Club Notes

FIRST of all, it is imperative that we should make an appeal to the few individuals who caused the trouble during last Saturday's match with Grimsby Town to curb their tempers in future, so that this club's reputation for good behaviour which has existed unblemished over a long period of years, should not become sullied.

The incidents during which Grimsby's manager, Jimmy McGuigan received a painful blow in the back will result in a report being made to the Football League by the referee, who has no option in the matter.

Doubtless, we shall be hearing further about this and it has come at a particularly unfortunate time because the authorities have had to deal with so much trouble on and off the field this season.

With our good record behind us, we can hope with optimism for leniency, but would emphasise that further trouble of this nature could lead to the extreme punishment of the closure of the ground for a period.

We are sure that this is the last thing any of our supporters would want and hope that the hotheaded few who sparked off Saturday's trouble will think better of it in future.

That the team did not begin the series of home matches to which we are looking for our salvation from the relegation struggle, was a disappointment and served to emphasise once again that there is a very thin margin between success and partial failure.

Twice in the second half, decisive goals eluded us by no more than a foot

or so, but it is all the more true that if we are to contemplate the closing weeks of the season with equanimity, instead of being embroiled in a mad scramble for points, then mistakes must not be made when this type of chance occurs.

Tonight, we welcome Bournemouth who should have come here originally on January 23rd, but a snow covered pitch resulted in us having to call off the match.

Like us, Bournemouth have been handicapped this season by having their talented centre-forward, Denis Coughlin, out for a long period through injury, but he made a scoring come-back at Port Vale on Saturday when Bournemouth's success over our fellow-strugglers did us a good turn and served to ease the general situation.

However, our position cannot be viewed as other than dire and, barring a sensational turnabout, it has become obvious that four of the clubs at present in the last five positions in the table, are doomed to Fourth Division football next season.

Naturally, we are determined that it should not be us, but it is going to need an all-out effort from all concerned during the coming weeks to improve the situation and raise hopes that we can escape the drop for the second consecutive season.

In the Bournemouth team is John Groves, who was a member of our playing staff for so many years and who played in our Cup Final team at Wembley nearly six years ago. Of that side, only Ron Baynham, if he proves to be fit to play tonight, remains at the moment,

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

David Best (goalkeeper). David signed as a professional in July 1961. He played in all the Club's League games last year and the season before. Born at Wareham, Dorset.

Keith Brown (full back). Keith first signed as an amateur in October 1958 and was signed part time professional on 28th September, 1960, becoming full time professional on 1st July, 1964.

Richard Keith (full back). Born in Belfast. Played for Newcastle from September 1956 to February 1964 when he transferred to Bournemouth.

John Groves (wing half). Born at Langworth, Notts. John signed from Luton Town. Was with Luton for 11 years. Played in the 1958/59 Cup Final for them. Commenced his career as an inside forward and was later converted into a wing half.

Roy Gater (centre half). Born at Stoke-on-Trent. Roy first signed for Port Vale in 1959, and came to Bournemouth as a wing half in June 1962 and changed to centre half season 1962/63. He played in all the Club's League games last season.

Ronnie Bolton (wing half). Born at Golbourne. Joined Bournemouth in April 1958 from the Lancashire League side, Crompton Recs. A stylist ball player.

Ken Hodgson (outside right). Born at Newcastle, made his debut with them in season 1960/61, joined Scunthorpe United in 1961 and transferred to Bournemouth on 18th June 1964. A very versatile player.

Chris Weller (inside right). Born at Reading. Chris signed for Bournemouth in September 1960. Made his League debut during the 1960/61 season.
