan, gave us both points with a score of 4—0.

Luton won promotion from the old Southern Section of the Third Division in 1937. In 1955 they won their way up into the First Division but they were back in the Second Division only five years later

For a year or so after that it seems that they had stopped the rot but they were on the slide again in 1961-62 and by the end of the following season they had gone right to the bottom of the Second Division in a disastrous season in which they suffered more defeats (24) than in any other previous campaign in the club's history.

Last term the Hatters seemed for a long time to be in danger of slipping right through to the Fourth Division and it was only in the last month that

they were able to pull themselves clear and finish in 18th position.

It is not surprising that Luton's team has changed considerably during these past few seasons when they have been struggling to get back on an even keel, and, as already mentioned, only Ron Baynham and David Pacey of their First Division team remains with the club.

Ronald Baynham has certainly given the Hatters wonderful service for he has been with them since November 1951 when they signed him from Worcester City, and apart from nearly 400 first-team games in his usual position between the sticks he has also played centre-forward for their League side on one occasion. That was in a Second Division game against Leyton Orient on Easter Monday, 1962.

David Pacey is a local discovery who has played for England Under-23 as well as in over 200 League games for the Town.

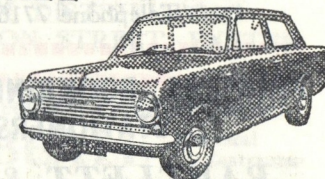

Of the other players who are likely to be in their side this afternoon, only inside-right Gordon Riddick, left-back Fred Jardine and centre-forward Tom McKechnie, had appeared for the Town before the beginning of this season.

Gordon Riddick is a local boy, while Jardine and McKechnie are both Scots and came South to join the town about the same time near the end of season 1960-61.

Despite the fact that they are still finding it difficult to get away from the lower part of the table, the Town are unlikely to include any recent new signings in their side this afternoon, for they are still pinning their hopes largely on last season's players, plus David Pleat and Bill Harber who came from Nottingham Forest and Swindon Town respectively during last summer. To these they have recently added two of their own local products, Dick Barton and Bruce Riocl.

Other Luton players who may be seen

here this afternoon include Scot, Alan McBain, who was previously with Carlisle and is now in his second season with Luton; Graham Caleb, another of their own developments; John Reid, who was previously with Bradford and Northampton Town, and cost the Town a substantial fee when he joined them in November 1963; Gordon Fincham, who is well known to local fans who are in the habit of taking in a few games down at Plymouth. He moved from Argyle to Luton in 1963; and outside-left Ray Whittaker, who is a former England Youth International and was signed from Arsenal towards the end of last season.

Luton have won three away games so far this term, for they beat Colchester United 1—0, Oldham Athletic 2—0 and, more recently, Reading 2—1.

It is interesting to note that if we can complete the 'double' over Luton today, it will be the first time that we have been able to do so since our first-ever season in professional football—
