

Club Notes

BECAUSE of the bad weather, our last two home matches, against Workington and Barnsley, from which we hoped to take maximum points to make our position in the League table look more healthy, were postponed.

Both have now been re-arranged for next month, with Barnsley coming here on April 7 and Workington on April 29 and, naturally, the hope is that the latter game will not be one into which we shall have to go with the absolute necessity of earning two points to keep our place in Division III.

In contemplating the hectic end to the season with eight matches to fulfil in April, we can only hope that there will be an improvement in the luck that has come our way with injuries.

From the first day of the season, the team has been dogged by casualties and it is a significant fact and perhaps indicative of our present struggling position that the youth stars, David Pleat, John O'Rourke and Ray Whittaker have not been able to play together since early October.

All have had lengthy periods on the injured list and Whittaker and Harber are still out of action which is a handicap in view of the shortage of experienced wingers.

Postponement of the last two home matches has meant that there has been no opportunity to give a welcome to George Martin since he took over as manager. George, of course, has been with the club for some years, during his second spell of service, as the back room boy who has travelled many thousands of miles in his efforts to find material to improve our fortunes.

Soon after his appointment, he made a successful entry into the transfer market, as the result of which Ted Phillips was secured from Leyton Orient and fans have their first opportunity of seeing him wear the Luton colours tonight.

Of course, he is no stranger to Kenilworth Road because he played here several times when with Ipswich Town with whom he had a remarkable scoring record.

George Martin is a great Luton enthusiast and he is determined to do his best to save from relegation the club with which he finished his distinguished playing career.

Time is not on his side, but he is not going to see the club suffer a further drop without a fight and he has called for 100 per cent effort from the players.

That he will get it, we have no doubt and we feel that if only we can get the run of the ball in something approaching the fashion of the end of last season, then the present threat can be staved off.

To our visitors tonight, Shrewsbury Town, who are paying only their second visit to this ground, we extend a warm welcome. Their manager is Arthur Rowley, of Leicester City and Fulham fame who recently decided to call a halt to his playing career and concentrate on management from now on.

Shrewsbury are one of the clubs we have not met this season and we visit them on their Gay Meadow ground on Friday, March 25th, which is the day before the Grand National and the F.A. Cup semi-finals.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Alan Boswell (goalkeeper). Alan joined the Town from Walsall, his only other professional club, in August 1963 and apart from injury was first team choice last season. Although an experienced keeper Alan is still only 21 years of age. Born at West Bromwich.

Pat Wright (full back). Pat was signed from Birmingham City in September 1962 and has been a regular member of the first team since then. The only player who was an ever present last season. A hard tackling full back who was born at Oldbury, Birmingham.

Peter Wall (full back). A local born player from nearby Westbury. Peter was an amateur and then an apprentice professional with the Club before signing full time in September 1962. Only 19 years of age Peter made 9 first team appearances last season.

Ted Hemsley (wing half). Ted joined the Club as an amateur in November 1959 signing full time professional in July 1961. Born at Stoke-on-Trent. Ted is also a good cricketer and is on the Worcestershire Staff.

Peter Dolby (centre half). Peter is a real utility player and has appeared in several positions for the first team. Born at Derby Peter signed for the Town in February 1960 from Heanor Town. A useful cricketer.

Eric Brodie (wing half). Eric was signed from Dundee United in June 1963 and has proved himself to be a very excellent acquisition. Signed as an inside forward but quickly switched to wing half where he was an immediate success. Born at Blairgowrie, Perth, Eric was previously with Forfar Athletic.

Trevor Meredith (outside right). Trevor was signed from Burnley in the close season. He spent seven seasons with the Turf Moor Club making numerous First Division appearances. Only slightly built Trevor was born at Bridgnorth, Shropshire.

Bobby Ross (centre forward). Bobby signed for the Town in June 1963. Was previously with Scottish Club, Hearts. Born at Edinburgh, Bobby had a good first season in English football and was the graft of the forward line last season. Made 39 League appearances scoring 5 League goals.

George Boardman (inside right). George signed for the Town in June 1963. Born at Glasgow, George previously played for the famous Scottish amateur club Queen's Park. Represented his country as an amateur on a number of occasions.

Brian Taylor (outside left). Brian was signed in August 1963 from Rotherham United. Brian was born at Walsall and played for his home town club before joining Birmingham City. Spent four seasons with Birmingham making many First Division appearances.
