Club Notes

FOR us the last vital run in to the end of the season begins today with the visit of Queens Park Rangers and, although this has probably been said before in comparatively recent times, it is absolutely necessary that two points are collected from this game.

Apart from our own poor results which have been bolstered up so long by the shortcomings of our rivals in distress, the scales have suddenly tipped against us.

Those who are with us in the relegation struggle have suddenly begun to pick up points which has had the effect of giving our position a most serious look.

Obviously, an immediate revival on something approaching the lines of that of the latter part of last season will be necessary if we are to escape the drop to the Fourth Division.

Including the one today, there are six home matches left, from which it is absolutely essential that full points should be collected, especially as two of them are against fellow strugglers, Barnsley and Walsall.

At the same time, it looks as if some reward will be needed from the four remaining away games, too, so there is no doubt of the difficulty of the task which faces the team.

However, hope has not been lost by any means and two points today would give a distinct fillip to our chances of survival.

Last Saturday, we left Bristol feeling that luck had been against us in that defeat came our way as the result of a disputed penalty and, more than that,

an equaliser eluded us in the last seconds by a mere matter of inches.

An inspired display by Colin Tinsley, who is proving such an effective deputy for Ron Baynham, helped keep us in the game with a chance, though it must be admitted that the forward line disappointed.

Baynham, we are happy to say, has now been discharged from hospital, but will not be in action again before the end of the season.

Our goalkeepers appear to have been in the news lately because Tony Read, the one we signed from Peterborough last week, was found on Monday to have a fractured bone in the foot after having been sent by the United for an X-ray.

That puts him out of the running for the remaining weeks of this season, but Peterborough have generously provided us with a free replacement in Morris Emmerson, formerly of Middlesbrough, who is making his debut in the Reserves at Loftus Road this afternoon.

Contrary to a report in one national newspaper, we did not ask Peterborough for our money back on Read. In fact, no cheque had been sent and Peterborough offered us Emmerson at the same time as they gave us the news about Read.

For their gesture, we are most grateful and we regard it as a most sportsmanlike action because they transferred Read to us in good faith, not dreaming that his injury was other than a minor one.

Injuries have been our chief bugbear this season and the official feeling is that the club would not be in such imminent

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Peter Springett (goalkeeper). Younger brother of the former England goalkeeper Ron Springett, Peter has been tipped to follow in his brother's shoes. Played for England Youth team last season.

Pat Brady (full back). Native of Dublin he signed for Q.P.R. in 1963 from London neighbours, Millwall. A solid unspectacular player, he was discovered playing football for Home Farm, the Dublin club which has produced many famous players including Johnny Carey, now manager of Nottingham Forest.

Brian Taylor (full back). Born in Shepherds Bush not far from the ground, joined the club as a junior player. He turned professional in March, 1962 and had made 23 first team appearances before the start of the season.

Tony Hazell (wing half). Introduced into the first team this season in September and has held a regular place ever since although he was not 17 until a week before his league debut. One of several players discovered by the club's youth policy. England youth team trialist this season.

Ray Brady (centre half). Brother of full back, Pat, and was signed as a full back from Transport F.C., the Irish club, but switched to centre half and soon commanded a first team place for Millwall. Joined Rangers in 1963 and last season gained six Eire International caps.

Mike Keen (wing half). Tall and stylish player who signed for Q.P.R. as an amateur seven years ago. Turned professional, July, 1958, and has been watched many times by First Division scouts. Has also played at inside forward.

Ian Morgan (outside right). He is an identical twin with Roger Morgan. They joined the club on the same day as apprentice professionals and became full professionals last September when Ian made his first team debut. Ian changed his hair-style so that club officials could tell him apart from his brother.

Brian Bedford (inside forward). Rated a bargain buy when secured from Bourne-

mouth in 1959-60. Set club goal scoring record with 38 first team goals in 1961-62 having equalled it the previous season. Born in South Wales, he has been the club's leading scorer for the last five seasons.

John Collins (inside forward). Regarded as one of the club's best prospects. This slightly built player from Chiswick, signed professional direct from the groundstaff.

Roger Morgan (outside left). Yet another player who has made the grade through the youth team. Also made his debut in September and, like Hazell, is still only 17. He is also a member of the England youth team squad this season. A useful cricketer.
