Club Notes

WITH snow having caused the postponement of the home League match with Bournemouth, scheduled for January 23rd it is five weeks since we had a first team game at Kenilworth Road.

On the last occasion, we had the pleasure of welcoming not only Sunderland, but our biggest crowd of the season by quite a considerable margin.

Although we went out, it was only after a struggle that earned the team considerable admiration and the probability, so we hope, of better support in the future.

Unfortunately, for one reason or another, and injuries, it should be noted, have taken quite a considerable toll, things have gone far from right for us in the last three League matches, all of which have been away. From them came not a single point to boost our slender board and the result is that a tremendous responsibility is thrown upon the team during the next three or four weeks.

In that period, we have five home games out of six, including one next Wednesday, against Bournemouth, which will start at 7.30 p.m., and a trio will be completed next Saturday when Workington will be here for the first time in a League game, though they came here for a Cup-tie in 1955 and were summarily despatched by 5-0.

After that comes a visit to Hull City who have suddenly emerged as hot tips for promotion, following their heavy spending in the transfer market and, then

visits from Barnsley and Shrewsbury Town.

When that period ends, on March 10th, we shall have a very clear idea of what the immediate future holds for us and whether there is the possibility of an escape from the relegation zone on the lines of that of last season.

First steps first, though, and it is acknowledged that it is absolutely essential that two points should be collected from Grimsby Town this afternoon.

They are old opponents and friends of the Second Division days and our lads can take heart from the fact that they gained a point from Blundell Park at the beginning of October.

Opportunity, with such a vital period beginning, John O'Rourke is back in action following his long lay-off, but he received little chance at Peterborough last Saturday to show his great powers of opportunism.

Obviously, he was short of serious match practice and all we can hope is that last Saturday's outing served to remedy that deficiency and that he will be back on the goal trail quickly.

Signed to aid us in our grim fight is Jimmy Gibson, from Cambridge United, who will be making his first appearance before the home crowd today. On his debut at right-half last Saturday, he gave an impressive show once he had settled down and we have no doubt at all that he will be a decided asset to us.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Charlie Wright (goalkeeper). Signed from Workington in February 1963 and played major role in helping Grimsby escape relegation that season with some brilliant fearless goalkeeping. Formerly with Glasgow Rangers, he was born in Glasgow.

Jimmy Thompson (right back). Product of St. Mary's Boys' Club, Gateshead. Aged 21, made rapid progress through Juniors to a League place. League debut versus Sunderland March 23rd, 1963. Fast, hard-tackling player.

Graham Taylor (left back). Signed for club as an amateur in August 1961, turned professional July 1962. Made League debut against Newcastle in September 1963. Promising two-footed defender.

Ron Cockerill (right half). Tall, attacking wing half who packs a powerful shot in either foot. Signed from Huddersfield Town on August 8th, 1958 after making 40 first team appearances for the Yorkshire club. A regular with Grimsby. Also a useful League cricketer.

Brian Clifton (centre half). Joined Grimsby Town from Southampton as a wing half or inside forward in October 1962. Has had bad luck to suffer a series of injuries, but returned during last season to shine as pivot with accomplished, cool displays.

Keith Jobling (left half). Local boy who made good. Signed from local football as a wing half and made League debut against Barrow on February 13th, 1954. Has been club's regular centre half in recent years until introduction of 4-2-4 system late last season, when he switched successfully to left half spot.

Jim Pennington (outside right). Formerly with Manchester City, Grimsby signed him from Crewe Alexandra on April 5th, 1963 after he had lost place in their League side. Has held his place with his speedy, never - say - die style.

Ronnie Foster (inside forward). The Club's most expensive purchase when signed from Leyton Orient in December

1962. Made debut 4½ hours after completing transfer. Experienced ball-playing man who acts as link man in attack.

Brian Hill (outside left). Signed in July 1960 from Ollerton Colliery. Formerly played for Mansfield Boys' Club, Gateshead. League debut against Torquay in April, 1961. Introduced into League side in 1962-63, and rapidly made his name as a promising raiding winger.
